the following acts of Assembly be passed into Law by virtue of His Excellency's
commission of Seal countersigned by the Clerk of the said Assembly.

BYE-LAWS
OF THE
INCORPORATED
DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

1st. At all the meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of this Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-Laws, nor any proposition be adopted by the Society or the Executive Committee thereof to which his dissent shall be expressed, until the same shall have been submitted to the next Annual general meeting of the Society; and if such alteration or proposition be again adopted at such other meeting, it shall then take effect, notwithstanding such dissent.

4th. The Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be the first of the Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to seven. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer.

5th. All members of the Church are invited to unite with the Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop, and all Lay-members of the Church of England subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arrear. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

6th. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and the Treasurer of the Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as hereafter provided; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the Local Committees, according to the ninth Bye-Law.

7th. An Annual Meeting of the Society, open to all its members, shall be held at Halifax in the month of October, or at such time as the Executive Committee shall appoint; at which meeting the vacancies in the Executive Committee shall be filled up, the Secretaries and Treasurers shall be elected, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

8th. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of July, August, and September; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or in his absence, by a Vice President.

9th. The Members of the Church in every part of the Province, are invited to co-operate with the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing any one member of the Society to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society; but when the Local Committees desire it, they shall receive Books at cost and charges, to the amount of one-fourth of their remittances, or the said one-fourth may be placed in the hands of the Endowment Sub-Committee, for the benefit of the Parish or Mission where the money was contributed.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England, in peculiar and extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision, to be appointed by the Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee; and, lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.
- 6.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.
- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.

11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society, to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some Members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants of their own neighborhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. An Annual Sermon shall be preached before the Society. The Preacher, time, and place, to be appointed by the President.

14th. At each Annual Meeting of the Society, the first five on the Executive Committee shall go out of office; but all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members shall be first proposed and seconded, then elected by ballot and placed at the bottom of the list.

15th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at a General Meeting of the Incorporated Society; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the clergy, and the endeavors of all who are engaged in promoting the knowledge of true religion. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy Glory and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O merciful God, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but that he should be converted and live, have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, infidels and heretics, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word, and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

Almighty God, Father of all mercies, we, Thine unworthy servants, do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness and loving kindness to us and to all men; more particularly for the providential support by which this Society has been hitherto sustained; but above all, for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy Blessed Son, for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory which Thou hast given us in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ: to whom, with Thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, world without end. Amen.

Our Father, which art in Heaven, hallowed be thy name; Thy Kingdom come; Thy will be done in earth as it is in Heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those that trespass against us. REPORT.

BEFORE commencing their 26th Report, the Executive Committee invite all to join with them in sentiments of thanksgiving to Almighty God for the many blessings bestowed upon our Church and country. While other branches of the Church of Christ are suffering the evils of war, and some have to mourn the perversion of appointed guardians of the truth, we are kept in peace and plenty, in unity, integrity, and brotherly love. Let us watch and pray that these blessings may be continued to us, and let us show by our obedience that our thanks are not mere lip-service.

Whatever success has attended the efforts of this Society for supporting the Church and making known the saving truths of which she is the keeper and exponent, let all honour and praise be ascribed to God Most High. For our part let us be thankful that we are allowed to be the instruments for carrying on the great work of Christ upon earth. Ours is the privilege and ours the responsibility of working with him and for him as sworn soldiers and servants of the Cross. Let us cry with the Royal Psalmist, "Prosper thou the work of our hands!" The regular progress of the Society's operations does not present many incidents of special interest, yet an account of the proceedings of the Executive Committee will show that they have been, to the best of their means, carrying out the objects of the Society with that spirit of Christian charity which it was intended to promote.

The Committee have every confidence in saying that the efforts of this Society are productive of much good to our Church, and they point to the statistical returns from the parishes to show that our funds are neither paid to slothful servants in their Lord's Vineyard, nor their labor unattended with practical results.

It appears that the struggle for self-support is already producing more attachment to our Church, and more lively interest in its welfare; and your Committee have good hope that by the time the aid of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel is entirely withdrawn, the Churchmen of Nova Scotia will feel no regret that the support of their Church has been left to their own zeal and

energy. Your Committee feel assured that every Churchman in the Diocese will heartily join with them in gratitude to the venerable S. P. G. for the great kindness it has shown us in past time, and for the support which it still continues to give to our missions, and will offer their prayers that the efforts of that Society, now more especially directed to Heathen countries, may be crowned with success and blessing.

