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



# GEN. PETAIN'S MEN ATT OVER FRONT OF MLES

Much Progress Made From Near Carlepont, East of the Oise To Fontenoy, on the Aisne, About Six Miles West of Soissons-Line Vital To German Positions and If Broken Would Mean **General Enemy Retreat.** 

### (By The Associated Press).

Launching what may be described as an extensive local attack, the French on Sunday evening broke through the German positions along the vital sector connecting the Marne and Picardy battlefields,

This attack was over a front of approximately nine \$ miles, from near Carlepont, east of the Oise, to Fontenoy, on the Aisne, about six miles west of Soissons.

Since the situation along the Aisne and Vesle and in Picardy has seemed to be approaching a deadlock, indicating a return to the old trench warfare of the first two years of the war, an attack in the sector between the Aisne and the Oise has been expected. This line is vital to the German positions on each side of it. If it should be broken the whole German defensive scheme would be thrown out of joint.
