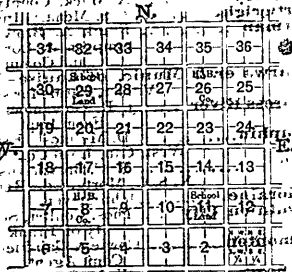

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

All unappropriated or unreserved even-numbered sections of Dominion Lands excepting 8 and 26 may be homesteaded by any person sole head of a family, or any male over 18 to the extent of one quarter-section of 160 acres.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district (see list of land offices), or on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, or the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, authority can be had for some one to make the entry for him. \$10 fee for an ordinary homestead entry; but for lands which have been occupied an additional fee of \$5 or \$10 is chargeable to meet cancellation or Insp'r's Expenses.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

Three years reasonable cultivation and residence is required, during which the settler may not be absent more than six months in any one year without forfeiting the entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

may be had at the end of the three years, before the local agent or the homestead inspector, if the latter \$5 fee is charged. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands, Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION

Immigrants can receive at any Dominion Lands Office information as to the lands open for entry and free of expense, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit, and full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, and copies of regulations, or on application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, or to the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg.

EXEMPTIONS FROM DUTY.

Wearing apparel, household furniture, professional books, implements and tools of trade or employment, which the settler has had in actual use at least six months before, musical instruments, domestic sewing machines, live stock, carts and other vehicles and agricultural implements in use by the settler for at least one year before. (Not to include machinery, or articles imported for use in manufacturing establishments, or for sale.) Goods must accompany the settlers, and not be disposed of within two years. Settlers may bring in 1 horse or cattle for each 10 acres to be taken up, and 1 sheep or swine for each 1 acre, or a proportion of each, not exceeding 16 horses or cattle and 160 sheep or swine per 1/4 sec. and limited in all to 320 acres. Duty on all excess cattle, sheep and horses, 20 per cent ad valorem; 1/2 cent per lb on hogs.

CATTLE QUARANTINE

Horses, cattle, sheep and swine admitted without quarantine detention.

All communications regarding North West and British Columbia lands should be addressed to.

DOMINION LANDS.

Coal Lands if Surveyed, can be purchased by one individual up to 320 acres, price \$10 per acre for soft coal, \$20 per acre for anthracite. No royalty, nor compulsion to work.

RIGHT TO EXPLORE FOR COAL.

On staking out, boundaries N. and S., E. and W. lines, marking on each post the name of individual staking same and date, then apply to Minister of Interior, who for a fee of \$10 will grant right to explore for 60 days, on expenditure of at least \$2 per day. At expiration of 60 days a further extension may be obtained.

QUARTZ CLAIMS

Persons of 18 years and over, and joint stock companies holding a free miner's certificate, may obtain entry for a mining location.

A Free Miner's Certificate (non-transferable) is granted for one year. The fee for an individual is \$10, and to a joint stock company \$50 to \$100, according to capital.

The holder of a Free Miner's Certificate who has discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1500 ft x 1500 ft, by marking it with two legal posts, one at each end, on the line of the lode or vein, and marking out the line between. Upon each post shall be marked the name of the claim, the person locating and date, and the number of feet lying to the right and left of line.

The claim shall be recorded with the Mining Recorder of the District within 15 days, if located within 10 miles of the office; one additional day allowed for every additional 10 miles or fraction. If a claim is more than 100 miles from a Recorder's Office and situated where other claims are being located, 5 free Miners may appoint a Free Miner's Recorder; but if the latter fails within 3 months to notify the nearest Government Mining Recorder of his appointment, the claims will not hold good. Fee for recording a claim is \$5.

At least \$100 per year must be expended on the claim, or paid to the Mining Recorder in lieu. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may upon having a survey made and upon complying with certain other requirements, purchase the land at \$5 per acre cash, but if the surface rights have already been disposed of at \$2 an acre.

