LIBERAL-UNIONIST COUNCIL

MINUTIA BILL IN HOUSE

BILLIONS IN RAILWAYS.

Inter-State Commerce Commission Issues Commerce Statistics.

Washington, D. C., July 11.—The interstate commerce commission today announced its statistics of railroads in the United States for the fiscal year ended July 30, 1903. They showed that the par value of railway capital then outstanding was \$12,999,990,258, which represents a capitalization of \$65,136 per mile.

The number of passengers carried was 694,831,835, an increase of 45,011,480 over the previous year; freight carried, 1,304,394,223 tons, an increase of 104,078,536 tons. The gross earnings from the operation of total of 208,313 miles of railway lines, which is the aggregate single-track mileage, were \$1,900,466,907, an increase of \$174,666,644; operating expenses, \$1,537,558,882, an increase of \$141,230,105, net earnings, \$362,908,025, an increase of \$33,176,536; income from other sources, \$1,000,000,000, an increase of 480; net income available for dividends or surplus, \$296,726,489. The total assets were \$6,235,000,000, of which \$610 represented the number of persons killed and 76,533 those injured. The aggregate number of employees in service was 45,871, an increase of 2646; cars in service, 1,783,289, an increase of over 118,000 during the year.
