NOVA SCOTIA.

The Publishers of this work consider that there having been so many publications giving historical information of Nova Scotia, as in New Brunswick, that it would be of no advantage to follow in the same way, they therefore give a condensed statement of each County. The number of square miles, acres and population of each County will be found in the alphabetical order of names.

Annapolis County, capital Annapolis Royal, the oldest County, first inhabited by the French in 1605, nearly 270 years ago. They continued in possession for 108 years. In 1713 there was a treaty formed with the English, and the country of Nova Scotia became an English possession, and for 36 years Annapolis Royal was the capital of Nova Scotia; in 1749 it yielded the honors to Halifax. Fruit culture is carried on more extensively than in any other County in Nova Scotia, the lumber business is large, also shipbuilding is carried on extensively, the fishing business is also extensive. The scenery is very fine.

Antigonish County, capital Antigonish. This is an admirable County for agriculture. Shipbuilding is carried on. It is largely inhabited by the descendants of Scotch Highlanders.

Cape Breton County, capital Sydney. There are immense deposits of coal and several mines are profitably worked. It was at one time a separate colony. The fisheries are extensive, and large quantities of fish are shipped annually.

Colchester County, capital Truro. There are large de-

deposits of iron ore in this County. At Londonderry there are large quantities of it manufactured into iron and shipped; there are also some deposits of coal, the soil is very fertile, both fishing and shipbuilding is carried on.

Cumberland County, capital Amherst. This County is the border County between New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, it lies at the head of the Bay of Fundy on one side, and Northumberland Strait on the other, there are extensive marshes comprising 1,600 acres, the soil is exceedingly fertile, the I. C. R. runs through it, lumbering is carried on extensively, coal is found abundant in some portions, and grindstones have been made and shipped in large quantities, also freestone, lime and gypsum are found; fishing is also carried on extensively.

Digby County, capital Digby. This County was formerly part of Annapolis County, the inhabitants are largely the descendants of the French who first inhabited Nova Scotia, at Bear River there is considerable shipbuilding carried on, part of the County is quite mountainous, the herring fishing is among the chief business of numbers of its inhabitants, its waters abound with other fish, it has a fine bay, which would make the finest harbor in Nova Scotia except Halifax, the Annapolis River empties into it, and it is connected with the Bay of Fundy by what is called Digby Gut.

Guysboro County, capital Guysboro, on the Strait of Canso—which separates the County from Inverness and Richmond. Shipbuilding is carried on, gold is found and considerable mining done, fishing is also carried on to a large extent and has caused a large trade with foreign ports.

Hants County, capital Windsor. The Indians were the first inhabitants of this County, and portions of it in the early settlement of the whites in the country was claimed by them as their hunting grounds, and a reservation was made to them. There are large quantities of land—which is very valuable—reclaimed from the tidewater. The county is well adapted to agriculture, and shipbuilding is carried on extensively.

Inverness County, capital Port Hood, in Cape Breton. The inhabitants are mostly all descendants of Scotch Highlanders, fishing is carried on extensively, coal is found in this county, but farming is the principal employment of the inhabitants.

King's County, capital Kentville. This County is the continuation of the Annapolis Valley. There is a large quantity dyked land which is very valuable; it is a fine agricultural County; shipbuilding is also carried on. It ranks next to Annapolis County as a farming and fruit-growing County.

Lunenburg County, (capital Lunenburg) adjoins Halifax and Hants on the northeast, Kings and Annapolis on the northwest, Queens on the southwest, and the Atlantic Ocean on the southeast. It has several very good harbors, there is a very extensive business done in the fishing line, which has created a large business with the West Indies. It is also a good farming district. Gold was found in this county about the first in Nova Scotia. During the sixteenth century this coast was frequented by French fishing vessels, but no permanent settlement was made until the seventeenth century. It was formerly called by an Indian name—Malagash; was first settled by German and Swiss, and is now inhabited by their descendants.

