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THE TAX SALE BY-LAW. Important Judgment Given by Mr. Justice Drake Upon the Subject of Sale for Taxes.

Some question having arisen as to the validity of the sales made of property in the city for arrears of taxes under the tax sale by-law, 1896, an ex-parte application was made by Mr. C. Dubois on behalf of the city to the Supreme court.

The following judgment of the Hon. Justice Drake will be read with interest: By the Municipal Clauses Act the municipality can pass a by-law for sale at public auction of land and improvements for unpaid taxes, provided the taxes shall be in arrears for two years.
