The Committee appointed at the meeting of the Synod held in July last, to advise with the Metropolitan, as to the right of Lay Representatives of Parishes in arrear to the contingent fund of the Synod, to sit and vote in the Synod, and to report on the proposed addition to the second article of the Constitution, in respect to payment of arrears to the contingent fund, as found on page twenty-one of the Journal of the Synod for the year 1890, report :

That having considered the questions so referred to them, they are of opinion that the Metropolitan was right in ruling that under the 12th Section of the second Article of the Constitution, Lay Representatives elected for any Parishes that had paid the assessment to the contingent fund for the current year, were qualified to vote at the meetings of the Synod.

That they are of opinion that it is not desirable to adopt the proposed addition to Article 2 of the Constitution, which declares that "all arrearages which may be due" to the contingent fund from the Parishes for which Representatives have been elected, must have been paid before such Representatives shall have a right to vote.

While they regret that such arrearages exist, and think that efforts should be made to collect them, they believe that such an amendment to the Constitution as has been proposed would be the means of excluding from the meetings the Lay Representatives from several Parishes of the Diocese, who otherwise would attend and take an interest in the subjects discussed.

The Committee recommend that the payment of the assessments to the contingent fund of the Synod shall hereafter be required before Lay Representatives shall be entitled to sit and vote; and that an addition to Article 2 be adopted (which shall not be retrospective), that in future Lay Representatives shall not be entitled to sit and vote in the Synod unless the assessments hereafter made upon the respective Parishes have been paid.

REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE SYNOD ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

To the RIGHT REV. THE LORD BISHOP *and the* DIOCESAN SYNOD OF
FREDERICTON.

The Standing Committee of the Synod on Sunday Schools respectfully submit the following report:

This Committee met in St. John on September 1st, and appointed Rev. O. S. Newnham chairman, and Rev. C. P. Hanington secretary, for the year.

The Committee communicated with the different Deanery S. S. organizations, and with the Deaneries where there are no such organizations, as to the advisability of forming a Diocesan S. S. organization. Answers were not received from many of the Deaneries, and the Deaneries answering, answered in dubious tones.

The Committee considered it advisable to continue the S. S. Teachers' Conferences, and a successful conference was held, under its direction,

at Fredericton, on May 18th and 19th. A service was held in the Cathedral on Wednesday evening, the 18th, in connection with the Conference, and on Thursday morning there was a celebration of Holy Communion in the Cathedral at 8 o'clock. The collections at these services amounted in all to \$12.87: extra contributions towards defraying the expenses of this Committee, to the amount of \$1.15, were received from interested churchmen, making total receipts of the committee \$14.02. The expenses in connection with the Conference were \$10.92, and in connection with collecting statistics of Sunday Schools \$3.10, making total expenses of the Committee \$14.02: receipts and expenses therefore balancing. The Committee, accordingly, has no bill to hand in to the Synod, as for the year past it has been self-supporting.

The Conference, of which we have just been speaking, was held in the Church Hall, beginning at 10 o'clock on Thursday morning, and continuing through the afternoon and evening. Excellent papers were read and addresses given by the different appointed writers and speakers. The programme of the Conference is appended to this report.

The attendance was fairly good, but the Committee feel that it might have been much larger and more representative. They hope that in the future S. S. teachers throughout the Province will, when possible, avail themselves of this splendid opportunity for gaining ideas from others, and for setting forth their own ideas, on S. S. work. The chief thing which prevents full attendance is undoubtedly the expense; but it is purposed to hold the Conference in a different part of the Diocese each year, so that all parts of the Diocese may be enabled to profit from it. It is not yet arranged where it is to be held next year: this will be for the new committee to decide.

The Committee, as usual, sent out circulars in order to collect statistical and other information concerning Sunday Schools. We are sorry to have to report that several parishes have sent in no reply, which prevents us from placing before the Synod the exact state of S. S. work in the Diocese. The statistical returns of numbers of Sunday Schools, Teachers, Scholars and Offerings are appended to this report. We proceed to summarize these, and also the returns in other matters connected with the Sunday Schools.