Pictou County, capital Pictou, on the Strait of Northumberland. This is a fine county for agriculture. There are numerous harbors and rivers. In parts it is very hilly. This county was first settled by Highlanders, whose descendants now remain. It was formerly part of Colchester county. When first settled it was noted for its timber, and large quantities were shipped to Great Britain. Coal is found in large quantities and shipped to all parts of America; it was first discovered in 1798. This should be a great manufacturing county, having the raw materials of coal and iron. Fish is also abundant.

Queen's County, capital Liverpool, lies on the Atlantic coast and possesses good land in the interior, but along the coast is rocky. Farming and fishing are the principal businesses of its inhabitants. Lumbering and shipbuilding is carried on very extensively, large quantities of lumber being

shipped annually. There are a few manufactories, but a great deal more might be done in that line.

Richmond County, capital Arichat, in Cape Breton. Fishing and mining are the principal business, the former being carried on very extensively. A large business is done with other parts of the world. Shipbuilding is also carried on extensively, and a large quantity of shipping is owned by its inhabitants. The people are generally of French descent.

Shelburne County, capital Shelburne. Its coast, like all others when on the sea coast, is rocky. The soil is fertile, but the inhabitants are better adapted to fishing, in which a large business is transacted. Large quantities of lumber are shipped and shipbuilding is carried on extensively. This county has some fine harbors, it was founded in 1783 by British Loyalists.

Victoria County, capital Baddeck, in Cape Breton, is bounded partly by the ocean. Part of it, therefore, is rugged, but portions of it are well adapted to agriculture. It abounds in mineral wealth. It is inhabited chiefly by the descendants of Highland Scotch. Being in such close proximity to the Gulf of St. Lawrence, its winters are very cold and lengthy. There are several harbors, and fishing is carried on quite extensively. No fresh water lakes of any extent have been found in this county. Gold has been found in several places. It was formerly a great rendezvous for wild animals and a great field for sportsmen. The aboriginals are nearly extinct.

Yarmouth County, capital Yarmouth. The French Acadians were the first settlers in parts of the county, Their descendants still remain. The capital may be considered next to Halifax in importance as regards the number of business establishments. There is a large business done in lumbering and shipbuilding. It was considered not long since that Yarmouth owned more tonnage in shipping per head than any place in the world. Fishing is carried on very extensively and a large trade is done with the West Indies. In some localities farming is in a prosperous condition.

Anderson Mountain, a settlement in Pictou Co., 4 miles from New Glasgow, fare 20 cts. It has freestone quarries, pop. 110.

Annapolis or Port Royal (sub. elec. dis.), a seaport post town on Annapolis River 129 miles from Halifax, fare \$4. It was the Seat of Government until 1749. It is the western terminus of the W. & A. R. and has communication with St. John by "Union Line," Bay and River Steamers, distance to St. John 63 miles, fare \$2. It contains a branch bank, a Dominion savings bank, a well regulated reading room and library, one printing office, nine hotels, and about forty stores, one tannery and one cheese factory; shipbuilding is largely carried on, pop. 2840.

Annapolis County, capital Annapolis, bordering on the Bay of Fundy, a fine agricultural district 1308 sq. miles, 837,000 acres, pop. 20,600.

Antigonish (sub. elec. dis.), a post town and district in Antigonish Co., on the Cape Breton R., capital of Antigonish

Halifax County, on the Atlantic Ocean. There are a number of harbors and islands on its borders; there is considerable gold found in this county, it contains 2064 sq. miles, 1,321,250 acres, pop (not including Halifax city) 31,820.

Halifax, capital of Nova Scotia, distant from St. John, by W. & A. R., 190 miles, fare \$5; return ticket, \$7.50; I. C. R., 276 miles, fare \$6, return ticket \$9. Distant from Portland, Maine, 500 miles, fare \$9, pop 36,100. Halifax was founded in 1749. It was originally called Chebucto. This was at a time when the Earl of Halifax was President of the Board of Trade and Plantations, hence the name adopted for the place. The expedition sent out from England to do this work was placed under the direction of Hon. Edward Cornwallis—not Lord Cornwallis, as is often stated—Governor of Nova Scotia. He was instructed to found a town upon some part of the shores of Chebucto Bay, to be thereafter the seat of government of Nova Scotia. According to the most authentic accounts, Governor Cornwallis and suite landed upon what thus became Nova Scotia's capital, on the 21st of June, 1749; and the anniversary of that day has, for years past, been celebrated as the Natal Day of Halifax. The streets are spacious and cross each other at right angles. Halifax is the principal British military station in America, and, ever since its settlement, it may be considered as also virtually the principal British naval station in the "New World," although Bermuda has nominally been the naval headquarters for many years. Ships of war are continually coming and going, and there are from two to three regiments of soldiers, besides artillery and engineers stationed in the city. It may not be amiss to keep in mind the natal day and year of Halifax; because comparisons are often made between the city and Boston, New York