Although the collections for other Church purposes have tended to lessen our receipts, yet the total amount received during 1863 is about \$1000 more than in the year 1862. The income for general purposes is however \$50 less; owing to the fact that a larger amount than usual has been reserved by the Parishes for special purposes.

The Committee have been enabled somewhat to enlarge their Missionary grants, yet they wish every member of the Church distinctly to understand that to meet the increased and daily increasing wants of the Church in Nova Scotia, the income of this Society must be annually enlarged.

The Executive Committee cannot but feel that no more effective mode can be adopted for the support of the Church in this Diocese than a regular and steady increase in the general funds of the D. C. S.

The amount of the subscription lists for the year was \$4,260, which is a small increase upon the last year's receipts. From this sum \$738.18 was, in accordance with the rules of the Society, reserved for special purposes by the Parishes.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The income of this fund steadily increases, for the Committee have hitherto been able yearly to add something to the Capital, and the charges upon it remain as before, \$340 per annum. The Committee hold securities for this object to the amount of \$14,330. The income of the fund for 1863, not counting donations or back premiums, was \$1,641.

It is much to be regretted that in some of the Parishes, even where the clergyman has a personal interest in the fund, the collections are entirely neglected, while in several others they are not regularly made. This is manifestly unfair upon those who are doing their best for the benefit of the fund, and betrays a want of interest which makes the Committee hesitate to increase the pension.

ENDOWMENT OF PARISHES.

For this fund the Sub-Committee have received during 1863 \$2468.35, partly in trust and partly to accumulate for the benefit of the Parishes. A particular statement will be found as usual in the Appendix.

At the recommendation of the Endowment Committee, a rule was adopted which allows any parish to withdraw its money, when amounting to \$1,000, from the "reserved Fourths," and to deposit the sum with the Society *in Trust*, with the Interest payable annually to the Incumbent. The Sub-Committee now hold Securities for about \$13,040 belonging to this fund. Since its formation in

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

The Sub-Committee have not succeeded so well as they hoped in raising a capital fund for this object. They wish, however, to keep it as much as possible before the public, and they earnestly request the clergy to give them all the aid in their power. They would remind them that not only is it for their own benefit, but that their parishioners are also interested in it, inasmuch as the establishment of this fund would enable an incapacitated clergyman to retire from his charge, and another, better able, to take his place. Without some provision of this kind such change would often be difficult. The Committee have now \$2,800 funded for this purpose, and will require at least as much more before they can consider the object accomplished.

The Committee thankfully acknowledge the receipt of \$60 for this fund, and \$40 for the W. & O., in the name of the late Mrs. Binney. The Bishop informs the Committee that this annual interest of the amount given in her name shall be yearly paid to the Society, until the principal can be paid over for the objects for which it is given.

There was also a special grant made to the Rev. D. C. Moore of \$100; and to pay the expenses of the Rev. J. Woods for missionary work in the districts west of Halifax city, \$30—total \$2,187. The Executive Committee has lately made a grant of \$200 toward the support of a missionary at Melford, and voted the additional sum of \$100 to meet the same amount from the people on Digby neck. It is hoped that a clergyman may thus be supported there, although no help can be given from the Block sum of the S. P. G.

The people in the parishes receiving aid from the D. C. S. generally show their gratitude by larger returns to the Society, or by more active exertions for local objects.

From Albion Mines the contributions have steadily increased for some years past.

The people of Hubbard's Cove, though poor, are yet warm-hearted Churchmen, and the Missionary there has sent us a collection considerably larger than the former year.

The Rev. J. Breading is working with zeal beyond his strength among the fishermen on the shores west of Halifax Harbor, visiting and teaching those who have been unavoidably left much without the ministrations of our Church.

it must be remembered that the people are now required to make up a part of the income of the Missionary, which in former years they did not do.

The Missionary at Maitland writes that the people are contributing to the best of their ability towards the completion of a new church there. The congregation appears to be increasing, and has become too large for the Hall in which Service has been hitherto performed.

Both at Pugwash and at New Ross they are doing their best to build a Parsonage for their Clergyman. At the latter place such a provision seems necessary for securing the permanent residence of a Clergyman among them. The people, as well as their active Missionary, deserve every encouragement.

From Tusket the Missionary writes that he has had many difficulties to overcome since he went there, yet he feels somewhat encouraged by the way Church matters are progressing. He has sent us a larger return than on any former year.

From Weymouth also we are glad to acknowledge the largest contribution ever sent from that parish.

