THE SIXTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL.

Eng.

The Annual Meeting of the Corporation of the Montreal General Hospital was held in the Governor's Hall of the institution, on Tuesday, the 19th May, 1885. Mr. Andrew Robertson, President of the Board of Governors, in the chair.

The Secretary read the following report, which was adopted and ordered to be printed for circulation amongst the subscribers.

Gentlemen of the Corporation of the Montreal General Hospital.

I have the honor to present a brief report of the finances of the institution and of the proceedings of the Governors during the year which terminated the 30th April, 1885.

A resume of our financial statement will be found embodied in the report.

If the financial statement be analyzed and some of its items compared with those of the year which immediately preceded it, the following points of interest will appear:—The expenditure of the year 1884-85 was \$40,910.27 and the income \$39,308.71, showing an excess of expenditure over income of \$1,601.56. Comparing the expenditure of 1884-85, \$40,910.27, with that of 1883-84, \$40,715.36; the former exceeds the latter only by \$196.91—a result very satisfactory when it is borne in mind that 190 more in-door patients were treated this last year than in its immediate predecessor. The increased expenditure in 1884-85 over that of 1883-84 has occurred chiefly in the following items:—Drying room and alterations, \$696.25; nurses' and womens' wages, \$327.70; workman's wages, \$199.56; drugs and medicines, \$326.14; instruments, etc., \$267.64; gas, \$172.01; repairs, \$131.34; furniture and crockery, \$120.23; and printing, advertising and stationery, \$65.39. The reduced expenditure, obtained chiefly under the following heads:—Provisions, etc., \$1,154.85; wines and liquors, \$69.77; dry goods, bedding, etc., \$359.52; coal and wood, \$161.06; medical officers' salaries, \$550;

and insurance, notarial, and law charges, \$109.67. Comparing the income of 1883-84, \$39,657.72, with that of 1884-85, \$39,308.71, the former exceeds the latter by \$349.01. The amounts received from the following sources of revenue during the year, when compared with those of 1883-84, show the following reductions:—Provincial Government grant, \$400; employees' subscriptions, \$403.13; annual subscriptions, \$187.67; city church collections, \$96.38; public pay patients, \$124.70; and other receipts, \$65. On the other hand there has been an increase in the following items of income:—Country church collections, \$95.71; private pay patients, \$108.60; medical students' fees, \$330; subscriptions for instruments, \$220; Dominion grant for sailors, \$101.70; and interest and rents, \$69.33. The following sums have been received from legacies during the year:—

Amongst the extraordinary expenditure during the year may be specially noticed the following:—The construction of a drying-room, the re-seating of the operating theatre, the fitting up of an adjoining room for the accommodation of patients about to undergo important operations, the preparation of an additional ward for infectious diseases, and the purchase of a number of surgical instruments. Thanks to the interest taken by Mr. Vaughan, one of the Governors, the sum of \$220 was subscribed by a few friends towards defraying the cost of the instruments.

The statistics of the year show that a much larger number of sick persons have received the benefits of the hospital in the year just terminated than in its immediate predecessor; and this is especially noticeable in the case of the indoor patients—that is, the persons whose needs are the most imperative, and whose maintenance constitutes the chief expenditure of the institution. The total number of indoor patients treated during the year was 2,239—an increase of 190

over that of 1883-84. Of these remained from 1883-84, 155; admitted during 1884-85, 2,084. There were:

The average daily number of patients in the wards during the year was 135: the average time of each patient in the hospital was 22.8 days, and the total number of days spent in hospital was 47,454. Of the indoor patients treated to a conclusion there were:

The nationalities of the patients will be found in the table annexed to this report.

The percentage of deaths to the whole number of persons treated is 7.65. If the cases of diphtheria be omitted, as that affection gives by far the highest rate of mortality amongst diseases usually met with in this institution, which are not necessarily fatal, the rate falls to 6.16 per cent.; and if 48 deaths that occurred within three days after admission be deducted from the gross mortality, the rate recedes to 5.44 per centum.

There were 13,348 consultations given in the "general out-door" department, an increase of 1,962 over the number in 1883-84, but these consultations represent only 1,638 patients. In the eye and ear out-door department, 1,271 patients were treated, an increase of 84 over the number of the immediately preceding year.

