## CONSTITUTION.

## PREAMBLE.

Wm, whose names are annexed, desirous of forming an Association to enable us more effectually to protect ourselves and others from the evils of intemperance, afford matual assistance, and elevate our characters, do pledge ourselves to be governed by the following Constitution and By-Laws.

## ARTICLE I.

name.
This Association shall be known as St. Lawrenoe Division, No. 16, of the Sons of Temperanoe, of the Province of Quebec, located in the City of Quebec.

## ARTICLE II.

- PLEDGR.

No member shall make, buy, sell, or use as a beverage, any Spirituous or Malt Liquore, Wine or Cider.

## ARTICLE III,

## membersbil.

Section 1.-Persons, fourteen years of age and upwards, possessing a character for integrity, and who have not been rejected by, or expelled from, any other Division within six months, shall be eligible to membership; but no member shall be allowed to vote in the Division who is under eighteen years of age. Provided that females shall not be admitted to menbership within the jurisdiction of Grand Division, unless permission be

Gret granted by a two-thirds vote of the Grand Division, nor in any subordinate Division, unless the Division by a two thirds vote will so decide, after two weeks' notice. And provided further, that members between the age of 14 and 18 may be allowed to vote by a By-Law of subordinate Divisions, permission having been first obtained from their Grand Division for enactment of such a By-Law.

VISITORS.
Section 2.-Divisions having decided so to do by a two-thirds vote, after two weeks' notice, may admit females fourteen years of age and upwards, as Visiturs, at such times, and under such regulations as may be prescribed by law, subject to the same form of proposition, investigation, and ballot, as in the case of members.

## ARTICLE IV.

OFFICERS.
Section 1.-The Officers shall consist of a Worthy Patriarch, Worthy Associate, Recording Scribe, Aseistant Recording Scribe, Financial Scribe, Treasurer, Claaplain, Conductor, Assistant Conductor, Inside Sentinel and Uutside Sentinel; all of whom shall be elected by ballot, which must be a written or printed ticket, every three monthe, viz., last regular meeting in September, December, March, and June, and installed, the first regular meeting in October, January, April and July.

Section 2.-Subordinete Divisions admitting Lady Visitors, may elect quarterly by ballot, at the time prescribed for election of other officers, a Lady Sentinel, Lady Conductor, and three Lady assistants. Lady Visitors shall be entitled to participate in the balloting.

Section 3.-No member ahall be eligitle to the offices of W. P., W. A., Treasurer, and Chaplain, who is under twenty-one years of age, except by dispeusation from the Grand Division: provided, that no person elevated to
the oftice of W. P. by such dispensation sliall be elected a representative to the Grand Division under twentyoone years of age.

Section 4:-Each officer shall perform the duties laid down in his otbligation and charge at installation, and such other duties as his Grand or Subordinate Division may require of him.

## ARTICLE V. <br> finanoe.

Section 1.-The minimuin amount to be paid for initiation fees, and dues or assessments, may be regulated by each Grand Division.

Section 2.-Thie question of payment of weekly benefits in cases of sickness, or funeral benefite, and the amount to be paid shall be regulated by each Division.

## ARTICLE VI. <br> OFFENCES.

Any member offending against the Constitution, Code, or By-Lawe, or who shall be convicted of crime by a judicial tribunal, or be guilty of any conduct unbecoming a Son of Temperance, sliall be fined, reprimanded, suspended, or expelled, as the law may prescribe, and the nature of the case require.

## ARTICLE VII.

oards, pass-words, geremonies, and regalia.
The Cards, Pass-words, Ceremonies, and Regalia, prescribed and established by the National Division shall be the ouly ones recognized or used by the Division.

ARTICLE VIII.
RESIGNATIONS AND WITHDRAWAIS.
Members can dissolve their connection with the Division or the Order only in such manner as may be prescribed by law.

## ARTICLE IX.

TARMS.
Regular Quarterly terms shall commence on the firat of October, January, April, and July. Members holding office at the close of the term shall be entitled to the full honors of the term.

## ARTICLE X. PROTESTS AND APPIALS.

Every member shall have the right to respectfully protest against the action of the Division, or appeal from its decision to the Grand Division, and through the Grand Division to the National Division. All decisions of the acting Boily shall, however, be and remain in force until reversed by the superior body in the case. No appeal shall be taken after one year from the date of the action appealed from.

## ARTICLE XI.

OHARTERS.
A proposition to surrender the Charter of a Division shall lie on the table at least four weeks, the members being duly notified; and the Charter shall not be surrendered as long as seven members will sustain the Division.

## ARTICLE XII.

## AMENDMENTS.

This Constitution may te altered and amended by a two-thirds vote of the National Division, to be taken by Grand Divisions, in regular annual session ; but By Laws which do not conflict with this Constitution, and the Code, or the established rules and usages of the Order, may be enacted by each Division.

## CODE OF LAWS.

## CHAPTER I.

NAME.
The name, number or location of a Divieion shall te designated, and may be changed by the Grand Division.

## CHAPTER II.

PLEDGE.
Sso. I.- The manufacture, sale and use of cider or wine, fermented or unfermented, or any kinil of spirituous or malt liquore, or any kind of intoxicating drinks as a beverage, whether enumerated in the pledge or not, is a violation of the eame; and the simple fact of the manufacture, sale or une of such drinks by a member, shall be prima facie evidence against such menber on trial for violation of the pledge, so as to devolve on the accused the necessity of proving that they were not manufactured, sold or nsed as a lieverage.

Sxo. 2.-A physician's certificate or prescription shall not necessarily relieve a memter from a charge for violation of the pledge, as the internal use of the liquors prohibited by the pledge is in no way provided for by our laws ; but the Subiordinate Division in the case, shall be the judge of any wantonness or collusion which nay appear in relation to the matter.

