



ROYAL ◉ CANADIAN ◉ ACADEMY.

REPORT

FOR THE YEAR 1894.

During the past year there have been few occurrences of unusual interest in the affairs of the Academy.

The Council, after considering the advisability of holding the exhibition in the Maritime Provinces, concluded that they were not warranted in doing so in view of the great expense connected therewith, and the small chance of the exhibition receiving any support in the present depressed financial conditions of business. After mature consideration, it was decided to hold it in Ottawa, and thus postpone the turn of Toronto till 1895. The exhibition was accordingly held in Ottawa, the Government giving the use of the National Gallery for the purpose. It was opened by His Excellency the Governor General. Though (owing

to the size of the gallery) not large, it was probably notable as showing the highest average of work yet attained in any of the regular annual displays of the Academy. The attendance was more satisfactory than on previous occasions when the capital was visited.

A number of pictures were purchased by the Council and placed in the National Gallery.

The attendance of members at the annual General Assembly was good. The very indefinite character of the rules as regards elections and other matters, and the numerous inconsistencies, resulting, as they always have done, in varied interpretations, has convinced the Council of the necessity of a revision of the Constitution. It is accordingly hoped that before the next annual General Assembly they may adopt it in the revised form and bring it before that body for ratification.

The vacancies declared for two Academicians were filled by the election of William Cruickshank, painter, of Toronto, and E. Wyly Grier, painter, of Toronto. The balloting for candidates as Associates resulted in the following elections: Franklin Brownell, painter, Ottawa; William Curtis Atkinson, painter, Toronto; James L. Graham, painter, Montreal; A. C. Williamson, painter, Toronto.

We have to mourn the loss of an Academician, appointed on the foundation of the Academy—Daniel Fowler, one of the most talented and highly esteemed of Canadian painters, who died during the past year at a very advanced age.

It is with regret that the Council announce that it was found necessary to curtail the amounts heretofore granted

for the furtherance of advanced art study from life. The state of the finances, however, with a proper regard to prudence in the conduct of the affairs of the Academy, admitted of no option in the case.

It was decided to open the next annual exhibition in Toronto in April next.

The Council at their last meeting declared vacancies for two Academician painters, elections to fill which will be held at the next General Annual Assembly.

The Secretary-Treasurer's Statement of Accounts, showing receipts, expenditure and balance on hand, is herewith submitted.
