ARCHBOLD ARRESTS KELLY.

While driving with his family to church. The Municipality Inspector Compels the Citizen to Accompany Him to the Police Station. Where the Deputy Chief Orders Kelly's Release—Wags on the Green Fronted.

Citizen William Kelly will this morning instruct his solicitors to enter an action for \$10,000 damages against Inspector Archibold and the Corporation of Toronto for wrongful and malicious arrest.

Yesterday Citizen Kelly hitched a couple of horses to his bus, and with his wife, daughter, and son, proceeded to the station. He was stopped by a policeman and taken to the station.

Several policemen met and stopped him before he reached Yonge-street in Queen's Park. He was taken to the station.

When we got to Yonge-street corner there were six policemen and a sergeant in view. They stopped the bus and the driver.

"I will have to arrest you and take you to the station," I said. "Remem-ber what you are doing."

"The sergeant brought the bus to a stand and Archibold ordered the sergeant and police to arrest myself and family take us all to the station."

"I don't know anything about it. I can't give you any information at all."

Inspector Stephen Non-Committal. "What has been done about Sunday buses?" was asked.

NO BREACH OF THE LORD'S DAY ACT. But, as Citizen Kelly had no license, the Magistrate Fined Him \$25 and costs.

William Kelly was Saturday fined \$25 by Deputy Magistrate Kingsford for breach of the cab bylaw in driving for hire without a license.

The court room was well filled with a crowd of curious on-lookers who were watching the proceedings.

Next the bylaw prohibits from driving "for hire." It is contended that "hire" means a definite ascertained amount, not an indefinite payment.

MAY SIT UNTIL CHRISTMAS.

TO CARRY THROUGH HARCOURT'S NEW PROGRAM. Opposition to the Evicted Tenants' Bill—Closed on the Measure Refused by the Speaker—Harcourt's Reply at the Front—The House of Lords and the Budget.

LONDON, July 21.—The debate on the Evicted Tenants' bill in the House of Commons on Friday night would have been clouded but for the intervention of the Speaker, who has rarely so exercised his prerogative.

REV. MR. HUNT WAS ANNOYED. Because He Couldn't Get a Sunday Car to Take Him to Church.

Rev. Emory Hunt, pastor of the First-avenue Baptist Church, Cleveland, walked to the general clerk at the House yesterday morning and asked where he could get a car to go to the Walmer-road Baptist Church, and when told that there were no cars Dr. Hunt seemed mightily put out, and endeavored to get a car to take him to church in a hired carriage.

SUNDAY CARS BENEFICIAL. "Sunday cars are detrimental in one way—that they tend to the building up of the large popular churches and interfere with the development of the smaller ones."

LONGED FOR HIS HOVEL. A. D. Eldridge of Franklin, Ohio, H. H. Finn of Detroit and Col. Baines of Philadelphia did not favor the car, but if they were to have their own they would like to have it.

DR. MACARTHUR ON SUNDAY CARS. Dr. Robert S. MacArthur, pastor of Calvary Church, New York, and one of the foremost Baptist clergymen on this continent, expressed his opinion at the Baptist convention respecting Sunday cars, said:

"Well, I make it a rule never to cross a bridge before I come to it. In American cities we are building up a Sunday car mania. It is a mania, and it is a mania that is spreading like wildfire."

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POSSIBLY NO TARIFF BILL.

SENATE MAY RETURN TO AGREE TO FURTHER CONFERENCE. "We Have Nothing to Compromise," Said One of the Senators—Sensational Disclosure as to the Sugar Investigation—Cleveland Determined to Expunge These Impeachment Proceedings.

WASHINGTON, July 22.—All interest in Congress the coming week centres about the Senate, where the fate of the Tariff bill may be decided by the vote to be taken on the conference report, which is now before that body for action.

THE SESSION ENDED. The Franchise bill, now being stripped by the Government of the important amendments proposed at the beginning of the session and which now simply provides for the revision of the bill, was passed by the House on Saturday night.

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On Sunday, June 24, William Arthur Parsons, aged 30, formerly clerk for Eby, Blair & Co., son of Samuel Parsons, traveling auditor of the G.T.R., 30 Earle-street, and Frank R. Skelles, aged 19, clerk for Davidson & Hay, and son of Richard W. Skelles, 51 Florence-street, driver for Robertson Bros., were drowned while bathing in the lake about a mile north of Toronto.

Yesterday the bodies were recovered by Mr. Charles Nurse of the Humber, having been in the water exactly four weeks. Ever since the accident occurred Mr. Nurse has been on the lookout for the bodies of the two young men in the vicinity of Mimico Point, where a current flows in from the Bay and where it was expected the bodies would finally turn up.

The bodies were recovered about 12 o'clock this morning and were recognized by the father of the young man by the clothes he had on and a handkerchief which was in his pocket.

The bodies were recovered about a mile apart. Dr. Cotton was notified, but declined to remove the bodies because the funeral will take place at 10.30 o'clock to-day at Humboldt's Cemetery.

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TURNED UP AFTER 29 YEARS.

ALLEGED HEIR TO THE DUKES OF SOMERSET'S ESTATE LAYS CLAIM TO THE PROPERTY. New York, July 22.—A London dispatch to the Sun says: The villagers of Maidenhead, Bath, have been excited this week over the appearance there of a person who claims to be the heir of the Duke of Somerset and demands restoration of the title and estates.

THE CLAIMANT DESCRIBES HIMSELF AS LORD ST. MAIR, who was supposed to have been dead for 29 years. He was accidentally drowned by a boat while shooting in India and died soon after.

THE CLAIMANT ADMITS THE ENCOUNTER WITH THE boat, but says he escaped from his claws and got away with some scratches, which he will exhibit when the time comes.

A LONDON EMPLOYEE JAILED. Arrested in Hamilton for Misappropriating \$2500.

HAMILTON, July 22.—On Saturday Inspector O'Leary of the Dominion Police Department and Detective Campbell of the Hamilton police force arrested a man named Henry Freeman Jaynes. The charge against him is for embezzling \$2500 from the Hamilton Police Force.

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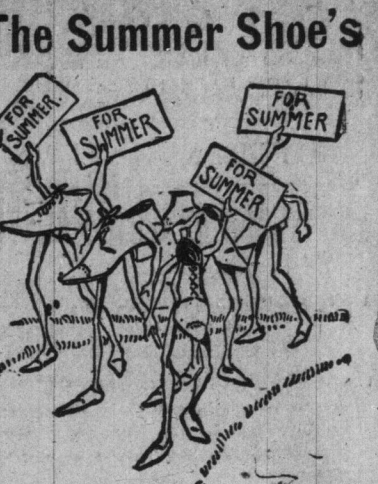
