As in all other sections of the Dominion a National War Savings Committee has been formed in this the sale of War Savings and Thrift Stamps. The personner of this cmmittee comprises some of the best known business and professional men of St. Catharines; men who have worked with untiring zeal throughout the war in all work of a patriotic nature.


Heading the committee is His Honor Judge Campbell, who is Chairman for the County of Lincoln and Ald. H. E. Rose is chairman for the City of St. Catharines. Associated with them are Mr. E. C. Graves, W. J. Neal and Mr. E. Worsley as an Industrial Committee whose duty it is to promote the sale of the stamps in the different factories. Mr. Arthur Robinson and Mr. Geo. H. Sherwood are a committee securing the co-operation of the merchants in offering the stamps for sale in the several stores of the city.

Another campaign is being carried on in the Schools. The Public and Separate Boards and the Collegiate Institute Board having unanimously endorsed the campaign and are arranging to keep the stamps on sale in the different schools and the teachers will urge the practice of Thrift among the scholars by the sale of War Savings and Thrift Stamps, and it is quite possible that the Public School Board will substitute this method of saving instead of the present Savings Banq system now in operation throughout the diffeernt schools. 
ENJOYER TORONTO BANQUET'