The Executive Committee have good reason to think that when the collections for the Church Endowment Fund no longer press upon the people, the income of the D. C. S. can and will be largely increased. There has also been paid during 1863, first moiety of grant to church at Glace Bay, C. B., \$30; grant to church at St. Margaret's Bay, \$80.00; for books, in lieu of reserved fourths, \$26.50; for the use of the National School, 1862, \$20; Temperance Hall, for public meeting, \$14; contingencies, viz.: printing, advertising, stationery, messenger, postage, &c., \$51.56; Secretary's salary, \$120; printing the 25th Report, \$182; leaving a balance in the Treasurer's hands at the end of 1863, of \$2245.72: from which is to be deducted salaries for missionaries not called for until 1864; unpaid grants to churches and parsonages, \$775, leaving the sum of \$1470.72 as the available balance.

The Executive Committee have much pleasure in stating that the Parish of Windsor again takes its place in our list of contributors. The Rector writes:—

"We have had an excellent meeting, at which very good sentiments were expressed toward the Society, and I think in future an increased interest will be felt in the Society's work."

From the Rector at Shelburne:—

"I forward the list of contributors from my mission to D. C. S. for the year 1864, the largest offering for this purpose we have ever made, although far below what it ought to be. Many of the sums from individuals are very small, but in very many instances they were not able to pay even that mite down, but had to sell something to enable them to do so. Many give their hundreds and thousands, but have hundreds and thousands left still, and do not have to deny themselves a single luxury or gratification. Not so with

many of my people who deny themselves a great deal. Over, affording a great deal of gratification, are required. My people have done all that is possible. My people have done all that is possible. It still, however, gives us a small sum, which we are grateful. We have asked no favor of the Society, but have done our duty, do, but receive

From the Rector:

"When I first came here I had a vision made for me of the great field of labor on which we stand. There are many children I found here who have not been organized into the church. The great difficulty is to find labor and funds for the work. We have come in some degree to meet the benevolent and benevolent efforts of their most efficient friends. We have found that our efforts are not in vain, and that the trenchment of the cause of Christ is being made deeper every day. We are now in a position to be of service to others, and are sending out missionaries to other fields. The consequences of our efforts are now visible, and we are roused to a sense of the importance of our work. We were soon enabled to open a school house, and have since raised sufficient money to build a school, and have now a large number of students. In three years we have increased our number of students, and are increasing our efforts to meet the measure at hand. We have boys in attendance, and though so few, we are doing well. The rising generation is the future of the country, and the matter is one of great interest, I trust."

many of my poor people, oftentimes they have not another cent, and must deny themselves some necessary of life in order to make their offering to the D. C. S. The last year we have made an addition to our church at Church Over, affording us 50 additional sittings, which are all filled, and 50 more are required. We have endeavoured to accomplish this within ourselves, if possible. My poor people gave liberally, and with a hard struggle we have accomplished the matter and improved the appearance of the church much. It still, however, requires painting, and if your Committee would kindly give us a small sum by way of help and encouragement, I for one would feel very grateful. We have not been a begging parish; for fifteen years we have asked no favor, and have therefore contributed more to the general funds of the Society than many parishes which appear to give a larger sum than we do, but receive back more than they contribute."

From the Missionary at Arichat:—

"When I came to this parish, ten years ago, I found not the slightest provision made for the future support of the Church. With the exception of the ground on which our little church stands, we had not a foot we could call our own. There was no school-house; not even a Protestant school. All our children I found under the zealous training of Roman Catholic teachers. To organize the school and to obtain a teacher was not a very difficult matter. The great difficulties were to find a suitable house to rent for the purpose, and funds for the teacher's support. After much delay, however, we overcame in some measure these obstacles. We obtained a room, and by the benevolent assistance of the Colonial Church Society, the services of one of their most efficient teachers. So far our prospect was cheering, but we soon found that our little institution was looked upon with a jealous eye. Retrenchment of the common school pittance was proposed, and the majority seconding the motion we were soon starved out. I cannot say that the consequences of such proceedings have seriously affected us. Our people were roused to a sense of their obligations, and aided by kind friends abroad we were soon enabled to purchase a piece of ground, and to erect a suitable school house thereon, at a cost of £150. We have not been able as yet to raise sufficient tuition fees for the support of a combined male and female school, and consequently the duty of conducting it has devolved for the last three years upon myself and Mrs. Brine. Our numbers, I am happy to say, are increasing, and I hope at no distant day we may be relieved in some measure at least of our arduous work. We have seventeen girls and eighteen boys in attendance, and no less than six are from distant settlements. Although so busily occupied in effecting our arrangements for the education of the rising generation, we have not lost sight of our parsonage. I have kept the matter before our people year after year. We have obtained a site and a glebe of fourteen acres at a cost of £100, and having another £125 now at interest, I think the undertaking will in the course of time succeed. I must

in justice to my people say that those who are really members of the Church have always contributed very largely to my support, and are still willing to do whatever they can; personally they have been extremely kind. But there are many persons who, although ranking as parishioners, and reaping all the blessings of a resident minister, do not contribute according to their means. Their children it is true are all being educated in the principles of the Church, and I have no doubt will hereafter become her attached members."

