NINTH YEAR.

CALLING OUT RESERVES.

IT HAS NO CONNECTION WITH THE
POLITICAL SITUATION.

The Dominion Appeal Working Night
and Day-Large Summery Purchased for
the Reserve Army in the Districts Near
the Atlantic Frontier.

VICTORIA, Jan. 3.—The action of the Govern-
ment in calling out the reserves in Moravia
has no connection with the political situation,
intention being to call out the reserves of
all the army corps in rotation for a seven days
drill in the use of repeating rifles.

Active in Romania.
DOUBLEDAY, Jan. 3.—A decree has been
published, fixing the number of recruits for
the coming year at 44,000. This is a notable
increase, and is regarded as a good omen.
Romania is preparing for coming events. The
army and State railway factories are work-
ing night and day, and their hands are not
doubled. Premier Brătianu stated that Ro-
mania is obliged to enter the field can do so
with 300,000 men.

Prussian Army Supplies.
LONDON, Jan. 3.—The German Govern-
ment is about to adopt a new law to prevent private
railway companies from nullifying the effect
of prohibitive duties against Germany and