and Philadelphia, to the discredit of the former. Further, the topography of Nova Scotia, of which Halifax is the capital, is such that there is no point in the Province distant over thirty miles from a good seaport. Consequently the shores of the Province are rather profusely dotted with little towns, nearly all of which make their own importations and exportations direct, and not through Halifax. Again, the position of Halifax has always been a virtually isolated one. It is not connected, by one of Nature's highways, with any great and productive back country; but is connected by rail with the great railway system of the United States, Quebec and Ontario. Owing to these various causes, the growth of Halifax has not been so rapid as that of some other cities and towns on this continent, although it has been a steady and healthy one.

The natural situation of Halifax is exceedingly fine. The *city*, properly speaking, comprises the whole of a peninsula formed by the harbor, on the East, and by a river-like inlet from the harbor, called the North West Arm, on the South West. The harbor, after narrowing very much as we proceed northward, suddenly expands into Bedford Basin, which bounds the peninsula on the north. This peninsula extends four and a half miles in extreme length—that is, from Point Pleasant to the Basin. The width across the middle, and which is pretty nearly its average width, is two miles. The width of the isthmus, from the head of the North West Arm to the nearest point on Bedford Basin, is about one mile and a half. The whole area of the city may be roughly estimated at eight square miles. The arm of the sea, from which branch off the inlets and expansions already mentioned, is called Chebucto Bay.

Nature seems to have done everything that could be wished to make this peninsula of Halifax the site of a magnificent city. The whole of the area already described is available for building purposes, comfortable streets, parks, pleasure grounds, &c., on a regular plan, at a less cost than usually has to be incurred in the laying out and building of a town. For a distance of ten miles, following the sinuosities of the shore, its borders, with the exception of

about a quarter of a mile at Point Pleasant, where a shoal or ledge make out seaward, are washed by what navigators call "good water." The whole of that distance, with the exception named, is available for wharves, piers and quays, with sufficient depth of water to admit vessels close in shore, and with good "holding ground" in front.

The more compactly built portion of the city—the town proper—lies along the Eastern side of this peninsula, and consequently on the Western shore of the harbor. It is built, for the most part, on the slope of a hill, the summit of which is surmounted by Fort George, or the Citadel, and has extensive steam communication with all parts of the world. It sends two members to the Dominion House of Commons and two to the Provincial Legislature. The best view of the town is when seen from the opposite, or Dartmouth shore; but the prospect from Citadel Hill is one which no visitor should fail to see. We will suppose him there on the ramparts, or outside the works at an angle of one of the bastions. Clustering almost beneath his feet, and spreading out more visibly on his either hand, North and South, is the town. Beyond it lies what is often, and probably with truth, called "the finest harbor in the world," six miles long by one mile in width, and connected by a Basin which is six miles long by four miles in width. Set in it, like a gem, is the green mound-like George's Island, crowned by Fort Charlotte. These waters—blue as ever the Mediterranean was—stretch away to the right, or Southwest, leaving for miles the shores of McNab's Island, with its forest-clad hills and breezy downs, gleaming through the dark pine tops of the luxuriant Tower Woods; mirroring the pretty village of Falkland, which seems to clamber up the steep hillside, from the lofty summit of which frowns York Redoubt; now playfully rippling, and now rolling in, in curling and foaming waves, over Point Pleasant ledges and the more distant Thrum Cap shoal; until off Sambro, about nine miles distant, it becomes one with the broad Atlantic. On the other hand, to the Northward, this sheet of water contracts in width, forming what are called *The Narrows*, the shores of which are beautifully variegated with groves,