A location for mining iron and mica not exceeding 160 acres may be granted, but if therein other valuable mineral is discovered the miners right to be limited to the area prescribed for other minerals, the remainder reverting to the Crown. The Minister of Interior may also grant 160 acres for copper mining.

The patent for a mining location reserves forever whatever royalty may hereafter be imposed on the sales, such royalty shall be collected on sales made prior to issue of patent.

PLACER MINING, MAN. & N.W.T. except Yukon district

Placer Claims generally are 100 feet square, entry fee \$5 renewable yearly. On the North Saskatchewan River claims are either Bar or Bench, the former being 100 feet long and extending from high to low water mark. The latter includes bar diggings, but extends back from high water mark to the base of the hill or bank, but not exceeding 1,000 feet. Where steam power is used, claims 200 feet wide may be obtained.

LEASES TO DREDGE FOR MINERALS IN RIVERS IN MAN. AND N.W.T. (Excepting Yukon Dist.)

A Free Miner can only obtain two leases of five miles each for a term of 20 years, renewable in the discretion of the Minister of Interior.

WAGHORN'S GUIDE.

The lessee's right is confined to the submerged beds or bars of the river below low water mark, and subject to the rights of all persons who have or may receive entries for bar diggings or bench claims.

The lessee shall have dredge in operation within one year from the date of the lease for each 5 miles. Rental \$50 per annum for each dredge used. The Crown requires a royalty of 2½ per cent. on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.

The lessee not to interfere with navigation of the river or with roads, ways, bridges, drains and other public works and improvements now existing or to be made.

LEASES TO DREDGE FOR MINERALS IN THE BEDS OF RIVERS IN THE DISTRICT OF YUKON.

A Free Miner may obtain a lease of an unbroken extent of 5 miles of a river limited to 6 leases in favor of an individual or Company. Yearly rental \$100 each mile.

Term of lease 20 years renewable in the discretion of the Minister of the Interior. The lessee's right of mining and dredging confined to the submerged bed, or bars in the river below low water mark, as fixed on the 1st day of August in the year of the date of lease. Royalty 10 per cent on output over \$15,000 for each five miles.

Lease subjects to Placer Mining entries, existing or to be made.

PLACER MINING YUKON DISTRICT.

Claims are Creek, Gulch, River and Hill claims. 250 feet in length in the general direction of the Creek or River, and from 100 to 2,000 feet wide according to ground.

Claims are marked by two legal posts, one at each end. Entry must be obtained within ten days if within ten miles of Mining Recorder's office. One extra day allowed for every additional 10 or fraction. If the claim exceeds 100 miles from a Recorder's Office, the same rule applies as in the Quartz Mining.

The person, or company must hold a Free Miner's Certificate.

Every alternate 10 claims is reserved to the Crown.

The discoverer of a claim is entitled to 500 feet in length. If the party consists of two 1000 ft. the rest ordinary claims only.

Entry fee \$15. A royalty of 10 per cent. on the gross output of the gold mined. The sum of \$2500 will be deducted from the gross annual output of the claim. The holder of a Creek, Gulch or River claim may within 60 days after staking, obtain entry for a hill claim adjoining it for the sum of \$100. This permission is also given to the holder of a Creek, Gulch or River claim who prior to January, 1908, obtained an entry therefor, provided the hill claim is available when an application is made. No miner shall receive a grant of more than one mining claim in a mining district, the boundaries of which shall be defined by the Mining Recorder, but the same Miner may also hold a hill claim and any number of claims by purchase, and Miners may unite to work their claims in common.

A claim shall be deemed to be abandoned when the same shall have remained unworked for three consecutive working days of 24 hours each, unless sickness, or other reasonable cause be shown to the satisfaction of the Mining Recorder.

It shall not only be necessary for a person or company working a quartz or placer claim to hold a Free Miner's Certificate, but every person in his, or its employment shall have a Free Miner's Certificate unexpired.