Scc. 3.-Any member who makes, buys or sells any of the liquors probibited by the pledge, to be used as a beverage, for the accommodation of a custonier, or friend, althqugh he may not design to make any profit thereon; or any member acting as salcsman in such liquors; as a boverage; or any, member buying or selling such
liquors, in any manner, as a beverage, or letting buildings for making, buying or selling such liquors, as a beverage, except an agent, or officer of the law acting cfficially, or an auctioneer required to sell by the terms of his license, violates the pleilge.

Sec. 4. -In a trial for violation of the pledge, or any other offence, it is the duty of the committee to notify the accused of the time and place of meeting for the triat, and a notice by mail after a ressonable time, is a legal and sufficient notice.

Seo. 5.-A Division shall have no right to require its members to take any. pledge other than that adopted by the National Division : neither shall it inflict any penalty for a violation of the pledge, except that laid down in the Conrtitution, or Code.

Sec. 6.-An acknowledgment, personally or in writing, by a member, of a violation of the pledge, is in accordance with the spuril of the Constitution.

## CHAPTER III.

## MEMBERS.

Scc. 1. - The Constitution provides the terms of eligibility to membership, and no Division shall have the right to enlarge or prescribe those terms, except that Division paying benefits may required a health qualification to detend them from imposition and lose.

Sec. 2-The uame of a candidate for admission must bf proposed by a member, in writing, stating age, residence and business, which must be entered on the record, and the subject referred to three members for investigation, who shall report in writing at chees next succeeding regular meeting, unless granted further time by the Division, when the cándidate shall the balloted for with ball ballots, and if a majority of white balls, and not more than four black balls appear, shall be declared elected; but if five or more black balls appear, shall be the triat, s a legal

rejected, and so declared. In cases where there is not a majority of white balls, and less than five black balls; the Division, on motion, may proceed to another ballot. A ballot for a candidate who has been rejected may be reconsidered, and the proposition may be withdrawn by a majority vote of the Division.

Scc. 3-A proposition for membership shall not be withdrawn, after it has been referred to a Committee for investigation, without the consent of a majority of the members present.

Seo. 4. -The name of a person constitutionally rejected, suspended, or expelled, shall not be published in any other manner than the usual notice to Divisions.

Sec. 5. -The character of a candidate for membership may be discussed in the Division any time after the report of the committee of investigation, and previous to the ballot being taken; but the ballot is a secret vote, and it is improper to call on any member for the reasons of his or her vote. The name to be balloted for should always be read openly to the Division.

Sec. 6.-Any action of a Division in reference to an individual proposed for membership therein, without his consent, is invalid and void; but any person having been proposed, after giving such consent, cannot; previous to election or rejection, he proposed in any other Division.

Sco. 7.-The name of any person applying for membership by deposit of card, shall be subject to the same proposition, investigation and ballot, as a new applicant.

Sko. 8.-On the admission of any member to the Division, by card, the Recording Scribe shall immediately notify the Division granting the card, of the fact.

Sec. 9.-A candidate may be proposed, balloted for, and initiated, at any regular meeting, by the unanimous consent of the members present.

Sec. 10.-A suspended member is under the control and juriediction of the Subordinate Division, and subject to their judgment, during such suspension:

## VISITORS.

Sec. 11.-Visitors shall not be entitled to participate in the special business deliberations of the Order, or vote, except to ballot on the admission of Visitors and for Lady Officers.

Sec. 12.-Visitors may propose persous for vieitors, assist in the ceremonies of introduction and initiation of visitors, and take part in exercises and discussions under the head of "the good of the Order."

Sec. 13.-The privileges of any or all visitors may be withdrawn or suspended for the time, or permanently, by a two-thirds vote of the Division.

Sec. 14.-No formal trial of a visitor shall be had unless demanded by herself, and the demand sustained by a majority vote of the members present ; and in case of trial, the mode for the trial of members shall be conformed to as near as may be.

## CHAPTER IV.

## ofrionks and honors

Sko. 1.-If a Division fails to elect or install its Officera at the tume named in Article IV., section I, of the Constitution, such election or installation may be had subsequently, by leave of the G. W. P. or his Deputy.

Sev. 2.-If a Division has no member constitutionally qualified or willing to accept the office of W. P., it shall be taken charge of by the G. W. P. or his Deputy, who shall preside over the saıne until the disability is removed.

Sed. S. - In case of the absence of the W. P. and W. A. of a Division, the senior P. W. P. present shall preside, which seniority shall be governed by the date of service as W. P.

Sec. 4.-A vacancy, occurring during the term, may be filled at any time by election and installation.

Sec. 5. -The seat of any ficer may be declared vacant for neglect of duty three successive meetings, by a majority vote, provided one week's notice is given in the Division, and three dars' notice given him personally, or by mail, by the R. S.

Sec. 6.-A member joining a Division by Card carries with him, and is entitled to, all his unforfeited honors.

Siso. 7.-A member losing his connection with the Order, by suspension, expulsion, or voluntary resignation, cannot claim any honors when he again connects himself with the Order; and any member acknowledging, or convicted of a violation of the pledge, shall forfeit all honors previously earned.

## CHAPTER V.

FINANOE.
Swc. 1.-The initiation fee, quarterly dues, assegsments or fines of any member, may be remitted by a vote of the Division

Sec. 2.-When a member is six months in arrears for dues, and the F. S. shall have duly notified the delinquent, end he fails to pay his dues for one month thereafter, the Division may, without oharge or trial, suspend him. Any member who has been suspended for more than six monthe, may bé admitted as a new member.

## CHAPTER VI.

 OFFENOES.Sig. 1.-Any member convicted of a crime by any judicial tribunal may be süspended or expelled by a vote of the Division, without any formal charge, notice, or trial.