green fields, and pretty clusters of houses. Pursuing the view still farther in that direction, we may catch a glimpse of Bedford Basin over the shoulders of the hills which form the Northern part of the peninsula. Turn to the rear or Westward, and Halifax Common spreads out from the base of Citadel Hill, an expanse which is every year being more extensively planted and otherwise improved, and will soon be a charming public park. This—more properly the *North Common*—comprises, together with the Public Gardens, an extent of about ninety acres. Of this area the Public Gardens comprise about fourteen acres. They are kept in first rate order, contain ponds and fountains, and a croquet lawn, and although comparatively new, are already a delightful public promenade and a great boon to the citizens of Halifax. Beyond this Common there extends West, North and South a great and nearly level plateau, which will, doubtless, at no distant day, be the heart of the town, as well as of the city, of Halifax. The view in that direction is bounded by precipitous wooded hills, beyond the deep gulch, at the bottom of which the waters of the North West Arm cannot be seen from this point of view. Turning our eyes once more in the direction of the harbor, we see on its farther shore the pretty and thriving town of Dartmouth, built down to the water's edge and backed by bold, wood-crowned hills, the slopes of which are dotted with tasteful villas, and through one of the depressions of which we may catch a glimpse of the Dartmouth lakes. Indeed, in whatever direction the eye is turned from the point we have selected, it is met with a prospect of rare beauty.

The Academy of Music is a fine building, and gives great satisfaction to the theatre-going population, and, we trust, will give like satisfaction to the stockholders.

The Masonic Temple is another fine building, but situated so that it is partly hidden from view.

The Young Men's Christian Association is also a fine building, but wrongly situated to be seen any distance. There is a good library and reading room connected with it, with ample accommodation for young men of the city or for strangers. It has also a restaurant on temperance principles.

There are also several fine buildings such as the Government Building—Halifax being the seat of Government for the Province of Nova Scotia—Government House (the residence of the Governor of Nova Scotia), the Custom House and Post Office combined. There are a number of fine churches, banks and private residence both in the city and on the suburbs, where also there is a large cotton factory and a sugar refinery, both newly erected and in good working order. Her Majesty's Dockyard comprises a large area and has all modern improvements, and compares—if not exceeds—any on the American continent. The Railway Passenger Depot on North street is also a fine building and equals any in America, although it may not be as large as some in the United States. The freight cars proceed past the Passenger Depot to what was formerly called West's wharves, where is now erected capacious freight houses, both for the accommodation of the railway and English or foreign steamers carrying freight. At this locality there is a good sized grain elevator newly erected and ready for use. There are also a number of manufactories with suitable buildings. Among the most prominent is Moir's bakery and confectionery establishment. Mr. Moir has also a grain elevator and flour mills in the North suburbs.

The educational affairs of the city are in good condition, and several very good buildings, but somewhat behind other cities in the Dominion.

There is also the most to be considered—a large mercantile trade done with the West Indies, United States and Great Britain, both in exports and imports, and some fine and extensive buildings for carrying on the trade of the city.

The City has lost the advantage derived from the Street Cars, they were discontinued on the event of the Railway authorities crossing the track and lifting the rails to make an entry into the new station. In compensation for which the public has been accommodated with two lines of Omnibusses which run every quarter of an hour between the Depot and Freshwater, the whole distance for a fare of ten cents.

An improvement in the sanitary condition of the city is

the introduction by the Board of Works of a new method of sweeping the streets by an iron scraper and whalebone brush drawn by horses—first tried on the 4th July, 1877—which is a vast improvement on the original Preston and Hammond's Plains brooms. A pump has been procured capable of raising 150 gallons of water per minute, for the purpose of raising the water from the harbor into the watering-carts.

NEW BRUNSWICK.

