Sudbury, July 9.—The Emmens Metal company have decided to erect extensive Company have decided to erect extensive smelting works near Sudbury. They endeavored to arrange for a supply of nickel matte for use in their large refinery in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, but found the output of all the existing mines contracted for. Consequently, Dr. Stephen Emmens, one of the most eminent metallurgists of the United States, made an exhaustive examination of the nickel deposits of Algoma. He was refused admission to the working mines, who guard their profitable secrets with jealous care. After a careful investigation the company secured control of two locations containing extensive deposits of nickel conveniently situated. They have made arrangements to mine and smelt their own ore and the product in the form of nickel matte will be shipped to the Pennsylvania works of the company to be manufactured into the various forms of nickel alloys.

The demand for nickel is now so great that although over 1200 men are now employed in the existing mines no nickel matte can be purchased here.