BRITISH COLUMBIA MINING LAWS

OF THE OTHER THAN COAL MINES

Every person or Joint Stock Co. engaged in mining must take a free miner's certificate, which may be obtained from any mining recorder. Each company must pay yearly for a miner's certificate, expiring 30th June, yearly, \$50 when capital is under \$100,000 and \$100 over \$100,000, and all existing companies must secure a new licence according to this schedule of charges, by June 30th, 1897. Every free miner can take up one claim, and the parties who may become free miners are every person over 18 years of age, who is a British subject and every joint stock company duly incorporated and in receipt of authority from Lieut. Gov. in Council, to become entitled to full rights and privileges of a free miner on taking out a free miners certificate and paying the license fees as above. If the certificate is allowed to expire all interest in mineral claims are forfeited, but no forfeiture after issue of Crown Grant. Full size of claims 1500 feet square, in a rectangular form. Claims are marked by two legal posts, placed as near as possible on the line of the vein and numbered 1 and 2. Name of mineral claim, name of locator and date of location must be written on No. 1 post, and on No. 2 post the words "Initial Post" with statement of direction of No. 2 post, and number of feet lying to right and left of line between the two posts. Every claim must be recorded with the Mining Recorder of the district (see list of Recorders, in Guide) within 15 day after location, or if claim is more than 10 miles from the office an additional day is allowed for each 10 miles.

Free miners must not hold claims in trust for persons not British subjects.

Free miners hold their claims for one year, and thence from year to year without re-recording, except Joint Stock Co's, who require to take out license ea 30 June yearly, provided that during ea year work to the value \$100 must be done and a certificate of work recorded, or in lieu thereof \$100 may be paid, otherwise the claim is deemed vacant and abandoned. No free miner can hold more than one claim on the same vein or lode, except by purchase. Transfers of mineral claims must be in writing, and must be recorded within the time allowed for record of mineral claims. Certificate of improvements is issued when \$500 worth of work has been done, claim has been surveyed and other formalities complied with, and afterwards a Crown Grant is issued. Cost of survey up to \$100 to be counted as work if survey is made within one year of date of location. If land is within the railway belt \$5 an acre must be paid.

MILLSITES not exceeding 5 acres in extent may be located on unoccupied and unreserved Crown lands, not known to contain mineral, and water rights for mining or milling purposes may be recorded after certain formalities by applicant, as to notice, &c.

PLACER CLAIMS vary in size, being generally about 100 feet square, but the discoverer of a new mine is allowed a claim of 300 feet in length, and a party of four discoverers 1000 feet. Record must be within 3 days from location, if within 10 miles from the record office, with an additional day for every additional 10 miles. Record may be for one or more years, and claims may be re-recorded before expiration of term. Leases of limited areas of placer mining ground for a period of not exceeding 20 years may be obtained. As many as 10 leases may be consolidated.

Any location made upon a Sunday or public holiday is valid.

WAGHORN'S GUIDE.

MINING LAWS OF ONTARIO.

Any person may explore Crown Lands for minerals. Mining lands may be taken up as surveyed locations or staked claims.

Locations range from 40 to 320 acres.

Claims may be 20 chains square (40 acres) or 15 chains square (22½ acres) staked out on a vein or lode.

Claims must be worked continuously five months of one man's time, or its equivalent of two or more men's time in each calendar year.

Patent or lease may issue for a claim when working conditions have been complied with—15 months of one man's time on the larger sized claim and 10 months on the smaller, or the equivalent in each case if two or more men are employed.

Locations may be acquired in fee or under leasehold.

Price of locations north of French River, \$2 to \$3 per acre, and south of it, \$1.50 to \$2, according to distance from railway.

Rent of locations, first year 60c. to \$1 per acre, and subsequent years 15c. to 25c. per acre.

License to stake out and work mining claim \$10 each year.

Royalty on ores specified in the Act, 3 per cent. of value at pit's mouth, less cost of labor and explosives.

