THE AGRICULTURE OF HURON AND BRUCE.

(Continued.)

There is one evil which, in our opinion, should be remedied by our farmers as soon as possible. We mean the cultivation of the corn field. The system, as at present pursued by most in this section, is to plant their corn in rows as close as possible and then crop it continuously. The result is obvious. A virgin soil gives good crops until its richness has been exhausted, and then each succeeding year witnesses a diminution of returns for the amount of labor expended, until at last the hapless cultivator desponds himself poor without the hope of relieving his fortunes from a poverty-stricken soil. On the Western prairie, where the surface deposit is four or five feet thick, artificial cultivation, and continuous cropping over large areas is possible for a long series of years without exhausting the soil, but observation and experience teaches us that this system will never do in Canada, and if the farmers of Huron and Bruce, generally speaking, they may expect the fate of those residing in the old prairie countries, who cannot do any crop more than from ten to fifteen bushels of wheat per acre from land that at one time yielded thirty or forty. Our geographical position renders it impossible to work out a farm and then remove farther West in any American farmer do; hence we should make the most of what we have, by cultivating less land and cultivating it upon a different principle. Those who have tried the experiment will bear us out in the statement that fifty acres of land thoroughly cultivated with the best implements to be obtained will yield a hundred bushels more than one hundred acres skinned over. The farmer who turns up three inches of subsoil while at the same time, he turns down every pound of fertilizing material that ingenuity can devise, or industry accumulate, may be said actually to cultivate as much soil as his neighbor who skins over as great a superficial area, and he has, besides, the satisfaction of knowing that he requires less feeding, and other protection, as well as the saving of his soil for future years. The fact cannot be disguised or explained away that those of our farmers who pursue the thorough principle are less liable to injury through drought or extreme moister, and that instead of deteriorating their soil becomes better year after year. Where large clearings have been made, the whole of cultivation was upon good soil, and our farmers would give greatly extended facilities for the raising of sheep, which would be a profitable branch of industry for several years to come. It might also lead to the establishment of dairies such as are carried on in other parts of the country to the profit of those engaged in the manufacture of a superior quality of butter and cheese.

The Counties of Huron and Bruce will generally become the garden of Upper Canada, if Agriculturists themselves will engage in a spirit of enlightened enterprise, and determine that whatever happens they will endeavor to keep pace with the onward march of improvement. We have an admirable soil for the production of the staple cereals as well as the fruit grown in the country, and our population generally is both hardy and intelligent. We have the latter quality in view when we express the hope that all who take an interest in profitable farming will unite in the endeavor to diffuse correct ideas with regard to the various processes now in vogue. Our Agricultural Societies are doing a good work in so far as they bring farmers to think and act upon whatever valuable knowledge they pick up, but we feel thoroughly convinced that in many respects these societies are not productive of the amount of good that might be expected of them. They are unable to pay too much to the selfish propensities of those who belong to them. Mr. A. enrolls his name in an Agricultural Society's books, and keeps it there from year to year merely because he is able to take a number of prizes in certain classes. And yet it may be that during all those years he has not contributed one single idea to the general stock of his fellow agriculturists. It is sometimes difficult to determine which is most to be blamed for this, the rules of the society or Mr. A. himself. The rules may say that if he can show the best 20 bushels of wheat, in hay, he will take a tolerably handsome prize. Now, taking it for granted that the object of such societies is to benefit the farming community generally, as much as possible, we would ask what good has been achieved after that man has pocketed his prize money? How could it be raised to the next? How much did his wheat grow upon, and what was the cultivation made use of? Such questions are never asked, and if they were, in many instances the successful competitor would be considerably embarrassed, for we have an idea that the farming man and riddle have, sometimes, a great deal to do with the appearance of grain shown. Would it not be better and sounder more directly to the benefit of all concerned, if the prizes for grain were given, not judging from whether it was from the fields of the competitor, just as roots are now judged? This we do, our useful farmer would feel that he was entering into a competition with his neighbors on a principle which would be sure to reward the best cultivation. And then, again, every competitor should be required to furnish a statement of the cultivation of his soil, and the general cultivation. Such statements if filed before a body of farmers, and if they were published and discussed, would be of great benefit to the community.

AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION.

The meeting of the Canadian Press Association at Belleville, on Thursday last, was the most successful that has yet been held. The great object of this association of conductors of the newspaper press is to bring together men of various political leanings, so that by a personal acquaintance around a social table they may be enabled to rub off the rust of political dissension, and to spring up in the heat of political discussion. Any one reading some of our newspapers would be inclined to think that such a meeting attended with great danger. Surely grit and tory could not meet under the same roof without violence and perhaps bloodshed! Nothing of the kind however. Men holding political views as opposite as the poles may be seen at our great meetings walking arm in arm, and perhaps sharing the same bed. Never have we seen a single outbreak of passion or departure from the prevalent spirit of hilarity. The result is we come to view each other as brothers, having in view each other, the good of our fellow men, and we go home to exercise a spirit of mutual forbearance, while at the same time, we cling just as tenaciously as ever to our popular views. Already happy results are observable. The press of Canada, as directed by members of the Association takes a higher tone in its discussions, and dwells upon principles rather than upon the personal character of the individual.
