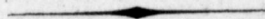

## STATEMENT BY THE SESSION.

---

The Session feel bound, in presenting a brief Annual Statement, to express their gratitude to the Great Head of The Church, for all the way the Lord hath led us during the past year. Peace has been within our walls and prosperity within our palaces.

The Attendance upon the Public Worship of God has been very satisfactory. The various organizations of the Congregation for Christian work have been carried on with an encouraging degree of life and interest. The liberality of our people in giving for the extension of Christ's Kingdom is gradually and steadily increasing. It is hoped, that in this particular, our beloved congregation will, before long, be a praise in the whole Church.

The Elders, with the view of securing correct Congregational Statistics, have, lately, made a thorough visitation of their respective districts. After a very careful revision of the reports given in by them, the summing up of the whole yields the following results: families, 345; single persons not connected with families, 112; communicants, 573. The first two of these items may be relied upon as correct. The number of communicants given is only a pretty correct approximation. There are at least 573 communicants; but some 30 or 40 may have been unavoidably overlooked.

During the year 1880, the members removed from the roll, have been, by death 8; by change of residence, 20. In the same period the number added has been 91. These figures for the year just closed are included in the general statistics aforementioned.

It may be interesting to state that during the five years of the present Pastorate, there have been added to the roll 480 names,—removed, 138; number of baptisms, 263; deaths, 93.

The Managing Committee, in submitting their Annual Report, desire to acknowledge their thankfulness to God for the state of prosperity which, under His blessing, the congregation has attained, for the renewed health of their esteemed Pastor, and they, with the congregation, desire to express their heartfelt sympathy at his recent family affliction, and trust that Mrs. Murray and he will receive that comfort in their bereavement which can alone be received by a close communion with God.

Your Committee notice with regret the condition into which the Cemetery had been allowed to fall, and this summer secured the services of an efficient man, and by this means it has been greatly improved.

The thanks of the congregation are due to the Choir for their increased efficiency in the service of praise.

The Church has been altered so as to increase its sitting capacity, and the place for the Choir improved, which incurred an expenditure of \$310.27 ; and the grounds have been kept in proper condition by the introduction of the Waterworks.

The Accounts of the Secretary-Treasurer are herewith submitted in detail, shewing the receipts and expenditure for the year ending 31st December, 1880, from which it will be seen,

- 1st.—The ordinary revenue amounted to - \$4,213.11  
being an increase over 1879 of \$260.31.
- 2nd.—The Sabbath Collections amounted to 1,915.83  
being an increase over 1879 of \$39.18.
- 3rd.—The revenue from Pew Rents amounted to \$2,297.28  
being an increase over 1879 of \$221.13.

The Committee would urge on those whom Providence has blessed, that an increase in their voluntary contributions to the church would be becoming and is necessary, from the fact that the sum of \$500 was borrowed during the past year in order to meet the current expenses and improvements of the congregation.

The Managers whose term of office expires are, Donald Fraser, Donald McDonald, David Denham and Alexander Tytler, who are eligible for re-election.

# ANNUAL REPORT

—OF—

## ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH SABBATH SCHOOL

FOR 1880.

---

The Annual Meeting of the Office-bearers and Teachers was held on the evening of January 10th, 1881.

Although the year just closed has not been marked by any special events in connection with the School, the Teachers feel encouraged to prosecute the work, believing that the good seed sown from week to week has borne more or less fruit, restraining the children from sin, and leading them into the love and service of God.

The "International Series" of Lessons,—that part containing the interesting history of Joseph and his brethren, which we have just concluded, must have had a beneficial effect in directing the youthful mind into a confiding trust in that mysterious Divine Providence that so guided the patriarchs of old.

The total number of children on the roll is 215,—average attendance, 177. The average attendance, as reported last year, was 227, whereas it should have been about 185 or 190. This mistake appears to have occurred from including the Office-bearers and Teachers with the scholars. This correction makes the decrease this year about 13—a decrease, we think, chiefly owing to the unusual number of scholars that have passed from the School into the Bible-class.

The Infant-class is in a most flourishing state, the average attendance being 45, and the order good. This gratifying progress is due to their faithful teacher, Mr. Freeland.

The Library having been closed last year, we introduced in place of it a variety of reading matter in the the shape of Sabbath School papers. Though these were perused with much interest, still they did not seem to fully supply the place of a Library.

We are happy to state that a Library of about 350 volumes, beautifully bound and illustrated, has been procured, and will be in circulation in a few days.

The collections for the past year were \$118.02
