Iowa's Big Crop. Firm Iowa returns show wheat crop 22,000,000 bushels, which is 6,000,000 more than the Washington estimate.

Manitoba Estimate. The final agricultural report of Manitoba shows the total yield of wheat at 25,312,745 bushels, as compared with 18,261,850 bushels last year.