Smo. 2.-If a member acknowledge a violation of the pledge, the W. P. shall declare forfeited all honors
previously earned by such meinber, and then proceed immediately to call for a ballot on the question of expulsion. If a majority ballot in favour, the W. P. slall declare the member expelled, and order the F. S. to erase the name from the books. If a majority do not ballot in favor of expulsion, the membership of the offender shall be retained, and no further action shall be taken, except that the offender sliall be re-obligated. Provided, that in case of failure to appear for re-obligation within thirty days after notification the vote may be rescinded, and the ballot again taken on the question of expulsion.

Sko. 3.-Any member of the Order who has good reason to believe that a member has violated the Pledge, proved false to any of the obligations of a Son of Temperance, or been guilty of conduct unbecoming a member of the Order, shall prefer a charge in writing, stating the nature of the offence, the time, place, and circumstances, as near as may be, of its commission.

Stev: 4.-When such a charge shall have been preferred, the W. P. shall appoint a committee of tive members, who shall as soon as practicable, summon the accused and witnesses pro and con, and investigate the matter.

Sec. 5.-The Committee shall organize by appointing a Chairman and Secretary ; and they may receive the testimony of those who are not members. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the proceedinge, with such testimony as may be presented ; which record shall be produced to the Division, on the call of any member, after the committee have reported.

Sxo. 6. -The Committee shall report the charge "sustained," or "not sustained," as is warranted by the evidence before them.

Sac. 7.-If the Committee report the charge "not" sustained," and the Division adopt the report, all further

Sxc. 8.-Upon a final hearing of the case in the Divieion, a ballot shall be had, when, if a majority vote against sustaining the charge, the case sha! he dismissed; if a majority vote in favour of sustaining the charge, the penalty shall te fixed by a vote of the Division, unless the law prescribes the penalty, in which case it shall be enforced by order of the W. P.

Sec. 9.-If the accused is found guilty of vollating the Pleige, the W. P., after declaring forteited all honors previously earned by such member, shall proceed to hallot as in section 2nd of this Chapter.

Sec. 10. - In cases of expulsion, the vote shall always be taken by ballot; and in no case shall a member be present when a vote or ballot is taken on his case, under this chapter, either thy the Committee or the Division

## CHAPTER VII.

UARDS, PASS*WORDS, OEREMONIES, AND REGAIIA.
Sec. 1 -Before a member shall be entitled to a Travelling Card, he must pay all dues in advance for the full time such Card is desired, not exceeding one year, and the fee for the Card.

Sxc. 2.-A member with a Travelling Card shall be allowed to visit on hie giving the Travelling Pass-word which was in use at the date of its issue.

Sec. 3.-A member shall not be entitled to a Withdrawal Card until the Division shall have voted the same, after payment of all dues and the fee for the Card; but after a vote has been passed granting a Card, the membership of the applicant shall be severed, and the Division shall have no right to reconsider such vote, or to with hold the Card from such member. A Subordinate

Divisıon cañnot refuse a Withdrawal Card to a nember having complied with all the provisions of our Laws. The Division shall have jurisdiction over the conduct of a member to whom such Card is granted, until he shall have become a member of another Division, and for sufficient cause may revoke the Card.

Sec. 4.-If a Subordinate Division surrenders or forfeits its Charter, or is suspended, the Grand Division having jurisdiction shall have the right to grant a Clearance Card to each of the members of the said Division making written application for the same, who may be deemed worthy by said Grand Division; and the said Card shall be of the same value as a Withdrawa! Card.

Sec. 5.-If a member in possession of a Clearance Curd shall he guilty of an offence, a charge shall be made to the G. W P., or his Deputy, who shall transfer the same to a Subordinate Division in the vicinty of the accused, for trial in the nsual form ; and in case of a conviction, the G. D. granting such Card shall be notified of the action.

Sec.6.-A meinber who has taken a Withdrawal or Clearance Card is not entitled to the Pass-word, nor can he claim a right to enter a Division

Sec. 7.-Visiting members not being able to give the Quarterly Pass-word may be almitted if vouched for, as prescrited in the B. B. ; but a Division ahall have the right to refuse admission to a visiting member who can work his way, upon theing satisfied that he has lost his menibership, or been irregularly adinitted, or has previous" ly deported himself improperly in the Division.

Skc. 8. - The Pass-word may be withbeld from a member against whom a charge has been preferred.

Sec. 9.-A W. P. may communicate the Quarterly or Travelling Pass-word to a travelling brother, when

Sec. 10.-Every member, during the session of the Division, shall he clothed in appropriate regalia, unless excused by a vote of the Division. The Representative to the G. D. and N. D. present, may wear the regalia of their respective bodies, unless they are serving.in some office, in which case they muet be clothed in the proper official regalia.

E EC. $^{\text {1 }}$ 11.-The mourning badge shall te hlack crape, and worn on the left arm. The official badges, and emblems, and staffs of office may be draped in mourning.

Sec. 12.- Portions of the ceremonies of initiation may he omitted by a two-thirds vote of the Division; provided that in no one case shall the obligations be dispensed with.

## CHAPTER. VIII.

RESIGNATIONS.
Swa. 1-A member may dissolve his connection with the Order by paying all demands against him on the books of the Division, and tendering his written resignation ; such resignation shall lie upon the table one week, when, if not withdrawn, the request shall be granted, unlese there be a charge preferred against him, or notice that such will be done at that or the following meeting.

Sec. 2.- A member who has resigned may be restored to membership by the usual ballot, without initiation, within three months, by re-signing the Constitution, and paying the initiation fee.

