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SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

The Council begs to submit its report of the condition and the past year's experience of the Association.

To understand the financial condition of the Association it is necessary to remember the changes that were made two years ago, when both entrance fees and sighting shots were done away with in the hope of bettering the attendance at the annual competition. The immediate effect of this step was a falling off in the yearly receipts to the amount of about \$200. At that time the association was carrying a balance of something like \$300, and so it was enabled to offer the usual prize list, notwithstanding the loss of the entrance fees. This year, however, when the Executive Committee came to prepare the programme for the annual matches they found that either the prize list would have to be curtailed or else some provision made to secure larger receipts, and they deemed it more advisable to meet the difficulty by a partial resort to entrance fees, and by again charging for sighting shots. Thus it comes that at the end of the present year there is but a balance of \$22 to the credit of the Association.

In view of the expressed approbation of the competitors at last year's matches the Council felt that the same prize list should be once more framed and given a further test. The last week in August was selected for the holding of the matches, and on the opening day, Tuesday, the 21st, some eighty members presented themselves as competitors. It was the Association's good fortune to have fine weather during the four days which the matches occupied, though the shooting conditions, by reason of strong variable winds were far more difficult than they usually are on the Stockton range. This fact must be borne in mind when comparing the winning scores of 1883 with those of previous years.

Except as regards attendance, the meeting was a satisfactory one, but although the same distribution of the prize money was retained, and the expense of competing added to but very slightly, there was nevertheless no increase, but rather a falling off in the number of competitors; and there was noticeable among those who were present a lack of that enthusiasm which we are wont to see at our annual meeting.

The Council presents these facts to the members in order to direct their earnest consideration to the question of attendance. The hopes that were formed of the extended prize list have not been realized; the effect upon the finances of the Association has been such that, as regards entrance fees, the system of 1880 will have to be again introduced. It may be well to consider whether the possibility of winning good prizes will not after all be a greater inducement to both young and old shots than the certainty of winning small ones, and whether it is not better to secure a keen competition among those who will attend, even though there be no exclusive encouragement afforded to beginners. The difficulty is not that there are only a few riflemen in the Province, for all the County Association Matches are well attended. If but the half of these were to attend the Provincial Meeting there would no longer be reason for the Association to be dissatisfied with the number.

It cannot be said that the prizes are won by the same men, and that young shots have no chance, for every year some of these young shots come well up in the matches. The old shots will of course in the end come to the front, and it is right that they should do so. Their very success should stimulate the beginner, and it is certainly as much the work of the Association to produce good marksmen as to bring forward new ones.

In the death of the Hon. William Elder, this Association, like every other institution with which that gentleman was connected, has sustained a most severe loss. His interest in the Association ever produced the most direct benefits, whether he manifested it in his private capacity, as proprietor of the Daily Telegraph, or as Provincial Secretary. The sense of the Association's obligation to him was fittingly shewn in the resolution of the competitors, by which his Cup is made a Challenge Prize in the match which he himself inaugurated, and of which the effect will be to perpetuate his name and memory at all future meetings of the Association.

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The Association can congratulate itself upon the shooting of its representatives at the Dominion Matches. A victory in the Provincial Match is the greatest success that it could hope for, and that gained, the Council with pride records it here, in the Annual Report; the more so, as it is New Brunswick's first. Of the six who qualified for the final match, three shot themselves into probable places on the Wimbledon Team. The Council is of the opinion that so long as the Association is enabled, through the assistance of the Provincial Government, to provide for the Ottawa Team, there is being furnished the very best kind of inducement to our riflemen to make themselves To hold a place on the Ottawa team and to go as the representative of the Province should be the desire of every man who is present at Sussex, just as a place on the Wimbledon team is the honourable aim of all who participate in the Dominion Matches. success as has befallen the teams of the last two years is an ample return for the expense which the sending of the team involves, and it places the Association in the best possible position for securing a continuance of the grant.

OTTAWA TEAM REPORT.

SAINT JOHN, Sept. 29th, 1883.

SIR,—My last duty as Captain of the Ottawa Team is to furnish the Association with a report and with a return of our successes at the Dominion matches.

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In the Return will be found the names of the winners in each match, the prizes and the scores. In explanation of these latter it should be stated that both wind and weather were, throughout the week very unfavourable and greatly increased the shooting difficulties which naturally belong to Rideau shooting.

The present arrangement by which the Provincial Government Grant is shared by a team of twenty, seems fully to effect the intention of the Association. The division just sufficed to pay each man's expenses to Ottawa and cover his entrance fees in the regular matches. Thus the Province was represented by as many men as the grant would properly provide for.

Going as we do a representative team from a Provincial Association, the success that is most to be welcomed is that gained in representative matches; and, in a lesser degree, the winning of such individual prizes as reflect credit upon the Province. Perhaps the very mission of the Ottawa team is to place a New Brunswick Eight in competition for the London Merchants' Cup, and to see that the Province has its due number in the Wimbledon Twenty.

The efforts of the team in those two directions were more than usually successful. Two members were so fortunate as to gain the right to positions on the Wimbledon team, and a third stands so high among the waiting men that he will in all likelihood be called upon to go; whilst in the Provincial match a long sought victory was scored for the New Brunswick Eight. I cannot say more of the match than that it was hurriedly shot through in heavy wind and rain, and only at the close did we know at all of the relative positions of the teams. The chief individual success was that of Lieut. Perkins who, shooting through a double tie, won the valuable prize which goes to the third highest in the Governor General's Match. He and Sergeant Langstroth, in the same competition, won Lorne Badges, of which ten only are offered. Six of the team were in the Grand Aggregate, and therefore in the Governor General's Fifty.

The feature of the meeting was the presentation of the principal prizes in the Senate Chamber, by H. R. H. the Princess Louise. The London Merchants' Cup, then received by the New Brunswick Eight, I have now to deliver into the custody of the Association.

It may surely be hoped that recent experiences will not fail to have a good effect upon the riflemen of the Province. The chief team and the chief individual prizes have, in the past two years, been won by them. They have no longer any reason or any excuse for thinking their chances of doing well on Rideau range to be hopeless, with the record of such success before them. Every rifleman should look forward hopefully to being a competitor in that wider field of the Dominion meeting through which alone lies the road to Wimbledon.
