PROTECT YOUR WATERFRONT PATROL BOATS ARE REQUIRED

Engineer Rust Makes Recommendations Toward Improving Life-Saving Facilities.

A report was furnished by the city engineer to the property committee yesterday, setting forth the extent of life-saving apparatus along the waterfront, and at the island. The committee will get a report from the property committee, showing how many drowning accidents and rescues have taken place in the last few years, as a preliminary to taking action.

The following equipment: Tongue-street wharf, 3 ladders, 8 buoys and 8 poles; Geddes' wharf, 3 ladders, 3 buoys and 3 poles; City wharf (east Bay-street), 2 ladders, 2 buoys and 2 poles; City wharf (west Bay-street), 4 ladders, 4 buoys and 4 poles; Acropolis' wharf, 2 ladders, 2 buoys and 2 poles; Queen's wharf, west end, and Queen's wharf, east end, each 1 ladder, 1 buoy and 1 pole, while at the island, there was 1 drag and 1 set of grappling irons; Gerrard-street bridge, 1 ladder, 1 buoy; Queen-street bridge, 1 ladder, 1 buoy; Eastern-avenue, 1 ladder, 1 buoy; Church-street wharf, 1 ladder, 1 buoy; Motor-boats wharf, 3 ladders, 3 buoys and 3 poles; Hanlan's Point, a ladder, buoy and pole; Yonge-street and Brock-street boat landing; Centre Island, a ladder, buoy and pole; and a ladder, buoy and pole at the centre of the lagoon and landing; Point St. Charles, a ladder and buoy; and a ladder, buoy and pole at the Niagara Steamboat and Hamilton wharf; and a ladder, buoy and pole at the City wharf.

EFFECT OF COMMERCIALISM IN INSURANCE BUSINESS

"While it had, of course, given rise to the modern joint stock insurance companies, it has also contributed to an undue heavy fire insurance, the spirit of which is embodied in the policy of the insurance companies."