New Brunswick, a province of the Dominion of Canada, bounded on the northwest by the Province of Quebec, from which it is separated by the river Restigouche; N. by Baie Chaleurs; E. by the Gulf of St. Lawrence and Northumberland Strait, the latter separating it from Prince Edward Island; S. by the Bay of Funday and part of Nova Scotia; and on the W. the State of Maine, from which it is separated by the St. Croix and St. John rivers; extending from lat. $45^{\circ} 5'$ to $48^{\circ} 45'$ N., lon. $63^{\circ} 50'$ to 68° W.; greatest length from north to south 230 miles, breadth 190 miles, area 27,322 square miles, equal to 17,393,410 acres; 321,233 population. There are sixteen representatives to the Dominion Parliament, and its present Governor is His Honor the Hon. R. D. Wilmot; nine representatives in the Executive Council, eighteen in the Legislative Council and forty-one in the House of Assembly; six Judges of the Supreme Court, six Judges of the County Courts, one Judge of Probates to each county. Its coast line is about 500 miles in length, interrupted only at the point of junction with Nova Scotia, where an isthmus of not more than eleven miles in breadth connects the two territories and separates the waters of Northumberland Strait from those of the Bay of Fundy, and which is united by means of a canal called the Baie Verte Canal.

Shipbuilding is extensively prosecuted in the Province, more especially at St. John and on the Miramichi. Vessels

are also built at St. Andrews, at various coves and harbors on the Bay of Fundy, along the banks of the St. John River and Petitcodiac, and at Cocagne, Richibucto, Bathurst, Dalhousie, Campbellton, and other ports on the North Shore.

New Brunswick was first settled by the French in 1639. It continued to form part, with Nova Scotia, of Acadia, or New France, till it fell into the hands of the British, after the conquest of Quebec. The first British settlers in the Province emigrated from Scotland to Miramichi in 1764; and in 1784 New Brunswick was separated from Nova Scotia and erected into a separate province. In 1825 the standing timber in the district around Miramichi Bay took fire, and enveloped an area of 6,000 square miles in flames, consuming two thriving towns, many large vessels lying in Miramichi river, and destroying 500 human lives.

In 1867 this Province united with Ontario, Quebec and Nova Scotia in forming the Canadian Confederation, and is the fourth largest Province, as regards population, in the Dominion. Population, 1871, 285,594; population, 1882, 321,233.

In preparing an historical sketch of New Brunswick the publishers of the Gazetteer could hardly tell how to place it before the public, there being so many histories now in circulation. They, therefore, considered it best to describe each County separately in a condensed form, commencing in alphabetical order. Population, area, etc., will be found in the alphabetical order of names.

Albert County is bounded westerly by King's and St. John Counties, northerly and easterly by Westmorland County and the Petitcodiac River, and southerly by the Bay of Fundy, Hopewell being the shiretown. It is divided into six parishes—Hopewell, Hillsboro, Elgin, Coverdale, Harvey and Alma. The county is well watered, having about eighty miles of ship navigation. The soil is generally fertile, having large quantities of alluvial manures and good facilities for bringing them in use. There are about 5000 acres of marsh land, the minerals are coal, gypsum, limestone, grindstone, copper ore and manganese. There is a

large export of lumber and building stone. Large quantities of hay are produced from the marsh and intervale lands. The Albert Railway runs through a portion of the county.

Carleton County is bounded southerly by York Co., northerly by Victoria County and westerly by the State of Maine. It lies on the river St. John, Woodstock being the shire town, and is well watered by numerous streams running into the St. John, where several mills and factories are at work. Large deposits of iron ore abound; several railroads traverse different parts of the county; it is divided into eleven parishes: six on the western and five on the eastern side of the St. John; the roads are very good for travelling; it is an agricultural county, the soil being very fertile; large quantities of lumber are annually shipped; several mines of mineral are being worked successfully.

Charlotte County, on the south-westerly part of the Province, is bounded southerly by the Bay of Fundy, westerly by the State of Maine, northerly by York and Sunbury Counties, and easterly by Queens, Kings and St. John Counties, St. Andrews being the shire town. This county was among the first inhabited after the discovery of the Province. The parishes are St. Andrews, St. Patrick, St. George and St. David. It is not very fertile as an agricultural district, but its waters abound in fish, and large quantities are shipped annually. The principal fishing stations are the islands of Grand Manan, Deer and Campobello, and parts of St. George and Pennfield. Lumber is also shipped in large quantities. It lies on the borders of the United States, but the inhabitants of each country agree together very peacefully. There are several railways running through it.