RULE LATELY PASSED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

"Any parish whose accumulated fourths have reached the sum of \$1000 may place the amount in trust with the Society. The incumbent may receive the interest."

SUPERANNUATION FUND RULES.

Extract from the 11th object of the D. C S.—11. It shall be one of the objects of the Society to provide * * * * for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen ; but no part of the Society's fund shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

No. 1.—In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Superannuation Fund."

This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all benefits arising therefrom ; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this object and none other.

No. 2.—A standing sub-Committee of six laymen shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Bishop of the Diocese as chairman, shall be vested the whole management of this fund.

No. 3.—The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay from the proceeds of this fund the pensions which may become due under the following rules.

No. 4.—Any Clergyman of the Church of England within this Diocese wishing to participate in the benefits of this fund, shall make application to the sub-Committee, who shall decide each case upon its own merits, and have power to grant such amount of pension, (not exceeding \$200,) as they think expedient. But should the Committee refuse to grant the pension, an appeal may be made by the applicant to the Executive Committee of the D. C. S.

No. 5.—No clergyman admitted from abroad into this Diocese shall receive any benefit from this fund, unless he shall have served for at least seven consecutive years in this Diocese, or shall have paid into this fund a sum to be named by the sub-Committee.

No. 6.—The pension shall be for life, unless circumstances should arise (either from a falling off of the fund or otherwise) which may make a revision necessary.

No. 7.—If the pensioner reside out of this Diocese sufficient proof of his identity shall accompany each draft for his pension.

No. 8.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days that shall happen after the pension is granted, and terminate on the first of those days that shall happen after the death of the pensioner, or the happening of any other event by which such pension is to cease.

No. 9.—If any pensioner shall be so far relieved from his disability as to be able to resume the discharge of Clerical duty, the pension shall be suspended during his relief from such disability.

No. 10.—None of the above rules or regulations shall be altered except at a general meeting of the Diocesan Church Society ; after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information :—

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church, and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.
- 4.—The supposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.
- 6.—That all the sittings are to be free.

It is the wish of the Executive Committee that no Clergyman should, when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Society, without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Society to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made in the following terms, namely : That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished.

"The endowment sub-Committee receive and hold any money given in trust to the Society for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given."

"It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that it is the intention of the fifth Bye-Law that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a member, but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."

Form of Legacy.

"I give to the Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia, the sum of _____, to be applied to the general purposes of the Society." And the Receipt of the Treasurer of the Society shall be sufficient discharge for the same.

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Society.

"The Society will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the *Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission*, all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that parish."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, October 19th, 1855, the following resolution was adopted :—

"That in future all subscription lists received before the 31st March in each year, will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, April 18th, 1856, it was directed :—

"That if reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Society."

The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above resolutions.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, Feb. 19th, 1858, it was

"Resolved, That in future all applications for aid from this Society be proposed at one meeting of the Society and considered at the next."

At a general meeting of the Society, Nov. 11, 1859, it was

Resolved, That the Executive Committee be authorized to grant, at their discretion, a sum of money, not exceeding £40, towards an outfit for any newly ordained clergyman of the Church who may require such assistance, previous to his assumption of actual duty in the Province.

The Secretary of the S. P. G. "Block sum" submitted a statement of the account up to Oct. 14, 1863.

"It was resolved, that this Society accept the 'Block sum' from the S. P. G. on the usual terms for the next two years."

November 20.—A grant of \$80 was made to the new church at St. Margaret's Bay.

December 18.—The amount voted to the missionary at Rawdon not having been drawn in consequence of the people not fulfilling the conditions, the amount for three years was granted, under the peculiar circumstances, toward the parsonage there.

January 15, 1864.—A grant of £50 stg. was made from the S. P. G. Block sum toward the support of a missionary at either Bridgewater or Melford at the Bishop's option. At the same meeting it was determined to refer to the General Meeting the question which had been raised as to grants being made to churches only where the seats were "free and unappropriated."

