The object of this bill is to authorize the coinage of a standard silver dollar and to make it of legal tender value. Had provision been made to incorporate the proper complement of silver to place it on a par with the standard gold dollar, there would have been no exception taken to the measure; but the bill stipulates that these silver dollars shall contain 4121 grains only. According to the market value of silver they would be worth but from 90 to 92 cents; or in other words they are made to pass as legal tender for an amount from 8 to 10 cents in excess of their real value.
