LEGISLATORS VERY BUSY.

THE OTTAWA HOUSE RUSHING BUSINESS THROUGH.

Provision will not take place until next week—Mr. John Macdonald's absence from the House to attend to the affairs of his estate.

OTTAWA, June 15.—When Sir John Macdonald appeared in the House to-day the long light between the Browns and the Grays came to an end. He had finally discarded his paper-and-ink compromise between the two factions and appeared in the seat of a member who was manufactured for him in London in 1880. They are of an unbecoming gray in color, and the coat is after the Newmarket species, with a wide white-over-the-shoulder stripe. Thus attired, and with the addition of the well-known necktie, the Old Chain looked as young as any of his constituents, and certainly seems to stand as far better than any other member of the House, for it is very hot here. The climate of Ottawa is torrid, with a tendency to leak out into a rash. Spout legislators like Dr. Montague and Alton W. Light are the best dressed as far as the House is concerned. All his limbs seek relief in light attire and linnens.