Gloucester County is bounded easterly and southerly by Northumberland County, westerly by Restigouche County, and northerly by the Bay of Chaleurs, Bathurst being the shire town. The parishes are Bathurst, Beresford, New Brandon, Caraquet and Saumarez. It is largely inhabited by French. There are extensive mills, which produce large quantities of lumber. Several rivers run through this county,

and it is well watered. There are large quantities of fish shipped and it is noted for its salmon fisheries. The minerals are copper ore, manganese. Parts of the county are well adapted for agriculture, but the county principally lies on a bed of sandstone. The roads are very good. The Intercolonial Railway runs through it.

Kent County is bounded by the Gulf of St. Lawrence, the Bay Chaleurs and Northumberland County, Richibucto being the shire town. The parishes are Richibucto, Carleton, Dundas, Wellington, Weldford, Huskinson and Harcourt. The soil is generally light, but suits very well for agriculture. It is well watered by several fine streams. The population is about equally divided between the French and English. It formerly abounded with large quantities of timber, and still a great quantity of lumber is being shipped yearly. There are large quantities of marine deposits, which have proven to be of great service to the agricultural development of parts of the county. The Intercolonial Railway traverses it. Large quantities of fish are also shipped.

King's County is bounded north-easterly by Westmorland County, south-westerly by Charlotte County, Hampton being its shire town. The parishes are Kingston, Sussex, Hampton, Norton, Westfield, Springfield, Greenwich, Studholm and Upham. The Kennebecasis and St. John rivers run through the western portion of it. Geographically, it is favorably situated, and it is without doubt the best county for agricultural purposes in the Province. The mineral resources are iron, lead, gypsum, limestone and manganese, the latter being found in Sussex. There are several factories at different localities, also several mills, and large quantities of lumber are shipped. The salt springs in Sussex produce a fine quality of salt.

Northumberland County is bounded northerly by Restigouche and Gloucester Counties, easterly by the Gulf of St. Lawrence, southerly by Kent, Queens and Sunbury Counties, westerly by Carleton County, Newcastle being its shire town. The Miramichi River, only second in importance in the Province, runs through it and empties in the Miramichi harbor. This is a very fine river. The county is well

watered. Large quantities of lumber are shipped yearly, produced from several mills; but in 1825 the great fire terminated in destroying the largest portion of the timber. The parishes are Newcastle, Chatham, Ludlow, North Esk, Alnwick, Blissfield, Glenelg and Nelson. The Miramichi River is noted for its fisheries in salmon. There are large quantities shipped to the United States. There are numerous other streams, which abound with trout.

Queen's County is bounded northerly by Sunbury County, easterly by Kent and Westmorland, southerly by King's County, and westerly by Charlotte County, Gaagetown being the shire town. The parishes are Gaagetown, Canning, Wickham, Waterborough, Brunswick, Hamstead, Johnston, Petersville and Chipman. The St. John River divides one part of it, and the Washademoak and Grand Lakes the other part. It was settled among the first—if not the first—in the Province. There is a large quantity of timber sawed and lumber shipped. The St. John River is the largest and finest in the Province. It abounds with fish; navigable for a hundred miles, and at a still greater distance for small craft. The Western Extension Railway traverses part of it. Coal is found, but not in large quantities.

Restigouche County is bounded south-easterly by Gloucester County, south-westerly by wilderness, northerly by Bay Chaleurs and Restigouche County. It is the boundary between Quebec Province and New Brunswick. Dalhousie is the shire town. The parishes are Dalhousie, Ad-dington, Durham, Colborne and Eldon. It is well watered by several streams, the largest being the Restigouche River. It is a fine agricultural district, the upland being superior to any in the Province. There are large quantities of lumber shipped. Fish is abundant, more especially salmon; trout is found plentifully on the rivers and streams. The I. C. Railway runs through it. The public roads are in good condition.