## CHAPTER IX.

## charteas.

Sec. 1. - If applicants for a Cbarter fail to present themselves for initiation within three months after the organization of the Division, their names shall be erased
from the Charter, and the first names signed to the Conatitution, after the Charter members, shall be inserted in place thereof, in case the conetitutional number is deficient.

Sec. 2. -The name of a regularly admitted member shall in no event be erased from the Charter.

Sko. 3.-At the opening of a, new Division, the ufficiating brother sliall be authorised to add to the number of the Charter members, at the request of the applicante, returning the names so added in his Repurt.

## RULES OF ORDER.

## DUTYES AND PRIVILEGES OF W. F .

Rule 3.-It shall be the duty of the W. P. to preserve order, and to endeavour to conduct all business before the Division to a apeedy and proper resull.
Rule 2.-He shall state every question properly present. ed to the Division, and before putting it to the vote shall ask - "In the Division ready for the question 9 " Should no member offer to speak, he shall rise to put it, and after he has risen, no member shall be permitted to speak upon it.

Rulv. 3.-The W. P. shall have a custing vote in case of a tie, but in ordinary he shall not vote. He shall an. nounce all votes and decisions. His decisions on points of order shall not be debatable, unless, entertaining doubts on the subject, he invite discussion.

Role 4.-He may speak to points of order in perference to other inembers of the Division, riving from his seat for that purpose; and shall decide questions of order subject to an appead to the Division, ty any two nyembers. which appeal shall always be in writing. On such an appeal no brother shall speak more than once.

Rula 5.-When an appeal is made from the decision of the W. P., he shall put the question thus-"Shall the decision of the chair be sustained ?"

Rule 6.-It shall be the duty of the presiding officer, and the privilege of any member of the Division, to call a member to order who violates an established rule of order.

MOTIONS.
Ruce 7.-A motion must be seconded, and afterwards
sepeated from the chair, or read aloud before it is debated. A motion shall be reduced to writing, on the request of any member.

Role 8.-All resolutions shall be submitted in writing.
Rule 9.-Any member having made a motion may withdraw it with leave of the seconder, before it is debated, but not afterwards, without leave of the Division.

Role 10.-A motion to amend an amendment shall be in order ; but to amend an amendment to an amendment, shall not be entertained.

Rule 11.-An amendment deatroying or altering the intention of a motion shall be in order; but an amendment relating to a different subject shall not be in order.

Rulw 12.-On an amendment to "strike out and insert," the paragraph to be amended shall first bo read as it stande, then the words proposed to be strnck out and those to be inserted, and finally the paragraph as it would stand, if so amended.

Rule 13.-On the call for a division on a question, the majority shall decide. The call can only be granted when the division called for will leave distinct and entire propositions.

DEBATES
Rule 14.-When a member speaks or offers a motion, he shall rise in his place, and, reapectfully addreesing the W. P., confine himeelf to the question under consideration, and avoid personality and uubecoming language.

Role 15.-When a member is called to order he shall take his seat until the point is determined.

Roles 16.-When two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the presiding officer shall decide who is entitled to the floor.

RoLs 17. - No member shall apeak more than twise, nor longer than ten minutes each time on any question,

Role 18.-While a member is speaking, no one shall interrupt him, except for the purpose of calling him to order, or aoking of the presiding officer leave to explain, or to call the previous question. A member allowed "s to explain" shall only have the right to explain on actual. misunderstanding of language, and shall be strictly prohibited from going into debate on the merits of the case.

Rule 19.-For any member to impeach the motives of a fellow-member, or treat him with personal disrespect, or pass between him and the ohair while be is apeaking, shall be deened a violation of order, which may incur the censure of the presiding officer, or of the Division.
-Role 20.-Should any member deem himself personally aggrieved by a decision of the Cbair, he may appeal from said decision.

Rule 2l.-Any convereation by whispering or otherwise, which is calculated to disturb a member while speaking, or hinder the transaction of business, shall bn deemed a violation of order, and if persisted in shall incur censure.

## paivilegrd questione.

Rule 22-When a question is before the Division, the only motions in order shall be-lst, to adjourn; 2nd, the previous question; 3rd, to lay on the table; 4th, to postpone indefinitely ; 5th, to postpone to a definite period ; 6th; to refer; 7th, to divide, if the sense will admit of it ; or, 8th, to amend-to take precedence as herein arranged, and the first three to be decided without debate.

RoLe 23.-When the previous question is moved and seeonded, it shall be put in this form-" Shall the main question be now put ?". If this be carried all further motions, amendments and debate shall be excluded; and the
gueation lie put without delay. If the question has been amended, the question shall be taken on theamendment firat ; if more than one amendment has been made, the last made amendinent in order ehall take precedence in the vote. It shall not be in order to reconsider the agreement to take the "previous question."

Rule 24. - When a motion is postponed indefinitely, it shall not come up again during the session.

## ADJOURNMENT.

Rule 25.-A motion to adjourn shall always be in order ; except, lst, when a meniber is in possession of the floor; 2 nd, while the yeas or nays are being called; 3rd, when the members are voting; $4 t h$, when the adjournment was the lart precering motion; or, Sth, when it has been decided that the previous question shall be taken.

Role 26.-A motion to adjourn simply, cannot be amended, but a motion to adjourn to a given time, may be and is open to debate.

## questions not debateable.

Role 27.-1, A motion to adjourn, when to adjourn simply; 2, a motion to lie on the table, when claiming privileges over another motion; 3, a motion to reconsider ; 4, a motion to read a paper ; 5, a motion to take up particular items of business ; 6 , questions of order, whilst the previous question is pending: 7, questions of order, when not appealed from the decision of the W. P., or not submitted by him to the Division.

## reading of papers.

Rul.e 28. -The reading of any paper called for, relating to the euliject under debate, shall always be in order.