Royalty not charged until seven years from date of patent or lease.

Original discoverer of ore or mineral on crown land not less than ten miles from nearest mine or deposit of ore or mineral is entitled to a free grant of forty acres.

Crown lands sold under provisions of mining laws in force prior to 4th May, 1891, exempt from royalty.

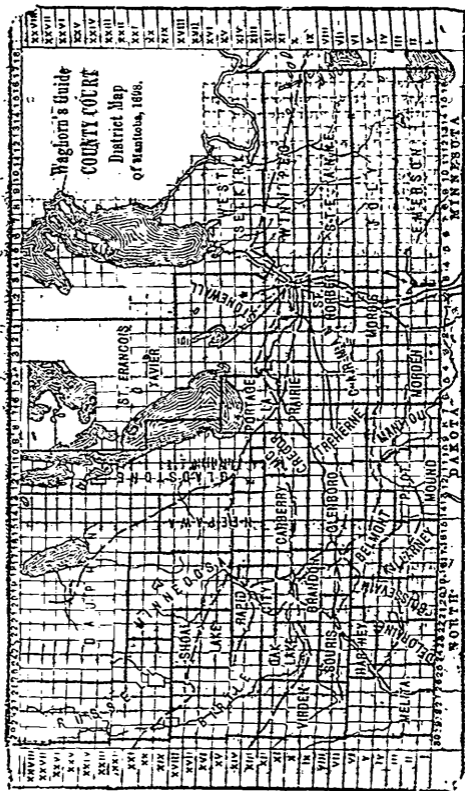

TARIFF FOR CABS. —As revised 25th May 1897.

Alex. Polson, License Inspector, City Hall; hours 10 to 12.

For conveying one or two passengers from one place to another within the limits of the First Division, with right to return to place of starting within ten minutes—one horse 25c; three or four passengers, 50c. Two horse 50c; every additional passenger 25 cents. Half fare allowed on return if detention exceeds ten minutes; and full fare if detention exceeds 25 mins.

For conveying one or two passengers to or from any place in Second Division to or from any place in First Division—one horse 50 cts; two horse 75 cts. Every additional passenger 25 cts. The same allowance for return passengers as in First Division.

The above are to be considered as the day rates, that is, from 6 a.m. till 10 pm. After 10 pm. double rates are allowed till 6 am.

ON TIME.—For every hour completed in conveying one or more passengers, one horse 75c; 2 horse \$1.00. Fractional parts of an hour at same rate. This rate prevails from 6 am. till 10 pm.

From 10 pm. till 6 am., \$1.50 for 1 horse, \$2 for 2 horse per hour.

If a passenger wishes to travel from one place to another in second division and finds a cab not under engagement in the division, he can employ it at same rates as apply to first division.

One or two children under 7 free, for each additional child half-fare; children over 7 years and under 12, years half fare; over 12, full fare.

One trunk and hand baggage for each passenger, allowed free.

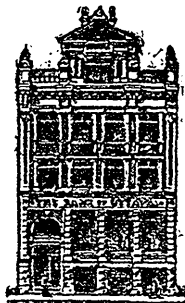

CLOSE SEASON FOR GAME.—Manitoba.

Game Guardian—W. M. Ingram, Winnipeg.

None of the animals or birds hereinafter mentioned shall be shot at, hunted, trapped, taken or killed on any Sunday, nor in any year within the periods hereinafter limited, nor shall any of the said animals or birds be carried, in whole or in part, by any common carrier during the said periods.

(a) All kinds of deer including cabri and antelope, elk or wapiti, moose, reindeer or cariboo, or the fawns of such animals, between the 15th December and the 15th October next following, and the animals mentioned are not to be taken, hunted or killed at any time for sale or barter. Limit, two deer each person any one season. This does not apply to deer the private property of any person and are taken or killed by him or with his consent, on his own premises.

