CANADIAN GAZETTE ON THE ALLEGED CHEESE FRAUDS.
Based on Agriculture Urged to Analyze the Cheese and Dispose of the Rumors as Alleged Copyright Infringement—Lard Rosebery's Visit.

London, Sept. 11.—The papers here publish the official denial from Ottawa of the alleged adulteration of Canadian cheese.
The Canadian Gazette, in an article entitled "Hitting Below the Belt," states that the Board of Agriculture here adopt the North British Agricul-turist's suggestion and advise the Canadian cheese, so as to finally dis-pose of such charges, which, it says, are designed to ruin the cheese trade.

Agro-Canadian Trade.
The British exports to Canada in-creased 13 per cent. in August, as against the last year, and declined 7 per cent. in the month ending. The imports from Canada de-creased 2 and 3 per cent. during the eight months were: Cattle, £200,000; sheep, £200,000; wheat, \$2,000,000; eggs, £22,000; metals, £230,000. The decreases were: Cattle, £200,000; sheep, £200,000. The in-crease in cattle suggests that the em-bargo is not an unmitigated evil.

E. L. Newcombe, Deputy Minister of Justice of Canada, sails to-morrow for London. He says his conferences with the Government here have been confidential, and refuses to anticipate the report which is made to the Canadian Government. I learn, how-ever, that it is believed that the Government will reach an agreement with the London authors and pub-lishers, the Canadian Government will ample power to legislate. No ac-count will be sacrificed, but certain amend-ments to the Canadian Act are pro-posed to satisfy the London publishers, while doing full justice to the Canadian readers and pub-lishers.

Regarding Lord Rosebery's reported intention to visit Canada an early date may be expected. He has made a political engagement at Scarborough, Yorkshire, for early in October.

Newcombs Sails Thursday.
London, Sept. 11.—The Chronicle says that Mr. E. L. Newcombe, Deputy Minister of Justice, will sail for Canada Thursday, taking with him a copy of the Copyright Act which the Colonial Office has approved.

Mr. John Sall to Have Been Appointed on the Boundary Commission.
Winnipeg, Man., Sept. 11.—Sir John Sall, the retiring minister of Manitoba, has been appointed a member of the Alaska Boundary Com-mission. A commission will be ap-pointed by the United States Govern-ment and these two will name a third. Evidence will be taken at Ottawa, Washington, and in Alaska and Canada along the line.

POSED AS A GREEN GOODS MAN.
Ottawa, Sept. 11.—Edward Johnson, a farm hand from Metcalf, was charged before County Magistrate Dawson on counts of the theft of a quantity of goods under false pretences, and the second of stealing \$100 from Mrs. McCann of the same place. THE BRITISH ASSOCIATION.

The New York Central Makes a New Fast Train Record.
New York, Sept. 11.—An experiment- al train, consisting of the Grand Central Station, with the intention of covering the 141 miles between New York and Albany in 100 minutes. The only passengers on board are Vice-President Wilson of the New York Central Rail-road and seven invited guests. The cars were one baggage, one smoker, one dining, one parlor, and one engine. DEFENDER GETS THE RACE.

VALKYRIE FOULED THE YANKEE, THE COMMITTEE SAY.
And the Englishman Hasn't Even a Chance to Sail the Race Over Again—There Was a Miscalculation of the Distance Between the Boats—The Third Race to be Sailed To-day.

New York, Sept. 11.—Both Valkyrie and Defender were taken from Bay Ridge to the Erie Basin, at South Brooklyn, to-day, the fastest of the day's races. The English challenger went to the Basin to make a few necessary preparations for the third tri-cle of the series, which will be sailed to-morrow, a course 15 miles to wind-ward, or leeward, and return.

Several hours were spent taking evidence before the committee, and finally this letter was sent out: "We beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter yesterday, protesting Valkyrie. We have given the matter our careful consideration, and find that the foul occurred through the miscalculation of the distance between the two yachts at a critical moment. On our observations, sustained by that of others who were in a good position to see, we find that the Valkyrie, in contravention of section 2 of racing rule, bore down upon the Defender and fouled her by the swinging of her main boom, when luffing to clear the course. We also con-sider that Defender allowed Valkyrie sufficient room to windward to pass the committee boat, and our pro- test is, therefore, sustained."