Returns were received from fifty-two parishes, an increase of three on last year. No returns were received from the following parishes: Petersville, Simonds, Westfield, Albert, Grand Manan, Campobello, Aberdeen, Andover, Gordon and Lorne, Richmond, Prince William and Dumfries, Hampton, Kingston, Upham, Salisbury, Burton, Canning, St. Mary's (York County), Addington, Bathurst, Derby and Blackville.

The summary of the returns is as follows: Total number of schools reported, 96; reported last year, 92. Estimated number of schools in

parishes not reporting 37—making the estimated total for the Diocese 133; estimated total last year, 125.

Number of teachers reported: male, 160; female, 384; sex not given, 2. Total, 546. (Reported last year, 548.) Estimated number of teachers in parishes not reporting, 193—making the estimated total for the Diocese 739. (Estimated total last year, 697.)

Number of scholars reported: male, 1,940; female, 2,536; sex not given, 257. Total, 4,733. (Reported last year, 4,547.) Estimated number of scholars in parishes not reporting, 1,260—making the estimated total for the Diocese 5,993. (Estimated total last year, 5,587—an apparent increase of about 400.)

The Committee asked the Clergy for the scheme of instruction in force in their respective Sunday Schools. From the returns we gather that in 21 parishes *Bishop Doane's Manuals* are used; in 10 or more, *The Institute Leaflet*, with *Teachers' Assistant*; in 4, the *Calvary Catechism*; in 3, the *International Series of Leaflets*; in 2, the *Evangelical Churchman Leaflets*; in 2, *Dr. Shinn's Leaflets*; in 1, *B. Wordsworth's Elements of Instruction*; in 1, the *Uniform Series of Diocesan Committees* (Whitaker); in 1, *Eugene Stock's Acts of the Apostles*; in 1, *Trinity Ch. Catechism*. As many parishes do not report scheme of instruction, this summary is only an imperfect one; but many schools work directly from the Bible and Prayer Book, without outside aids.

In 18 parishes monthly children's services are held; in 6, such services are held occasionally; in 4, quarterly; and in 4, once or twice a year.

In many parishes there are districts where Sunday Schools ought to be working, but lack of teachers and other reasons render it impossible to establish them at present.

The total amount of contributions reported is \$1,903.89. These contributions were devoted to the following objects: Sunday School expenses, Libraries, Leaflets, etc.; D. C. S., Indian Homes, Orphan Asylum, Algoma (Bishop's Stipend), Foreign Missions, Poor Relief, Indian Schools, Coral Missionary Fund, C. M. S., Domestic Missions, etc.

In some parishes the teachers have had some special training for their work, but in most cases teachers have had no special training. In some parishes the teachers, or many of them, are members of a S. S. organization. In many parishes teachers' classes and meetings are regularly held.

In 27 parishes, magazines, etc., are circulated amongst the children. The following are the periodicals named in the returns: *Dawn of Day*, *Young Churchman*, *Shepherd's Arms*, *Children's Friend*, *Church Monthly*, *Children's Paper*, *Mission Papers*, *The Parish and Home*, *British Workman*, *Church and Home Magazine*, *Canadian Church Magazine*, *Banner of Faith*, C. M. S. "Awake," *Infants' Magazine*, *Band of Hope Review*.

Sunday School is on the increase in the Diocese, and that the children of the Church are not being neglected by the Clergy. In scattered missions, the keeping up and perfecting of the Sunday School seems a work of great difficulty; but much is being done, even in such missions, and undoubtedly more will be done in the future, through the practical assistance of our different organizations, in which our difficulties are aired and plans for the solution of them suggested.

It would be more satisfactory if every parish sent returns to this Synod (for the returns, we take it, are not for the Committee, but for the Synod); then we could be able to compare accurately year with year, and note marks of progress, if any.

The Committee trust that Sunday School work will become more and more effective throughout the Diocese, for they feel it to be one great means of making up for what is left undone in the day-schools; and without it they can hardly see how the rising generation are to become versed in Bible or in Church knowledge, and be made competent to assume the direction of affairs, whether in Church or in State when the present generation shall have passed away.

APPENDIX D.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF FINANCE.