(b) All varieties of grouse, including prairie chickens, pheasants and partridges, between 15th Nov'r and 1st day of October next following, and none of the birds mentioned shall be exposed or offered for sale or sold, and no person shall kill more than 100 in one season nor more than 20 in one day. (c) Woodcock, plover (except the upland plover and the golden plover), snipe and sandpipers, between 1st of Jan and 1st Aug. (d) Upland plover between 1st Jan and 15th July. (e) Any kind of wild duck, sea duck, widgeon, teal, between 1st of May and 1st Sept. (f) Otter, fisher or pekan, and sable, between 15th May and 1st Oct. Muskrat between 1st of May and 1st Dec. (g) Marten between 15th April and 1st November. (h) Beaver shall not be shot at, hunted, trapped, taken or killed.

None of the said animals or birds (except the animals in sections f and g) shall be trapped or taken by means of traps, nets, snares, gins, baited lines or other similar contrivances, nor shall such be set.

Batteries, swivel guns, sunken pauts, night lights, or spring guns, shall not be used or be in the possession of any person, at any time, to kill or destroy any animal mentioned. Animals may be kept for domestication. A permit is required for same from Minister of Agriculture.

Skins of deer, for mounting or stuffing may be held by taxidermists if not taken during close season, or if imported must be accompanied by a declaration of owner showing that imported for said purpose and not taken during close season of place from whence imported.

No poison or poisonous substance shall be used or exposed to kill or take any animal or bird protected by this Act.

No person shall have in his possession any of the said animals or birds, or parts thereof, no matter where procured, with the exception of the skin of animals that have not been killed during the close season, during the period in which the same is protected. Animals may be kept for domestication if a permit is secured from the Minister of Agriculture and Immigration for same. Birds killed during open season may be kept for food for fifteen days only after close of season.

The eggs of any of the said birds shall not be taken, destroyed, or had in possession at any time, nor the nests disturbed.

No person either on his own behalf or as agent for others, shall purchase, barter or trade for any skin or pelt of any fur-bearing animal above mentioned which has been killed during close season.

The export of the said birds and animals out of the Province is prohibited—except only by special permit two live animals or birds for purposes of domestication.

A license fee of \$50 is required by all persons not domiciled in Manitoba to hunt and shoot in the Province, to be had of the Minister of Agriculture, Winnipeg, good for the year. Permission from owner, agent or occupier of land or of enclosed ground is required. Trained or sporting dogs shall not be allowed to run at large unaccompanied. Offences against the Act shall be punished by summary conviction on information or complaint before a J.P. or Magistrate.

NORTHWEST TERRITORY.

(a) No Elk, Moose, Cariboo, Antelope, Deer or their fawn, Mountain Sheep or Goat, shall be hunted, taken or killed between the first February and the first October; provided always that no person shall be allowed to kill or take more than six head of the aforesaid animals in any one season, except for the purpose of food for himself or his family.

South of the line between Tps 22 and 23 and east of a line between Rgs. 25 and 24 west of the 2nd mer., none of the above named animals can be hunted, taken or killed until October 1, 1901, but the fawn of any of the said animals may be taken alive and domesticated.

After the first day of October, 1898, the sale or exposure for sale, barter or trade, and the purchase or obtaining by barter or trade, or in any other manner of any mountain sheep or goat or any part thereof is prohibited.

(b) No person shall fire at, hunt, take or kill, in any year, any Buffalo; any Grouse, Partridge, Pheasant or Prairie Chicken, between the 15th Dec. and the 15th Sep; and not more than 20 birds any one day, any kind of Wild Duck, Snipe and Sandpiper, between the 1st Jan. and the 23rd Aug.

No person shall at any time disturb, injure, gather or take the eggs of any species of wild fowl or birds mentioned in this Ordinance.