In order to remove all doubt as to the effect of this decision, J. S. Oddie, secretary of the New York Yacht Club, announced that it awarded the race to the Defender without the necessity of its being re-sailed. Strong efforts were made by the committee to bring about a mutuality of judgment on the protest, but the committee only two things to do—to decide that Valkyrie fouled the Defender, and that the Defender was generally agreed here that the British yacht was at fault. Lord Dunraven and his friends held, how-ever, that his boat was crowded by the Defender, and that the accident was each side ample opportunity to state the case, and took the testimony of the captains of each yacht and of other witnesses who were on board.

The racing rule referred to is the fol-lowing: "A yacht shall not bear away out of her course so as to hinder another yacht in passing to leeward." Section 2 of the same rule says: "A yacht shall keep clear of one close hauled." The rule covering disqualification is: "If a yacht in consequence of her neglect of any of these rules shall foul another yacht or compel another yacht to tack, she shall be disqualified, or to run around, she shall be disquali-fied and shall pay all damages."

Lord Dunraven accepts the decision, and will have the Valkyrie at the line to-morrow for the third of the inter-national races. The Regatta Com-mittee posted the following notice at the house of the New York Yacht Club this evening: "Your committee beg to state that before arriving at a decision on the Defender's protest, they endeavored to bring about a mutual agreement be-tween the two yachts, but that, as the result of the protest, they have decided that the committee should pass judgment on the protest. (Sgd.) The Regatta Committee."

Lord Dunraven left the club house after hearing. He declined to talk. Messrs. Kersey, Glennie and Ratey of the English contingent were equal- ly reticent. After the long session of the Regatta Committee was ended, Irving Grinnell, one of the members of the committee, was asked if there was any question whether Lord Dun-raven would race to-morrow, in view of the published report that he would not do so if the decision should be adverse to the Valkyrie.

Mr. Grinnell, "he ac-cepted the decision as any true sports-man would. He did say, however, that he would not race unless the course was kept clear of excursion boats. Some of the English contingent were equal- ly reticent. After the long session of the Regatta Committee was ended, Irving Grinnell, one of the members of the committee, was asked if there was any question whether Lord Dun-raven would race to-morrow, in view of the published report that he would not do so if the decision should be adverse to the Valkyrie.

To-day's Race Will be 15 Miles to Windward and Return.

How Britain Wins the Yacht.
Glasgow, Sept. 11.—The Mail says: "The decision of the committee is sure to be challenged in the United States, but it is certain that all Americans who have the true interests of sport, will receive the verdict with disinterestedness. The committee declared the race void on account of a technical breach, few would dispute, but they disposed to call it a fair play in awarding the race to the Defender. This seriously handicaps the British yacht, and robs future races of all interest, as international contests. The Herald says: "The decision of the committee will cause bitter disap-pointment in this country. We cannot, however, much the fairness of the committee's decision, or question their right to award the race to the yacht which they declared was fouled by the actual victor. The only question is, whether it would not have been more sportinglike to have avoided the race altogether, and that is more a matter of opinion. We must, how-ever, accept the decision with the best possible grace."

World in its first leader on the subject, written before the decision, says: "Two races have been sailed. The Valkyrie lost one actually and the second virtually. Whatever may be the committee's verdict it is impossible to doubt that the American champion achieved a moral victory. This seems to be small comfort that Mr. Herreshoff has again designed a yacht that is exceedingly well adapted to the purpose for which it was built. Therein we must seek our consolation, for, were he not disappointed by having to design a vessel which, first of all, has to brave the Atlantic, it is more than likely that Mr. Watson would turn out a shell capable of turning the tables. The foul occurred before the starting gun was fired, and be-fore the line was crossed. The Def-ender might have backed out, but she elected to stand the trial. JUDGE FOURNIER RESIGNS.