Sunbury County is bounded south-easterly by Queen's County, north-westerly by York Co., Oronocto being the shire town. The parishes are Maugerville, Sheffield, Burton,

Lincoln and Blissville—Maugerville being the oldest settlement on the St. John River, which has its course through this county. The commission for holding a Court of Common Pleas is dated in 1770, but after the arrival of the Loyalists in 1783 the court was removed to St. John, and finally to Fredericton. It is a fine agricultural county. Several streams empty into the St. John River, which runs through it. Large quantities of timber and lumber are shipped from the county. It is the smallest of the fourteen counties.

St. John County is bounded northerly by King's County, westerly by Charlotte County, southerly by the Bay of Fundy, and easterly by Albert County. It is not adapted to agriculture. There is an abundance of lime stone. There are several mills and factories of different kinds, but its proximity to the City of St. John causes the largest proportion of these industries to be located within the City of St. John or the City of Portland.

Victoria County is bounded southerly by Carleton County, westerly by the State of Maine, northerly by the Province of Quebec and Restigouche County. The St. John River forms the northern boundary established by the Ashburton treaty, Grand Falls being the shire town. This town derives its name from the magnificent cataract found at this place. The county abounds in timber, and a large lumber trade is carried on. There are four parishes. It is the terminus of the present railway system. It is well watered, the principal river being the Tobique. The land is fertile and excellent for agricultural purposes.

Westmorland County is bounded westerly by Kings and Queens Counties, northerly by Kent County, and easterly by the Straits of Northumberland, Dorchester being the shire town. The parishes are Salisbury, Moncton, Shediac, Dorchester, Sackville, Westmoreland and Bathurst. It is well watered and contains the largest marsh in the Maritime Provinces, called the Tantamar Marsh, which supplies an immense quantity of hay. It is a fine agricultural county, and contains some deposits of minerals. It is partly inhabited by French. Westmorland Parish is one

of the oldest in the Province. There are some valuable stone quarries also in this county. The Petitcodiac is the largest river.

York County is bounded south-easterly by Sunbury County, south-westerly by Charlotte County, north-easterly by Northumberland County, Fredericton being its shire town. The parishes are Fredericton, St. Mary's, Douglas, Kingsclear, Queensbury, Prince William, Southampton and Dumfries. The St. John River passes through it. A large proportion of it is very hilly, still there are good districts well adapted for agricultural purposes. The shiretown is a beautiful city and the seat of Government for the Province. There are several streams that empty into the St. John in this county.

St. John City was named by the pioneers of French colonization, in 1604, in honor of their Patron Saint, on account of their landing on that particular Saint's day. The first choice must have appeared as an unseemly location to build a city, as it was a rocky peninsula of very uneven ground that sloped in opposite directions, which has caused a large amount of labor and expense to bring it to the state in which it now stands; but its foundation is sure and safe, as it is founded on a rock. It has grown so that the whole peninsula is laid out into streets and built upon, with the exception of here and there a vacant lot, made vacant by numerous fires—more especially by the great fire of June 20, 1877, which destroyed over one-half of the entire city, but it has been rapidly rebuilt, and only here and there an indication is left to show that a fire did originate. On the 18th of May, 1783, the Loyalists landed at Saint John, and in the following year the Province, under its present name, was separated from Nova Scotia. In 1785 the city was incorporated and Gabriel G. Ludlow was appointed the first Mayor. There was little or no progress made until after the landing of the Loyalists, but since that time the city has been constantly progressing. There are a number of very fine public buildings and private residences. The principal business formerly was shipbuilding and the shipping of lumber; but the former has not been carried on as extensively these few years on account of the demand for iron vessels, especially steamers. The lumber business is still prosecuted

vigorously. The effects of removing the restrictions upon trade by the Customs Department have stimulated the manufactories, and there is every prospect that St. John will be a manufacturing city. W. McCormick, proprietor, situated on Prince William street—where guests will have every convenience and good attention paid to all their requirements. There is no doubt but that the coming exhibition will be the largest ever held in this city, and thousands of persons will gather to see what progress St. John and the Provinces are making in arts, science, manufactures and agriculture. P. E. ISLAND.

