Considers China Menace To Labor

Editor of English Labor Paper Sees Serious Features in Oriental Development

Returns After Spending Six Months in Studying So-called Peril

James T. Ford, editor of a labor paper published at Birmingham, England, has arrived in Victoria after spending six months in the Orient as a special delegate of the International Iron Workers. His reason was to closely investigate the labor problem in the Oriental countries in order that organized workmen may, at some future date, successfully combat the new and unexpected conditions that will arise, for he says: "While there is no danger of a Yellow Peril through direct contact, the industrial centre of the world will, upon the reconstruction of the Chinese empire, be in China instead of the western world. To this extent the United States, and in fact, every civilized nation, has occasion to fear Chinese development."