Role 29.- When the presiding officer has commencel taking a vote, no further detaie or remark shall be admitted, unlesy a mistake has been made, in which case the mistake shall be rectified, and the presiding officer ohall recominence taking the vote.

Rule 30, -When the decision of any question is doutited, the presiding officer sliall direct the Conductor to count the votes in the affirmative and negative, and report the eame to him.

Roce 31.-The yeas and naya upon any question before the Division may be called for thy two members. and upon the assent of one-third of the members preaent, shall be so takell. They may be called for at any time before a peremptory decision of the vote by the chair.

Role 32.-In taken the yeas and nays, the R. S. shall call the roll and record the yeas and nays; after the roll is called, the result shall be read alond to certify mistaker, if any; after which the R. S. shall hand the vote to the W. P., who shall announce the same.

Rule 33.-In voting by yeas and nays, all present in regular standing in the Division must voie, unless excused by the Division, but no member shall vote who was not in the rooin at the time that the question was put. A motion to excuse shall be decided without debate.

## filiting blanke.

Rule 34.-When any blank is to be filled by the names of persons, a vote shall be taken on the names in the order of their nomination; but when a blank is to be filled by any sum of money or time proposed, the question shall bie first put on the largest sum of money and the most remote time.

## reconsideration and repeal.

Rule 35.-A question may be reconsidered at the meeting when it was decided, if reconsideration be moved and seconded by two memhers of the majority on the decision. A question may be re-considered at the next meeting after its decision, on motion of any two members; -provided that notice of such motion be given at the meeting when the question was taken. A vote rejecting a candidate may be reconeidered by motion of any member, at any period subsequent to the announcement
of the vote. The reconsideration of a question places it before the meeting. If reconsideration be not allowed by any action affecting the question, it remains as previously desided. No question shall be reconsidered more than once during the same quarterly terin, nor shall a vole to reconsider be reconsidered.

Rule 36.-A motion "to rescind" or repeal, shall not br received, except notice of the same has been given at least one week previously; such motion shall be submitted at the next meeting, and shall then have priority over other miecellaneous business.

The term "to rescind" has reference to resolutions not embodied in the constitution, by-laws, or rules. The term "to repeal" refers to the by-laws, or rules, or to resolutions intended to form part of these.
Repeal of any part of the Constitution can only be effected by the regular appeal ; but preparation for suoh appeal shall be conducted as questions of repeal of by laws.

## COMMITTEES AND THEIR REPORTS.

Rule 37.-The member first named in the appointment of a coinmittee shall be convener of the same, and shall call the committee together at such time and place as he may select; but when thus convened, the committee may elect its own chairman and secretary.

Rule 38.-All reports of committees, except reports of progress, shall be made in writing, and signed by a majority.
Rule 39.-When a majority report is followed by a report from the minority of a committee, the former, after being read, shall lie on the table until the latter is presented; after which, on motion, either may be considered.

Rule 40. - When a report has been read, it shall be considered as properly before the Division, without a motion to accept.

## BY-LAWS.

Role 1.-The order of business, as here arranged, may at any time or occasion be suspended, changed, or be dispensed with, by a special two-thirds vote of the Division.

Role 2.-During the reading of the mmutes, and continuance of the meeting, silence must be preserved, the officers and brothers retaining their respective seats, unless when necessary to leave them.

Role 3.-Every elected officer and brother shall be designated in debate or otherwise, by his proper office or title.

## ARTICLE I.

## MERTINGS.

Sec. 1.-The regular meetings of this Division shall take place every Monday evening; bat for special reasons a meeting may be adjourned to some other evening.

The W. P., or in his absence the W. A., or if neither be present, the Senior P. W. P. in attendance, sbali take the chair at half-past seven o'olock, precisely; from 1st Dec. to lst May, and at eight o'clock, precisely, during the remainder of the year.

Sec. 2.-Five members shall form a quorum.
Sec. 3.-This Division shall close its meetings at ten o'clock, unless an extension of time be moved, seconded, and passed prior to the hour named. But on no consideration shall a money vote of future expenditure be brought before the Division after 10 o'clock, but a money vote brought up before ten P. M. may be decided on after that bour, a week's notice of such money vote having been given.

Sec. 4.-The business of the Division shall be transacted in the following order:-

1. Opening of the Division by the W. P.
2. Calling the Roll of Officers.
3. Reading Minutes of previous meeting by R. S.
4. Ques.-Has any Member a friend to propose as a proper person to become a Meriber of this Division.
5. Reports of Investigating Committee.
6. Ballotting for Candidates.
7. Initiation of Candidates.
8. Reports of Visiting C'ommittee.
9. Ques.-Are any of the Members sick ?
10. Ques.-Have any present violated the pledge?

- 11. Ques.-Does any member know of a member who has violated the pledge?

12. Reports of Standing Conmitteer.
13. Reports of Special Cominittees.
14. Reception of Communications and Bills.
15. Have the Officers who absented themselves from last meeting any excuse to offer for such absence?
16. Payment of Dues.
17. Unfinished Business.
18. New Business.
19. What have you done for the good of the Order and the benefit of your fellow inen, since last we met? or have you any suggestion to make for the good of the Order, or anything to report?
20. Closing the Division.

## ARTICLE II.

fees and dues.
Sec. 1.-The initiation fee of the Division shall be sixty cents. The initiation fee and one quarter's dues in all cases shall be paid in advance.

Sed. 2.-The regular dues to the Division shall be fifty cents per quarter, payable on the first Regular

Meeting in each Quarter. Any member may, however, pay any number of months in advance.

Scc. 3.-Persons elected under eighteen years of age, and members joining by card, shall pay thirty-five cents initiation fee. The dues of minors under eighteen years of age and females, shall be twenty-five cents per quarter.