To the RIGHT REVEREND THE LORD BISHOP OF FREDERICTON, and
the DIOCESAN SYNOD OF FREDERICTON :

The Committee appointed at the last session of the Synod, "To arrange or suggest the best mode of meeting the necessary expenditure of the Synod," beg to report :

That, after a careful examination of the Treasurer's Reports of the Contingent Fund for the past six years, your Committee finds that whereas at the beginning of that period there was a balance on hand in the bank of \$410.00, there is now a deficiency of \$29.05. That this has come about during that period through three causes: First, the heavy expenses incurred for printing; Second, the increased triennial assessment levied by the Provincial Synod, and which has risen from \$50.00 to \$150.00; and Thirdly, the decrease in the amounts received from the assessment in the several parishes.

In view of the fact that there will be required for the current year the amount of its present deficiency of \$29.05, the Provincial Synod assessment of \$150.00, and for the contingent expenses of the Synod a sum not less than \$130.00, making a total of \$309.05, and that the amount derived from assessment will probably not exceed \$109.00, thus leaving a deficiency of \$200.00 to be provided for, your Committee recommends that the Lord Bishop be respectfully requested to ask for a special collection to be made throughout the Diocese, to meet the above deficiency of \$200.00.

Your Committee also recommends that a Schedule of Assessments on the several parishes be adopted sufficient to provide the sum of \$200 per annum, being the amount at present required for the annual expenses of the Synod.

Your Committee also further recommends that Sec. 1 of Canon II of the Synod be repealed, and the following enacted in its stead :

THE CONTINGENT FUND.

The sums contributed annually to this Fund by the Cathedral, and the several Parishes, shall be fixed from time to time by a Finance Committee, to be appointed annually, the minimum contribution from any Parish to be two dollars.

APPENDIX E.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PARISHES.

To the RIGHT REVEREND, THE LORD BISHOP, and the DIOCESAN SYNOD OF FREDERICTON:

Your Committee appointed at the last Session of the Synod "To inquire into the present position of the Parishes of the Diocese, and to report as to the number in which Church Corporations have been formed, with the title of such corporations," beg to submit the following Report:

They find that in the Diocese of Fredericton, in addition to the Cathedral, and the Mission Chapel of St. John the Baptist, there are 151 Parishes. Of these they are able to find Corporations formed in 75, though it is possible that there may be a few more which have not come to the knowledge of your Committee.

Accompanying this Report is a full list of the Parishes, with the titles of the Corporations, and the name of the Clergymen in charge.

It would seem to your Committee that some misunderstanding has existed as to the representation of Parishes in the Synod. For example: The Church Act says (section 37): "Each of the several Parishes constituted by law, shall, as heretofore, be and continue an Ecclesiastical Parish under the terms of this act, unless division thereof shall be made as hereinafter provided." The Constitution of the Synod says (Article 2, section 2): "Each Parish shall be entitled to elect one representative." Now by turning to the Synod Journals it will be seen that some confusion exists concerning the matter, for in 1874 Centreville appears in the list of Parishes: in 1874 and 5 Clifton appears in the same way; so also in 1874 do McAdam and Dutch Valley appear in the same way; in 1877 Drummond rightly appears as a Parish, but from 1878 to 1891 Drummond is changed to New Denmark; from 1869 to 1881 Hardwicke is on the list, but from 1882 to 1891 it is changed to Bay du Vin, while for two years Albert appears as a Parish.

Then again, Parishes have appeared on the list in the Synod Journal for a year or two, and have then been dropped off, and are thus in danger of being lost sight of. Take the following as examples: New Bandon appears for two years (69 and 70); Caraquet for one year (70), Dundas for two years (69 and 70); Ludlow for two years (69 and 70); and then again after an interval of sixteen years; Hopewell for eight years; Point du Chene for eight years.

Then again, in one case two Parishes have been joined together, as Douglas and Bright.

In other cases Parishes have appeared and disappeared on the list without any apparent cause.

Your Committee would suggest to the Synod that the Secretary be authorized to print in the Synod Journal two Lists of Parishes, one containing all the Parishes of the Diocese, and the other containing names of such Parishes as elect Lay Representatives, together with the names of such Representatives.

Your committee would also advise that a correct list of all the Parishes in the Diocese at the present time, with their boundaries, and such alterations as may be made in the boundaries from time to time, together with the name and location of all Churches and Chapels therein, be kept on file.