March 11.—A grant of \$40 was made toward finishing the church at Western Head, Liverpool parish.

An additional grant of \$100 was made toward the support of a missionary at Digby Neck, on condition of a similar additional amount being raised by the people.

May 20th.—The Annual Report of the Executive Committee was adopted, and ordered to be published as usual.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

The Annual General Meeting of the Society was held in the National School Room, on Wednesday, 14th October, 1863.

The Rt. Rev. the President took the chair at 2 o'clock, p. m.

"It was resolved, that no person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Society, nor to be elected a member of the Executive Committee, who has not been a subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting."

The 25th Report of the Executive Committee was duly presented to the Society.

Notice of motion was given by the Bishop to repeal the 13th Bye Law relative to the Annual Sermon before the Society.

The Secretary of the S. P. G. "Block sum" submitted a statement of the account up to Oct. 14, 1863.

"It was resolved, that this Society accept the 'Block sum' from the S. P. G. on the usual terms for the next two years."

The Secretary of the Church Endowment Committee submitted a Report of the state of that fund, which Report was adopted.

"It was resolved, that the Church Endowment Committee be recommended to send out two agents, one to the eastern and one to the western parts of the Province, to make arrangements for collecting the remaining subscriptions to that fund."

"It was resolved, that the next General Meeting of the Society be held as near as possible to the time appointed for the meeting of the Synod."

Attention was drawn to the neglect of many of the parishes to make collection for the W. & O. fund.

"It was resolved, that this Society request the Bishop as Diocesan to bring this matter before the Clergy, and to impress upon them the necessity of making an annual collection in each one of their Churches for the W. & O. fund."

A Public Meeting of the Society was held in the Temperance Hall, Halifax, on the evening of Thursday, the 15th October, at 7½ o'clock, p. m., at which the following Resolutions were adopted :

CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information:

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church, and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.
- 4.—The supposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.
- 6.—That all the sittings are to be free.

It is the wish of the Executive Committee that no Clergyman should, when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Society, without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Society to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made in the following terms, namely: That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished.

"The endowment sub-Committee receive and hold any money given in trust to the Society for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given."

"It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that it is the intention of the fifth Bye-Law that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a member, but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."

Form of Legacy.

"I give to the Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia, the sum of _____, to be applied to the general purposes of the Society." And the Receipt of the Treasurer of the Society shall be sufficient discharge for the same.

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Society.

"The Society will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission, all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that parish."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, October 19th, 1855, the following resolution was adopted :—

"That in future all subscription lists received before the 31st March in each year, will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, April 18th, 1856, it was directed :—

"That if reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Society."

~~At~~ The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above resolutions.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, Feb. 19th, 1858, it was

"Resolved, That in future all applications for aid from this Society be proposed at one meeting of the Society and considered at the next."

At a general meeting of the Society, Nov. 11, 1859, it was

Resolved, That the Executive Committee be authorized to grant, at their discretion, a sum of money, not exceeding £40, towards an outfit for any newly ordained clergyman of the Church who may require such assistance, previous to his assumption of actual duty in the Province.

November 20.—A grant of \$80 was made to the new church at St. Margaret's Bay.

December 18.—The amount voted to the missionary at Rawdon not having been drawn in consequence of the people not fulfilling the conditions, the amount for three years was granted, under the peculiar circumstances, toward the parsonage there.

January 15, 1864.—A grant of £50 stg. was made from the S. P. G. Block sum toward the support of a missionary at either Bridgewater or Melford at the Bishop's option. At the same meeting it was determined to refer to the General Meeting the question which had been raised as to grants being made to churches only where the seats were "free and unappropriated."

March 11.—A grant of \$40 was made toward finishing the church at Western Head, Liverpool parish.

An additional grant of \$100 was made toward the support of a missionary at Digby Neck, on condition of a similar additional amount being raised by the people.

May 20th.—The Annual Report of the Executive Committee was adopted, and ordered to be published as usual.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

A vote of thanks was unanimously passed to the Rev. T. Blackman, D. C. L., for his sermon before the Society.

* It was *resolved*, that no person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Society, nor to be elected a member of the Executive Committee, who has not been a subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting.

The 25th Report of the Executive Committee was duly presented to the Society.

Notice of motion was given by the Bishop to repeal the 13th Bye Law relative to the Annual Sermon before the Society.

The Secretary of the S. P. G. "Block sum" submitted a statement of the account up to Oct. 14, 1863.

"It was *resolved*, that this Society accept the 'Block sum' from the S. P. G. on the usual terms for the next two years."