Seo. 4. - Any member three mont hs or more in arrears of dues, shall not be entitled to vote on any question, or at the election of Officers, until the same is paid in full. The quarter to be completed on the last regular meeting in Septembier, December, March and June, on the call for the payment of dues, and prior to the election of the officers.

## ARTICLE III.

## FIEES AND PENALTIRS.

Swc. 1.-It any member be convicted of felony, fraud, or any disgraceful crime, or be guilty of any conduct bringing disgrace or reproach upon the Order, if proof be made thereof, he shall be fined, suspended or expelled, as the Division may'direct.

Sec. 2.-Any member who shall in the Division make use of any protane or indecent language, or refuse to obey the commands of the W. P. when called to order, or use disrespectul expressions towards the officers or inembers, shall be subject to a fine, for each offence, not exceeding one dollar.

Sec. 3.-Any member who shall divulge the name of a brother who has voted against any person proposed to become a Son of Temperance, or misrepresent the discussions of the Division, so as to cause disturbance or angry feeling among the mombiers, or reveal private business done in this or any other Division, to a person not a Son of Temperance, shall be fined not less than fifty cents, suspended or expelled, as the Division may determine.

Sro. 4.-Any and all members violating the pledge, and retained, aball be re-obligated; and failing to appear within four weeka' notice of retention, to be re-obligated, shall the then considered expelled.

Seo. 5.-Any meintier not an officer, refusing or neglecting to obey the legal summons of the Division, or any cominittee appointed by the Division, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one dollar.

Sco. 6.-Any member found smoking in the Division roois or Ante-rooms; during, or immediately preceding the lours of business, shall be subjected to a fine noi exceeding fifty cente, for each and every offence.

## ARTICLE IV.

## nomination and election of ofhioers.

Sec. 1.-Nomination.-Officers shall be nominated at the meeting preceding, and on the night of the election; previous to its taking place; but no nomination shall be received anless the member be present and assent, or being absent, the Division shall be ratisfied of his acquiescence in the nomination.

Smo. 2.- Election.-The election of each officer shall be separately, and by written or printed ballots. At the appointed time of election, the R. S. shall read the names of the nominees for the office of W. P., and the members may then make further nominations for that office. The W. P. shall then announce the names of all the candidates. for the office, and appoint two tellers to assist the C. in scrutinizing the votes. The C., assisted by the tellere, shall then scrutinize the votes given, and report the state of the balloting to the W. P., who shall announce the result to the Division.

Seo. 3.- Votes.-The election of the other officers shall be conducted in the same manner as that of the W.P. A majority of the members present in the Division shall: be necersary to a choice, for all officere; but blapk ballota
and ballote for persons not properly in nomination, shall not be considered or counted as votes.

Sxo. 4. - No Choice. - If no choice be made at the first balloting, the second balloting shall be confined to the three highest candidates; and if no choice be then made, the third balloting shäll be confined to the two highest.

Seo. 6.-Installation. - No officer ahall be installed into bis office unless be is clear of all dues and demands against him, up to date, on the F. S.'s books.

- Sec. 6.-No member sball be elected a Representative to the Grand Division who is three months in arrears of dues.


## ARTICLE V.

## dutigs of opsioers.

Suc. 1. - The duties of the P. W. P. shall be discharged by the junior P. W. P. of the Division present.

Sec. 2.-It shall be the duty of the W. P. to preside in the Division, enforce a due observance of the Constitution and. By-Laws, and exact compliance with the rules and usages of the Order; to see that all Officers perform their respective duties; and appoint the following Com* mittees on the night of his installation, viz. :-

Investigating, Visiting, Auditing and Finance, naming the chairman for each ; ho shall appoint all special and other Committees during his term of Office; and give the casting vote on all matters before the Divirion, when a tie may occur; inspect and announce the resuit of all balloting or other votes; direct the R. S. to call special meetinge, when application shall the made in writing by five or more members of the Division ; draw upon the Treasurer for all sums necessary to pay appropriations made by the Division; receive the bonds of the Trustees and Treasurer, and hold the same in trust for the Division. He shall, in case of sicknese, if necessary, on report of the Visiting Committee, appoint two members to act as watchers over menbers or transient brethern.

He shall on the night lie vacates the chair, see that the quarterly returus are prepared, and per-capita tax appropriated for the Grand Division. He shall perform such other duties as the Division or his Charge shall require.

Sxio. 3.-It shall be the duty of the W. A. to render the W. P. such assistance as he may require of him, and in the absence of the W. P. shall perform his duties.

Sxc. 4.-The R. S. shall keep a fair and impartial record of the proceedings of the Division, and any alterations made shall be placed in the margin of the Minute Book; and the whole, atter approval by the Division, shall be certified by the W. P.; or presiding officer for the time being. He shall write communications, notify all subordinate Divisions not more than ten miles off its place of meeting, within four weeks after, of the name, occupation and residence of every person rejected, suspended or expelled from this Division. He shall also keep a black book, to record therein the namee and residence of all persons rejected, suspended, or expelled from this Division, with the dates and causes of rejection, suspension or expulsion, and also the names of parties reported from other Divisions as rejected, suspended, or expelled. He shall, upon the election of any person as member of this Division, forthwith give written notice thereof to the individual so elected, and such election shall stand good for six weeks and no Ionger, unless the (Candidate is unavoidably absent from town, disubled by sickness, or give a satisfactory reason. He shall fill up certificates, notify meetings when ordered by the W. P., attest to all monies ordered to be paid at a regular meeting, and none other. He shall make out at the end of his term the quarterly returns to the Grand Division, and perform such other duties as may be required of him by the Division or his Charge, and deliver up to his successor, within one week from the expiration of his
term of office, all thooke, papers; or other property in his possession belonging to the Division.

