notees The Canadian Delegation considers that the implementation of the eight-power resolution is a step in the right direction towards the permanent settlement of the refugee problem. My government approves the proposal that the Negotiating Committee for Extra Budgetary Funds should seek financial resources to permit the carrying out of the High Commissioner's programme and hopes that the efforts of the Negotiating Committee on this score will prove more successful than has recently been the case in other programmes. On the question of the advisory organ, the Canadian Government will welcome any arrangements which will lead to a more effective system of supervision, particularly if this should be required in the light of future developments in the High Commissioner's programme.

For these reasons the Canadian Delegation will lend its support to the eight-power resolution. The Canadian Government regrets that consideration has not yet been given to the question of its contribution to the High Commissioner's programme for 1955. Canada's approval of the eight-power resolution, and in particular of the extension of the activities of the Negotiating Committee for Extra-Budgetary Funds to cover the High Commissioner's programme, should not be regarded therefore as constituting an undertaking to contribute to the refugee programme which may be approved by the General Assembly.