None of the contrivances for the taking or killing of the wild fowl, known as Swans, Geese or Ducks, which are described as swivel guns, batteries, sunken punts or night lights, shall be used at any time, nor shall any person use grain seed or other description of food steeped in opium, alcohol or other narcotics, for the purpose of stupefying and capturing any species of wild fowl, except Geese.

(c) No person shall hunt, trap or kill in any year, any Mink, Fisher or Marten between the fifteenth April and the first November; any Otter or Beaver between the fifteenth May and the first October; any Muskrat between the 15th May and 1st November. Killing of beaver in Eastern Assinibola is prohibited till 1st Nov 1901

No bird named in the foregoing Sections, except Geese, shall be taken or killed at any time by means of any rope, snare, spring, cage, net or trap, nor shall such be set for. And no engine shall be at any time for such purpose, placed, constructed, erected or set, either wholly or in part; and any person finding any rope, snare, spring, cage, net or trap, or engine so placed, constructed or set, may take possession of or destroy the same without such person thereby incurring any liabilities therefor.

Permission can be granted by the Government to procure birds and eggs for scientific purposes during Close Season.

Person in actual want may kill birds, or animals for immediate necessities.

WAGHORN'S GUIDE.

No person shall at any time offer for sale, barter or exchange, any Prairie Chicken that has been, caught or, killed by any person other than himself.

Non-residents of the N. W. T. require a license from the Commissioner of Agriculture at Regina (fee \$15) to hunt or shoot. Licenses cover period from Aug. 1 to Dec. 31 annually, but do not give right to hunt or shoot until the expiration of two weeks after protected animals or birds may lawfully be hunted or killed by residents of the Territories.

The possession of any dead animals, or birds, or parts (except skins lawfully taken), is prohibited during Close Season. But any animal or bird lawfully taken at other times can be bought or sold.

Game guardians can seize birds or animals illegally in possession and bring offenders before a Justice of the Peace within 3 months of offense. Fine—Buffalo \$100; other game \$50 or 2 months.

The export or carrying out of the N. W. T. of Grouse, Partridge, Pheasant, Prairie Chicken, Elk, Moose, Cariboo, Antelope, or their Fawn, is prohibited.

Commercial licenses granted in northern parts of Lake Winnipeg only, 20,000 yards of 5 in. gill net only allowed each person or firm. Close season for such 1st of Sept. to 1st May. Person or firm must be British subjects and bona fide owners of plant.

Domestic licenses—settlers, residents, half breed Indians, 500 yard gill net in all lakes of Manitoba, for whitefish mesh 5 in. extensive measure, for pike, pickerel, etc., 4 in. ex measure.

Close season—For Whitefish, 5th Oct. to 1st Dec. on all lakes in Manitoba.

Lake Winnipegosis—Winter fishing licenses from January 1st to March 31st. 300 yards of net to each license. Number restricted to 100.

Pike, Pickerel (or Doro) Maskinonge Mullet and other spring spawning species, except Sturgeon 15th April to 15th May. Sturgeon, May 15 to June 15. Sturgeon licenses 300 yds. 11 in. extn. measure.

Fishing without license prohibited. Nets not to be used within 1/2 mile of mouth or outlet of any river. Bag nets, trap nets, or fish-pound illegal. Lime, chemicals, oil, sawdust, or any deleterious substances prohibited in waters. The use of explosives, spears, fire arms, &c., illegal. Special licenses to Indians for food fishing.

Nets must be raised and all fishing stopped between 6 p.m. on Saturdays and 6 a.m. on Mondays.