Sme. 5.-The A. R. S. shall be aid to the R. S., under whose direction he shall act, and render him such assistance in the performance of his duty as he or the Division tway require.

Sro. 6.-It shall be the duty of the F. S. to keep just and true accounts between the Division and its members; when a Candidate is almitted for initiation, he shall receive frum him, in the ante-room, his initiation fee, and first quarter's dues ; credit the amounts paid and pas the same over to the Treasurer immediately, taking his receipt. He shall just previous to the close of his term, notify every member who is three months or more in arrears, of the amount due by him to the Division; at the end of his term he shall make out for the Division a full report, and furnish the R. S. ivith the amount of receipts for initiation fees and dues during the term, and any other information connected with bis office, necersary to enable thie R. S. to prepare correct returns for the Grand Division. He shall perform such other duties as the Division and his charge shall require of him, and deliver up to his successor all matters appertaining to his office in his possecsion.

Sxc. 7.-The Treasurer, prior to his installation in office, shall give a Bond to the W. P., in the sum of forty dollare, with two sursties for the payment of the amount, to be approved of thy the Division, and for the faithful performance of his duty as Treasurer.

It chall be lis duty to pay all orders drawn on him by the W. P., attesied by the R. S., and none other. He shall receive all monies of the Division, and hold the same until the expiration of his term, unless the sum exceed twenty dollars, the excess of which he shall pay over to the Trusteen, receiving a receipt for every payment. He shall keep a full and correct account of all
monies received and expended. He whall give the Divseion a monthly statement of the funils, and at the expiration of his term, a statement for the quarter, and deliver up, when legally called upon, all monies, books, papers, and other property of the Division, to his successur in office, or to whom the Division may specially appoint. He shall perform such other duties as may le required of hins by the Division and his Charge.
sec. 8. Chaplain. - It shall be the duty of the Chäplain, previous to the Division proceeding to business, to read a portion of Scripture, and repeat the Lord's Prayer ; perform that part of the initiation Service ad is appropriated to him; and perform such duties as may properly be expected of hinn by the Division.

Sac 9.-It shall be the duty of the Conductor to introduce for initiation persons previously elected. He shall also introduce visitors, and furnish them with suitable regalia. He shall, with the aid of the $\mathbf{A}$ C., examine those present at the opening of the Division. He shall see that the Otficers' Regalia are in their proper places at the opening of the Division, as also the Otficers' Cards for the initiation ceremony, and collect the same at the close. He shall have cliarge of such property of the Division as may not be otherwise provided for, and render a full report to the Division at the end of his term.

Sec. 10. - It shall he the duty of the A.C. to render such services as the C. or the Division may require of him.

Sec. 11. - It shall be the duty of the I. S. to attend the inner door;-to admit none unless members of the Order, and candidates for initiation.

Sec. 12.-The O. S, ahall guard the outer door, and keep off intruders; require the members at once to enter the Division, and not to congregate in the ante-room.

> Sea. 13.-The Officets shall attend every regolar
meeting; and when duly notified, every apecial uneoting; they shall be present at the call of the Roll of icers by the F. S.

Scc. 14.-The seat of any Officer may be declured vacant for absence at three uuccessive mettinge, by a twothirds vote of members present at any regular ineeting, after one week's nutice bas been given.

Sec. 15.-No Otticer shiall leave his post during the meetings of the Divsion, without leave first obtained from the W. P.

## ARTICLE VI.

TRUSTEES.
Ssc. 1.-Three Trustees shall be elected annually, at the first regular meeting iu January, by a majority of votee; they shall perform the following duties :

Lat. Invest, or pay, as the Division may decide at a regular meeting, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, all monies which they may from tume to time receive from the Treasurer ; -the fact of which investment or payment shall be communicuted to the Division, in writing, at the isext regular meeting.

2nd. Keep a book, in which shall be entered full particulars of all investmente made-together with the amount of interest drawn on each investment; which book, together with any money then in hund, vauchers, \&c., shall be submitted to the Auditing Committee, quarterly, for examination.

Srd. On the next regular night of meeting after receipt thereof, pay over to the F.S. any sum or sums which they may receive from time to time as interest on capital invested by the Division,

Sec. 2.-The said Trnstees, previous to entering upan their duties, shall give a joint and neveral Bond to the Division, in such sums as the Division may from time to time require, with two sureties, to be approved by the Division, for the faithful performance of their duties.

Sev. 3.--Neither the W. P., W. A., R. S., F. S., or T., shall be tligible to serve as Trustees.

Ssc. 4.-Thy funde of this Division shall not be appropriated for any purpose, ezcept incidertal expenses, and the furtherance of the cause of Temperance, and then only ly a voie of twoothirde of the inembers present; provided, however, that if a committee appointed by the W. P. should recommend a sum of money for a brother, or the family of a deceased brother, in distreas, such an appropriation may be made by a two-thirids vote of the Division. No appropriation of money for, any other purpose, shall be granted, unless a proposal in writing be presented to the Division at least two regular meetings previous, when if an unanimous vote of the members present is given in favour of the motion, it shall be granted.

Ste. 5. - No appropriation for any purpose save such as are provided for in the preceding section, shall be made unless there shall remain, alter such approprintion, a sum in the Treasurer's hands of not lessthan ten dollars.

Seo. 6.-For neglect of duty a Trustee may be removed from office, by a motion which has laid on the table one week, and which has been sanctioned by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

Seo. 7.-Upon the removal of a Trustee, another shall be appointed in his place, giving the stated tonds.

## ARTICLE VII.

DITIES OF COMMITYEES AND WATCHERS.
Sec 1.-The Investigating Committee, consisting of three memtiers, shall examine the Black Book; carefully ascertain the age, health, professioli, and general cliaracter of the Candidates for membership; and make a faithful report.