In conclusion, your Committee feel that some re-arrangement of the present boundaries of the parishes is much needed.

**REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SCHEME FOR THE
CONSOLIDATION OF THE CHURCH IN
BRITISH NORTH AMERICA.**

*To the RIGHT REVEREND THE LORD BISHOP, and the DIOCESAN SYNOD
OF FREDERICTON.*

Your Committee on the Consideration of the Scheme for the Consolidation of the Church in British North America beg leave to report, that they have had the scheme before them, and resolved to consider it section by section. The first paragraph of section one, proposing "that there shall be a General Synod consisting of the Bishops of the Church of England in the Dominion of Canada and the Diocese of Newfoundland, and of delegates chosen from the Clergy and Laity," was referred to a sub-committee on Precedents Ancient and Modern for such an organization as set forth in the scheme, in addition to Provincial Synods. The report of that sub-committee is hereby laid before the Synod in accordance with the following resolution passed at the last meeting of your Committee: "That while this Committee is not prepared to express an opinion on the advisability of consolidation, it cannot recommend the scheme as submitted from the Winnipeg Conference, and begs leave to report the whole matter, with the report of the sub-committee, back to the Synod."

The sub-committee appointed to gather information about precedents beg to report that they have been making inquiries, the result of which is as follows:

First, Of things as they are at present.

In the Church of England there are two Provinces, without any General Synod, but each Province has its own Convocation; while Diocesan Synods, which had fallen into desuetude, are being generally revived.

In the Church of Ireland there are two Provinces, with one General Synod, which passes laws and canons binding on all members of the Church whether the Diocese be at the time represented in the General

Synod or not. The General Synod meets at regular intervals, every year. There are also Diocesan Synods, which are to meet at least once a year. There is no Provincial Synod.

In the Church of Scotland there is but one Province, acknowledging one Primus elected by the Bishops. There is a General Synod, as well as Diocesan Synods.

In the American Church there has hitherto been but one general organization in addition to the Diocesan Conventions. But this is now found to be unwieldy and unworkable, and there is an effort made to break up the organization into Provinces. The committee appointed for this purpose has not yet reported.

In Australia the organization is incomplete. A General Synod has been formed with power to form Provincial Synods, but at present only the Dioceses of New South Wales have been grouped in a Province under a Metropolitan.

In the case of communities outside our communion :

The Presbyterians have four recognized meetings—The Kirk session for each congregation ; the Presbytery for a combination of congregations ; the Synod for a combination of Presbyteries ; the General Assembly for the whole of Canada.

Your committee have not learned the relation of one to the other of these bodies, but it is said that the number of representatives who attend from the Pacific Coast is very small. They have met at Toronto, Montreal, Ottawa and Winnipeg. The ministerial delegates pay their own expenses.

The Methodists as now united have but one legislative body, the General Conference, in which the legislative powers of the four bodies who united in 1884 are centred. The Annual Conference, District Meeting, Circuit Official Meeting have no such legislative powers as our Diocesan Synods. They have never attempted to meet in General Conference further West than Toronto. A collection is made in every church every year for the expenses of the General Conference, forming a fund out of which the expenses of delegates are paid. If such fund be insufficient, each delegate is left "deficient in his expenses by an equal amount."

With respect to Ancient and Medieval precedent :

It is doubtless true, as the learned Dean Field has said, that in addition to Diocesan Synods there was provision that "Provincial Synods be holden twice every year, in which the acts of Episcopal Synods might be re-examined. These Provincial Synods were subordinate to Patriarchal and National Synods, wherein the primate of a nation, or one of the Patriarchs, sat as president. But the fullness of power is found only in the General Assembly, called a General Council." But it will be found that, though provision was made for the regular meeting of the Provincial Synods, there does not seem to have been regular

meetings of the greater assemblies, which were only summoned as occasion required.

This will be seen in the great African Councils. S. Cyprian summoned Sorres to support him in his controversy with the Bishop of Rome about Baptism. The most renowned councils under Aurelius seem to have been summoned at the earnest request of his friend and adviser, S. Augustine of Hippo.

