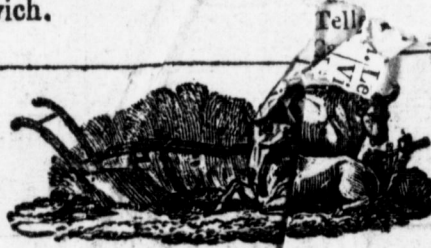

### EXPLANATION.

In the following Calendar, the times of the Sun's rising and setting are the times shown by a correct time-piece when the sun is in the horizon. The column marked Sun south, are the times shown by a correct time piece when the centre of the sun is on the meridian, or in other words, when it is noon by a correct noon mark, or dial. For example when it is noon by the Sun on the first day of January, it would be four minutes after twelve o'clock by the time-piece. The other matters are so plain as to need no explanation.

### ECLIPSES OF THE SUN AND MOON.

There will be four eclipses in 1850, two of the sun and two of the moon.

I. The first will be a partial eclipse of the moon on the 17th day of February, invisible at 8h. 59m morning.

II. The second is an annular eclipse of the sun, on the 3d of March; at 11h. 11m. evening. This eclipse will not be visible in America, but will be seen from the whole of Asia. The path of the central and annular eclipse first touches the earth in the Indian ocean a little east of the Strait of Babelmandel—takes an easterly course, crosses the southern part of Hindoostan, and the bay of Bengal—Thence, taking a north-easterly course, passes over China, Chinese Tartary and terminates near Greising's Strait.

IV. The fourth will be a total eclipse of the sun in the morning of the 27th day of August ; ☉ at 1h. 50m. morning. This eclipse will be invisible in America. but may be seen from the southern and eastern parts of Africa, the Indian ocean and New Holland. The path of the central and total eclipse will begin on the eastern coast of Africa, pass across the continent in an easterly direction cross Madagascar and the Indian Ocean and terminates at some distance south of New Holland.