Sec. 2.-The visiting Committee shall consiat of three members, together with the W. P., W. A., R. S., and
T., at least three of whom, when directed by the W. P., shall vist every sick member who does not reside more than three miles from the Division Room, within twentyfour hours after notice is given of his illnese; report his case to the Division, and continue to render him such assistance as the By-Laws require; and, when necessary, request the W. $P$. to appoint watchers.

Szo. 3.-The Auditing and Finance Committee, consisting of three members, shall superintend the expenditure, examine the bills against the Division, and shall examine the accounts of the F. S., 'T., and Trustees, for the previous quarter; and report within three weeks.

Sec. 4.-Committees' Reports shall be written and signed by Majorities ; Minority Reports shall also be received.

Smo. 5. - If a vacancy occur in a Committee, it shall be supplied by nomination of the W. P.

Seo. 6. - Watchers, when appointed, shall atteid the sick member, either personally or by substitute; unless the sickness be contagious or infectious; in which case the visiting. Committeo shall, if requisite, provide a Nurse, who shall be paid by the Division.

## ARTICLE VIII.

## DUTIES OF MBMBERS.

Swo. 1.-Every member shall pledge himself, at his initiation, to support the Constitution and By-Laws, by subscribing his name to them-stating at the same fime his place of residence.

It is particularly enjoined that the members of this Division appear early in their places, when practicable; properly clothed, as becometh Sons of Temperance; and that they treat all members of the Order with courtesy and respect; that all discussions be conducted in a spirit of candour and moderation, and that all personal allusions and sarcastic language, by which a member may be in-
jured, be carefully avoided,-that in "Liove, Purity and Fidelity," we may cherioh and preserve the moat
prominent objecte of our Order,-Temperance and Benóvolence.

Sxo. 2.-Every member, niot absent at sea, or in some diatant place, whose dues and fines remain unpaid for gix monthe, ohall be served with a notice by the F. S., if practicable; after notice, if a further period of four weeks elapse without his accounts being settled, he shall become liable to suspension or expuleion, in accordance with chapter 5, Code of Laws.

Seo. 3.-A suspended member, when reinstated, shall pay all arrears of dues, or a new initiation lee, as the Division shall decide.

Sso. interfer of this the W.

Sro. politica Diviaio

Sco. majorit does no Constit Divisior thereto,
Sko. 4.-A member acknowledging the violation of Art. II., Constitution, and reinstated, shall pay all arrears of dues and fines against him to the financial scribe before entering the Division room for reobligation, as in case of initiation into the Order.

Sac. 5. -When a member claime a Withdrawal Card at a regular meeting, it shall be granted after payment of all monies due by him to the Division; and the further sum of thirteen cents for such Card-in accordance with provisions of chapter 7, Code of Laws.

## ARTICLE IX.

## FUNERALS.

In the event of the death of a member, unless his relatives object, the W. P. shall direct the R.S. to invite the inembers of this and other Divisions to neet at the Division Room, or the member's residence, (if the disease of which he died be not contagious) at least half an hour prior to the time, and attend the funeral in a body ; each member wearing black crape on the left arm.

## ARTICLE X.

## DEBATEE, DISCURHIONS AND REHOLUTIONE.

Sxo. 1.-No member of any other Divition shall interfere or be heard in any debate, in any of the meetinge of this Division, without frst obtaining permission from the W. P.

Sro. 2.-No subject of a sectarian, religious, or political nature, shall be introduced for discuesion in this Division.

Sxc. 3.-All resolutions carried by a vote of the majority of the Division, (provided that such resolution does not conflict with any of the provisione of the Constitution and Code of Lawe), shall be binding on the Division; and if any member refuse to yield obedience thereto, he shall be subject to a fine of fifty cents.

## ARTICLE XI.

bleotions.
Sro. 1.-In ballotting, the ballot-box shall be placed in fuil view of the W. P., and shall be examined by him and the W. A.

Smo. 2.-In ballotting for officere, "which shall be with written or printed ballots," every member in good standing shall be entitled to one vote. A majority of all the members present shall be necessary to constitute a choice. In case of a tie, the balloteing shall continue until a choice is made. The name of the member receiving the lowest number of votes at each ballouting shall be withdrawn.

## ARTICLE XII.

VIGLLANOS COMMITTEE.
It shall be the duty of the W. P., as early as possible after his installation into office, each term, to appoint five membere, who ohall be denominated a Vigilance Committee, whose duty it shall be to visit all persons who may be reported to them, at any Regular Meeting
of the Division, as suffering from the evil effects of intemperance, and who, in the opinion of those reporting, may, on a fair representation of the benefits of our Order, be induced to abandon their evil ways and join our ranks. It shall also be the duty of this Committee to make suggestions from time to time for the benefit of the members, and attend to the getting up of Temperance Lectures, Soirees or Pic-Nic parties, (unless the Division see fit to appoint special Committees to carry out any of the above enumerated objects) ; and attend to all other matters and things that may be considered necessary or calculated to advance the principles of Love, Purity, and Fidelity.

## ARTICLE XIII.

GOOD STANDING.
Good Standing in this Division shall be understood to mean, a member not under charge or suspension, and not indebted to the Division for dues and fines to the amount of fifty cents. All dues to be paid before getting the quarterly password.

## ARTICLE XIV.

## AMENDMENTS.

No part of these By-laws shall be replaced, annull, or altered, nnless a proposal in writing be presented to the Division at least two regular meetings previous to the discussion; when, if two-thirds of the members present vote in favor of the motion, it shall be adopted. To meet a peculiar case, however, any By-law may be superseded by a unanimous vote for that meeting.