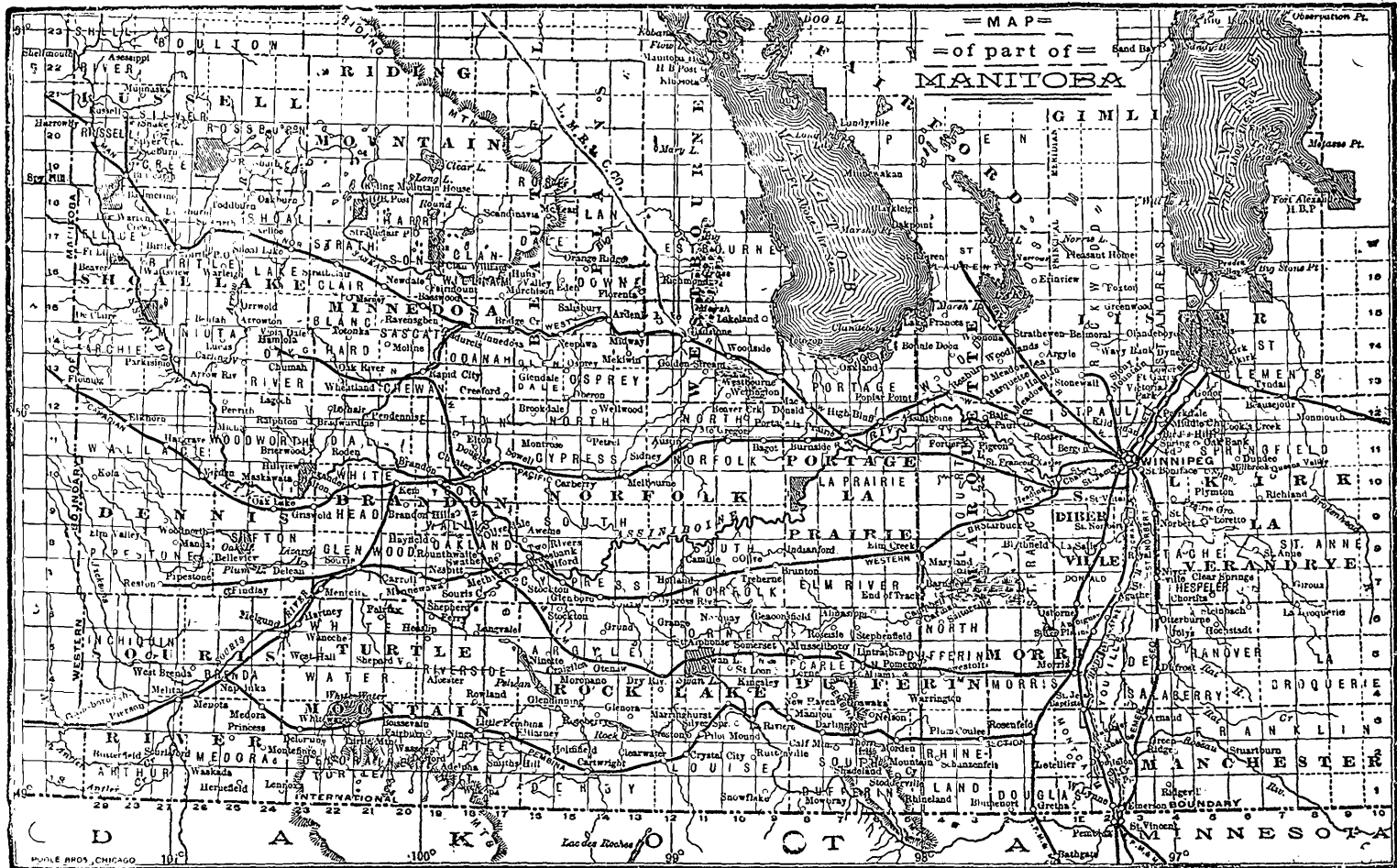

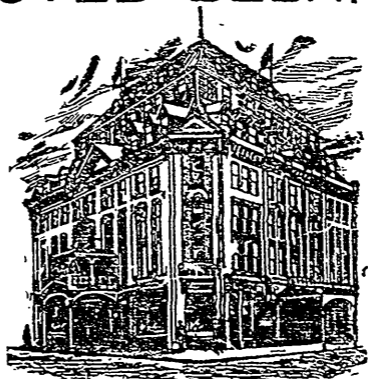