There has been an unusual number of patients suffering from infectious or communicable diseases admitted during the year. Eighty cases of diphtheria—the highest number ever reached in this hospital—those next in order being 50 cases in 1883-84, and 52 in 1877-78.

Typhoid fever admissions were 119, being, however, 12 less than in 1883-84, and 36 less than in 1881-82. Measles and erysipelas also attained epidemic proportions. The want of suitable means of securing perfect isolation for these communicable diseases is very much felt, notwithstanding the appropriation to them during the year of another ward in the infectious wing.

In this connection it may be stated that the plans prepared under the direction of Mr. Peter Redpath by one of the first hospital architects in England, are now about "to be submitted to a Montreal architect and a competent builder, with power to call in an American architect or hospital expert of established reputation, should they consider it necessary to do so." On receipt of the report of those gentlemen, the Committee of Management will decide whether to recommend the adoption of the plans or not, and will submit them for formal approval, or otherwise, to the Governors, who have been, in the meantime, invited to inspect the plans at the office of the President.

It is but right to say that the Committee of Management has not yet advised the Governors as to when the work of building should be begun, feeling no little hesitation, in the present commercial status, in undertaking the necessarily increased cost of maintaining the Hospital when considerably enlarged and provided with the improvements deemed necessary in modern hospitals. However, it is really necessary that at least one pavillion shall be speedily provided for the sick poor of our growing city, and it is confidently hoped that some of our wealthy and generous citizens will contribute a sufficient endowment to maintain it efficiently. The ambulance has proved of signal utility during the year, having been employed 109 times.

Six deaths have taken place amongst the Life Governors during the year viz : Messrs. Alex. Borrowman, Thomas Cramp, A. C. Hooper, R. McCready, R. Nicholson and W. O'Brien. On the other hand, eleven names have been added to the list of Life Governors, viz. : Messrs. Alexander Acheson, Thomas D. Bell, Charles H. Blackader, Alexander Borrowman, James Gardner, F. H. Medicine in the University of Pennsylvania. The Governors desire to congratulate Dr. Osler upon this well-merited distinction, and regard it as highly complimentary to this institution, in which he for several years cultivated those talents for clinical instruction and scientific investigation which has given him a high reputation outside his native land. The Medical Superintendent, Dr. Gray, on the completion of his first official year to the satisfaction of the Board of Management, resigned. Dr. William McClure has been appointed successor to Dr. Gray. The term of service of the three resident medical officers, Drs. Wyatt Johnston, Sharpe and Cameron, being about to terminate, their successors, Drs. F. G. Finley, D. W. Eberts and S. Gustin, were appointed at an adjourned meeting of Governors. Dr. Gray and the other retiring resident medical officers have the best wishes of the Governors for their success in private practice.

The Board of Management cordially testifies to the abiding interest exhibited by the Lady Superintendent in the affairs of the Hospital. And in his last report to the Board, the late medical superintendent, Dr. Gray, bears "testimony to the pains taking and faithful manner in which most of the nurses perform the duties devolving upon them." One of the nurses died of typhoid fever during the winter.

Certain alterations and amendments of the by-laws passed at the August quarterly meeting of Governors will be presently presented to the Corporation for its approval. Although numerous, they merely provide for the following measures :—

1st. The substitution of the titles, "Physicians" and "Surgeons" and "Assistant Physicians" and "Assistant Surgeons" for the pre-

sent titles, "Attending Physicians and Surgeons" and Out-door Physicians and Surgeons."

2nd. The appointment of two Specialists—a Gynæcologist to take charge of the diseases peculiar to women, and a Laryngologist, to treat affections of the nose, throat and windpipe.

3rd. The division of the Out-door Staff into Physicians and Surgeons as has been already done for the In-door Staff.

4th. The introduction into the present by-laws of the alterations, amendments, etc., required to harmonize them and bring them into accord with the above measures.

These amendments received the sanction of the Committee of Management and of the Medical Board; due notice of motion respecting them was given at the quarterly meeting of Governors of 14th May, 1884, and they were passed at the quarterly meeting of the 13th August last.
