Aged Educationist Succumbs to Brief Attack of Pneumonia.

John Campbell, M.A., died from pneumonia on Saturday evening about 8 o'clock at his boarding place, 13 Mount Pleasant, following an illness of little over a week. He was in his 80th year.

Mr. Campbell had a lifelong experience of the teaching profession, having been over forty years ago associated with the staff of Victoria College, for some thirty years principal or classical master of the High schools of

Collegiate Institutes at Bradford, Newburgh, Napanee, Peterboro and Guelph. His former scholars are in almost every court and business college in the province.

He was what may be called a teacher of the old school, a strict disciplinarian, faithful and exact in his duties, but with a loving kind heart for all. He leaves surviving him, his widow and four children, viz.: A. J. Campbell, barrister at Ridgeway, Ont.; J. M. Campbell, general advertising manager of the Island System, Chicago; J. W. Campbell, of the Bank of Commerce, now of New Ontario, and Mrs. Day, wife of Prof. G. E. Day of the O. A. C. Guelph.

The funeral will take place at 2:30 p.m. on Tuesday at the house and thence to Mount Pleasant Cemetery.

"GEORGE COX" JUST A VOTER, NAME DID NOT ATTRACT MAGUIRE

Unknown by Sight or Fame to Officials Where Senator Was Impersonated.

George Maguire, who was the deputy returning officer in the No. 3 sub-division, Ward 3, Bay-street Fire Station, where it is alleged that out of a dozen names of voters registered, three of them were impersonated, was spoken to by The World Saturday night. It is charged that ballots were cast there for Senator Cox, C. Casey Wood and F. W. Carey, barrister. The senator was out of the city on the day of the election, and the other two do not even belong near the booth in question.

When asked what he thought of these statements, and if there was any chance he could explain for it, Mr. Maguire said: "I regret very much the alleged occurrence if it is true. I can state positively, however, that there was no irregular voting going on to my knowledge, if a man came up and requested a ballot in the usual way and we had no suspicions, we gave it to him and he made the entry in the poll book. We did not notice any suspicious looking characters asking for a ballot to vote for George A. Cox without mentioning the name of the senator, or the name of the men who asked for the ballots of the gentlemen just referred to."

"I DO NOT KNOW SENATOR COX, NOR THE OTHER TWO. I have not made the entry in the poll book because of impersonating them, and I cannot understand how it happened, as I understand by the papers, there seems little doubt that the ballot did not come from the hands of the men who asked for the ballots of the gentlemen just referred to."

"I did my duty to the very best of my ability, and it had been at all stages of the election, I would have taken the necessary precautions to find out who was the man who voted for Senator Cox, but I must have mentioned the name of the senator, otherwise I would have been liable for a fine."





WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY SOME OF ITS PROBLEMS

Dr. Chant Describes Marconi's Beginning and the Results Secured Thus Far.

Prof. Chant of Toronto University lectured on "Some Problems in Wireless Telegraphy" before the Canadian Institute on Saturday night.

In wireless telegraphy, he said, the art is considerably ahead of the science. In 1887 Hertz obtained experimental evidence of the transmission of electric waves three space, and eight or nine years later Marconi devised a method of sending signals to a much greater distance than had previously been attained.

At first Marconi was very careful to have the apparatus well polished and it was held in oil, but after a while he found he could get along quite well without the larger spheres at all, and finally he discovered that the effective waves were not the short waves, but the long waves, and that the antenna should be connected to the earth.

At the present time the wireless telegraph is being used for the transmission of messages, and for the transmission of music, and for the transmission of news.
