Continued from First Page. and take them to their destination when loaded, having nothing whatever to do with the weight of loading or unloading.

It is claimed that the tariff has been framed on the same basis as that of the Grand Trunk and other railways owned by companies; but even if that was the case the circumstances are entirely different in dealing with a company and in doing business with the I. C. R., where everything has to go by a cast iron rule.

No matter what tariff rate a company may charge, if a man has a number of cars of lumber or a large quantity of other goods he can ask for a special rate and as a general thing the latter is looked at from a fair business standpoint and the shipper is granted satisfactory terms in freight rates.

The I. C. R. regulations however, are inflexible and there is no redress. Not only is the freight rate on lumber almost the same as that of the new tariff acts on like a two edged sword, cutting both ways, as we have to pay exorbitant rates from St. John to Montreal as well as other requisite supplies.

In the office in which the interview was held, it was stated that the I. C. R. is largely interested in shipping and lumbering operations and their opinions might be gathered from such remarks as: "I guess they are going to shut the inter-colonial down."

"Well, they'll kill the milling business anyway."