Similarly with the renowned Spanish Councils. There seems to be no regular meetings, but they were summoned as occasion required. Thus the first Council of Toledo met A. D. 400, and consisted of nineteen Bishops. The second met one hundred and thirty years afterwards and consisted of eight Bishops. The third met fifty years later, when sixty-two Bishops met, and so on.

Not otherwise does it seem to have happened in England. National Councils seem to have been summoned on certain great occasions, for certain definite purposes, but there was no regular meetings appointed.

It is true that formerly the organization of the great heretical Nestorian Church seems to have been complete. But then the supremacy of the Patriarch was acknowledged, and the various Bishops came rather to report themselves to him at various intervals than to hold regular Councils or Synods. * Their plan seems to have been somewhat of the character of the modern Papal system of the Roman Communion. They have dwindled down to a small and ignorant community, seeking instruction from the See of Canterbury.

Your committee have been unable to satisfy themselves that there is any precedent in ancient or modern times for regular meetings of other than two Synodical bodies. When greater Synods, National or Patriarchal, were held, they seem to have been summoned as occasion required, for some special purpose.

Your committee submit the above report as containing the best information they have been able to obtain.

SCHEDULE B.

APPENDIX TO THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE TRANSFER OF CHURCH PROPERTY, AMENDMENTS TO CHURCH ACTS, ETC.

A Bill entitled "An Act to amend an Act to consolidate and amend various Acts of Assembly relating to the Church of England in New Brunswick."

1. Whenever any new Parish shall be set off from any established Parish or Parishes, whether for ecclesiastical purposes only, or otherwise, it shall be lawful for the Church Corporation of the Parish, or of any Parish from which such new Parish or any part of the same shall be set off, to transfer and convey, either without any valuable consideration or otherwise, to the Church Corporation of such new Parish, any part of the Church or Glebe lands or other property held by them, provided that such transfer and conveyance shall have first been approved by a two-third majority of the persons entitled to vote at a Parish meeting duly summoned in the Parish, the Church Corporation of which shall theretofore hold the same, and the Deed or Conveyance of such Corporation of any Parish from which such new Parish, or any part thereof, shall have been set off, shall be valid, sufficient, and effectual to convey such Church or Glebe lands or property to the Church Corporation of such new Parish, to be held by them in connection with such new Parish; but otherwise, upon the original trusts for which the same were theretofore held, and shall be *prima facie* evidence that all proceedings recited in such transfer or conveyance in connection with the same have been rightly had.

2. Whenever in any Parish in which a Church Corporation shall have been formed, any Church or Glebe lands or property shall be vested in or held by the Bishop of Fredericton, it shall be lawful for the said Bishop of Fredericton, if he shall so see fit, to transfer and convey the same to the Church Corporation of such Parish upon the same trusts for which the same have theretofore been held.

FOR NEW LEGISLATION.

1. That Section 54, Chapter 36, of 48th Vic., be amended by substituting the words "The Secretary of the Diocesan Synod of Fredericton" for and instead of the words "The Treasurer of the Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick," which appear in the two last lines but one of the said section.

2. That Sections 21 and 22 of the said Church Act be and are hereby repealed, and the following sections substituted therefor, namely:

§ 21. Should no nomination be made by the parishioners and notified to the Bishop of the Diocese, Bishop Coadjutor, or Ecclesiastical Commissary, within six months after the vacancy shall have occurred, or in case the person nominated is incapable of admission to the benefice, and written notice thereof shall have been given by the Bishop or Ecclesiastical officers aforesaid to the Church-wardens, "or in case the person nominated shall refuse to accept, or does not accept, the nomination within the six months from the vacancy." And if no further nomination of a person capable of admission shall have been made within the six months aforesaid, then it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese to collate to such vacant Church.

