ROCKEFELLER'S LATEST.
If John D. Rockefeller and his cohorts were already largely interested in the cattle business, can get their graspers on the world's live stock business, as a London despatch intimates they propose to do, action cannot too soon be taken to thwart their scheme. What they have in mind is to acquire the Canadian stock exchange, which is to-day paying from two to four cents a gallon more for oil than they should, because of the monopoly held by the Standard Oil Company, which draws dividends ranging from 30 to 60 per cent. per annum. What this greedy corporation has done in coal and oil would do in beef, and they would do it with the same power of money which has brought to bear, and the plan of consolidation adopted in the formation of the steel trust will be followed. Cattle ranching will be fostered until a certain state of prosperity is reached, then they will swoop upon the manufacturers, and buy up all the packing plants, and pool interests under one head. The Armour, Swift and Cudahy packing concerns of Chicago, Milwaukee, Omaha and Kansas City will be gathered in under Rockefeller wings. If the project succeeds, and then the prices of meat would meet the pressure. The greed of the trust. In view of what has been done in coal oil, the public may well feel anxiety as to the success or otherwise of the proposed consolidation.

AGAIN DOCTORS DIFFER.
The theory of Dr. Koch that tuberculosis bacillus was not transmissible to humanity thru the milk or meat of cattle has recently been shown to be incorrect. That opinion, which was held by the German professor's statements, and fears it may induce carelessness among farmers in regard to the care of their stables. In spite of Dr. Koch's assertion, he believes milk from diseased cows must be as infectious as the milk of children. John McFadyen of the Royal Veterinary College is another doubter, and Dr. Ravenel, Pennsylvania's representative, caused a sensation by citing three cases which came under his personal observation, in which there was direct infection of man by bacillus from cattle. Two other cases were cited, in which men engaged in the cattle trade became infected. One was cured, and the other died of tuberculosis within a year.