In furnishing a brief sketch of Prince Edward Island, we shall not undertake to go far into details. In one respect this seems to be less requisite than in the case of the other Maritime Provinces; for, in the Island, the face of the country shows much less diversity in its natural features than that of the other Provinces. Doubtless Prince Edward Island is a beautiful country throughout almost its whole extent; but there is a great sameness in the characteristics of the scenery which meets the visitor's eye. As to those general characteristics,—it is an every where undulating country, its eminence very seldom breaking into cliffs, and never rising to the elevation of mountains; its lower lands never spreading out into broad expanses of interval, marsh or plain, such as are seen in the mainland Provinces; its shores are deeply indented upon every side with almost countless inlets from the Gulf of St. Lawrence, which ramify often in a bewildering manner among the hills; the lands clothed with a dense growth of timber; the soil almost everywhere exceedingly fertile, with scarcely a rock or stone to be found in the whole Island; such in general terms was Prince Edward Island in its natural condition. But, of course, the hand of the husbandman has largely modified this general description. The population of the Island is 108,890; it contains 2,133 square miles, and 1,365,400 acres. The inhabitants are almost wholly engaged in agricultural pursuits. Consequently a large proportion of

the arja of the country is in a high state of cultivation. It may here be mentioned that shipbuilding is pretty largely carried on,—not only at Charlottetown and Summerside, the principal towns, but at many of the smaller outports. The fisheries are prosecuted very extensively, Cascumpeque and Tignish are the most considerable fishing stations on the Island.

From having been one of the worst provided with public facilities for inland travelling of any of the Canadian Provinces, Prince Edward Island has suddenly become about the best. A few years since, the traveller making his way through the interior of the island would find it anything but a joke unless provided with a private vehicle. All is now changed. The Islanders having, in 1872, commenced railway construction, have done their work so thoroughly that but little more can be done in that way. A railway runs from Tignish, at almost the extreme northern point of the island to Georgetown—making, with Charlottetown Branch, one hundred and fifty-one miles—with a branch of forty miles from Mount Stewart to Souris, which is almost the extreme eastern point. Thus there are in all two hundred and nine miles.

As mentioned in a former part of this work, under the head of Nova Scotia, the Prince Edward Island Navigation Company's steamers run four times a week to Pictou vice versa, and in like manner twice a week to Hawkesbury, on the Strait of Canso. They also ply daily regularly between Charlottetown, Summerside and Shediac. By another line of steamers, locally known as the Phalen Line, there is regular communication with Hawkesbury, Halifax and Boston. The Quebec and Gulf Ports steamers, plying between Pictou, Quebec and intermediate ports, also touch at Charlottetown. These arrangements, it must be remembered, are in operation only during the season of open navigation in the Gulf. That means for from seven to eight months out of the twelve. During the remainder of the year, communication can only be effected by means of the "ice boats," which ply between Cape Tormentine and Cape Traverse, the narrowest part of the Strait of Northumberland. It is always an un-

comfortable and often an extremely perilous mode of transit.

As a field for sportsmen, Prince Edward Island cannot, in every respect, be recommended. Small game—that is woodland game—is still to be had, but not by any means abundantly. On the other hand, waterfowl are very abundant. The patient stalker of the web-footed families will find almost any one of the more secluded salt water inlets of this island a Paradise after his kind.

Owing to the conformation of Prince Edward Island, most of its streams above tide water are necessarily very short. Consequently there is not much variety of fresh water fish, properly so called; and of them—as trout for instance—they are for the most part small. Should the tourist have a fancy to fish his own oysters, there is no place in North America where he can do so more successfully than in Prince Edward Island; the ocean fishing trade is immense, and there are numerous lobster canning factories, and it is noted for its fine oyster beds, which produce some of the finest oysters to be found in any country in America.

Charlottetown can boast of one of the tidiest, best kept, and best supplied markets in the Dominion. The environs of Charlottetown afford some charming drives, presenting fine views of wood and water, and tastefully laid out and well kept private grounds. At the same time the East (Hillsborough), the North (York), and the West (Elliott) rivers, present great temptations and

facilities for boating and yachting.