§ 22. It shall be the duty of the Church-wardens, within ten days after such meeting and choice, to notify the same in writing, and to present the person so chosen to the Bishop of the Diocese, whereupon the Bishop shall institute the person so presented to the vacant benefice unless some lawful impediment exist to his so doing, "concerning which it shall be the duty of the Bishop to inquire and satisfy himself within three months from the time of presentation." And the Bishop, having so satisfied himself that no lawful impediment exists, shall forthwith institute the person so presented to the vacant benefice, and shall issue his mandate to the Church-wardens, or either of them, to induct the person so presented and instituted; provided that, if at the time any Rectory becomes vacant one of the Church-wardens shall have died, or shall have resigned, or shall be absent from the province, or shall decline, or from any other cause be unable to act, the duties imposed upon and directed by Sections 17, 19, 20 of said Act 48 Vic., Cap. 36, hereof, to be performed by the Church-wardens, shall be performed by the surviving or continuing Church-warden, or the Warden able to act in this matter at the time such duties respectively are required to be performed; and it shall be the duty of the Church-wardens, or either of them, to certify to the Bishop that such induction has been properly performed, and that the said Rector has publicly read the service of the Church of England, and the thirty-nine Articles, and has expressed his unfeigned assent and consent thereto.

That Section 28 of the said Church Act be amended by adding at the end thereof, after the word Corporation, the words following: "Except for the necessary repairs, firewood, and fencing of the Glebe,

or in the ordinary and usual course of husbandry." (See also Sec. 36). Whenever the proceeds of the sales of any land belonging to any Church Corporation shall have been invested under the directions of any Act of Assembly relating to the Church of England in the province, or any money given or bequeathed to the said Corporation for the support and maintenance of the Church in such Parish, or upon any other trust whatsoever relating to the said Church shall have been invested by the Corporation, it shall be the duty of the Church-wardens, or one of them, in case of the absence of the other, upon the written requisition of the Bishop of the Diocese, to produce to him, or to his deputy in that behalf, for his inspection and examination, all the deeds, mortgages, debentures, or other securities by which any such investments are secured, together with the evidence of the sanction thereof by the Bishop when required by law, or by the terms of any deed or will; and also to report (if required so to do) to the Bishop, or his said deputy, in writing, whether in their or his opinion any of such investments are unsafe or of doubtful value, and if so, the reasons why in their or his opinion they are so. Provided that this section shall not apply to any Parish which shall support a clergyman without aid from the Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick.

That there be added at the end of Section 38 of the said Act the following words: "And it shall be the duty of the Church-wardens to notify such election and the formation of such Corporation under such name to the Secretary of the Synod, who shall enter the same in his Register of Corporations."

That there be added at the end of Section 36 of the said Act the following words: "Provided that if no election shall have been made by the Parishioners within six months after the vacancy shall have occurred, it shall be lawful for the Bishop to appoint."

Your Committee have to report that the following named societies and objects have all received an increased support during the past year, viz.: Parochial Missions to the Jews, The Church Missionary Society, Missions in Japan, Colonial and Continental Church Society, Diocese of Algoma, North-West Missions.

Your Committee have again been obliged to appropriate a sufficient sum from the Domestic Missions' General Fund to pay the portion of the Bishop of Algoma's Stipend required from this Diocese, as no subscriptions were paid during the past year for this special purpose.

APPENDIX J.

REPORT OF THE GOVERNORS OF KING'S COLLEGE, WINDSOR, N. S.

To the MOST REVEREND THE LORD BISHOP, and the MEMBERS OF THE SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF FREDERICTON.

The survivor of the two Governors of King's College, appointed by the Synod, begs leave to submit the following report:

That the late honoured and respected Robert Thompson Clinch, who, together with myself, was appointed by the last Synod, one of the Governors as aforesaid, having entered into rest on the morning of Sunday, January 24th, the duty of attending the meetings of the Board of Governors, and of preparing and presenting this report, has necessarily devolved upon me, after having for several years enjoyed his guidance and assistance as co-governor. His loss was so deeply felt by the Board that, by a resolution, a copy of which is hereunto appended,

they have placed on record their strong sense of his personal worth, and the great value of his service to the Church.

The Academical year closed with twenty matriculated students in residence, all taking full courses of studies, of which number twelve are students in Divinity, eight in connection with the Diocese of Nova Scotia, and four with that of Fredericton. The number from this Diocese was lessened by the untimely death of G. B. Roberts, a young man of rare promise, who stood high in the esteem of those professors under whom he studied, and whose course was so near completion that he intended to offer himself for examination at the Trinity-tide ordination.