CANADA'S PROMPT ANSWER TO THE CHEESE LIE.
Canadian Sealers Seized in Behring Sea—Hall Caine's Visit—Quebec Firm Seizing For Extras on a Government Contract—Prof. Robertson's Trip West—Advantage of the Canadian Canal.

Ottawa, Sept. 11.—There will be changes in the personnel of the Su-preme Court Judiciary within the next few weeks. The leave of absence granted in the spring to Mr. Justice Bourcier expired on the 1st instant, and it is currently reported to-day that he has now sent in his resignation, which will, of course, be accepted. His successor will be appointed before the autumnal court commences.

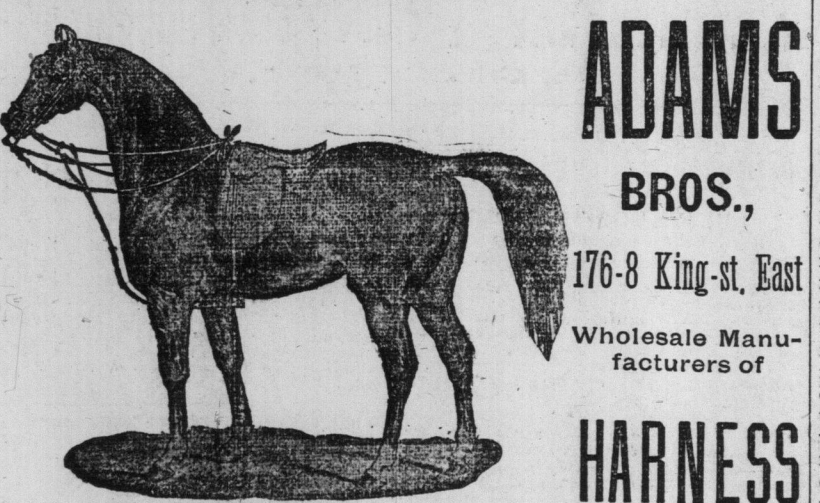

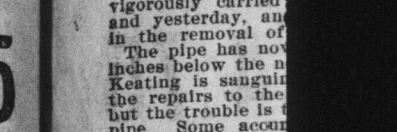

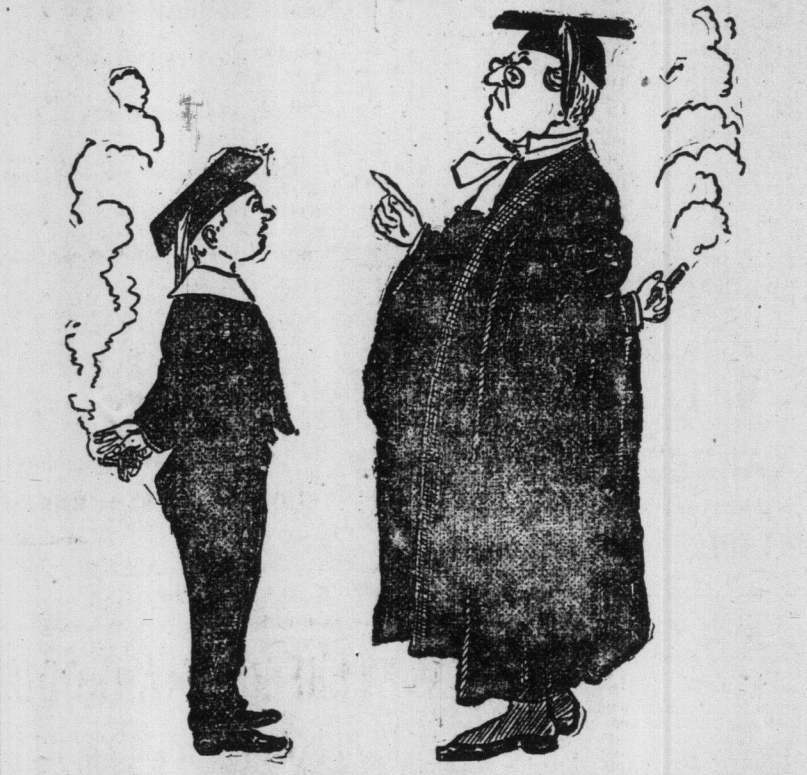