Minute and particular inquiries made by your representative, as to the tone that prevails among the students in general, and among students in Divinity in particular, resulted in the gratifying information that at no time in the history of the University did a better feeling or spirit obtain, and it is my opinion, that in this important particular, King's College will compare favorably with any University on this continent.

The students in the Divinity School are, without exception, young men of much promise, studious and earnest, and strongly impressed with a high sense of the sacred office at which they aim. Those of them who are sufficiently advanced render valuable service to the church in many of the neighbouring parishes during term, and during the long vacation there are many more applications for their services than there are students available.

They have formed the "King's College Church Missionary Society," and their missionary zeal, in imitation of the great Universities of England, has led them to assume the responsibility of providing for two years the sum of \$200 a year, for the education with a view to the Priesthood, of Jacob Khaddar, a young Greek Jew, who is to labor under Bishop Blythe, at Jerusalem among his own countrymen. And I think it only just, as it is true, to add, that this remarkable increase in missionary zeal in the Divinity School is referred by the students themselves to the admirable influence of the Professor in Divinity.

Of fourteen young men who have within the last fortnight presented themselves for examination for matriculation, only six passed the required standard; and the remaining eight may remain in residence for one term, an arrangement whereby, without lowering the required standard, they will have reasonable opportunity afforded them to pass in any subject in which they had previously failed. By this provision a serious cause of irritation will have been removed; and further, it will operate in the direction of retaining young men of *capacity*, but of insufficient learning to enable them at once to matriculate, in our own Church University, who would otherwise have gone out of the provinces, or have entered one or other of the denominational colleges.

I am glad to be able to say that one great evil we complained of in our last report, namely, that Divinity students holding scholarships were permitted to take for degree other subjects to the exclusion of Classics, has been removed. All students in Divinity must hereafter take a full course in Arts.

With reference to the general affairs of the College, your representative is at length able to say that its friends, meaning thereby more particularly the Board of Governors, the Faculty, the Associated Alumni, and the Synod of the Diocese of Nova Scotia, are aroused to a sense of the serious dangers that menace the institution to a degree never before equalled, and although I am unable to report the accomplishment of all the improvements which was hoped for at this time last year, there is now a much greater probability, if not an absolute certainty, that those who present the next annual report will be, in this respect, in a happier position than that of your retiring representative.

APPENDIX K.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEE FOR THE "CHURCH SCHOOL FOR GIRLS" AT WINDSOR, N. S.

To the MOST REVEREND THE METROPOLITAN OF CANADA, and the SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF FREDERICTON.

In my last year's report I referred to the laying of the corner-stone of the new school buildings on the 23rd of June, 1891.

I now have much pleasure in reporting that the building has been finished and occupied since the 16th of January last. It is a splendid structure—heated throughout by a hot water system and lighted by electricity, the dangers from fire being thus reduced to a minimum.

The Calendar gives a complete history of the school, from the beginning to the completion of the last term.

The school closed on the 21st day of June of this year. The closing exercises were of a most interesting character, reflecting great credit upon teachers and pupils. Addresses were made by his Lordship the Bishop of Nova Scotia, and Mr. Justice Hanington, of this Province. Both these gentlemen expressed themselves very much gratified with what they had seen and heard. The success of the school, thus far, has been beyond our expectations. There were registered during the year 95 pupils, 74 boarders, and 21 day scholars.

The Staff consists of seven (7) resident teachers and five (5) who are non-residents. The receipts for board and tuition from pupils were sufficient to cover all working expenses, and interest on debt of about twenty thousand dollars. If the whole of the capital stock was subscribed and paid in, as it should be, the institution would be free from debt, and would be in a position to pay a dividend on the stock or reduce the fees for board and tuition.

The expenditure on capital account to date is about \$46,000. Of the authorized capital of \$50,000, about \$27,000 has been subscribed, and nearly \$24,000 has been paid in.

Having in view the marked success that has attended our Girls' School, from its inception to the present time, it is earnestly hoped that the church people in this diocese will more liberally support the institution than they have hitherto done, by taking a fair share of the unsubscribed stock. This being the only "Church School for Girls" in the Maritime Provinces, it ought to command all the sympathy and support of the church people within these bounds, and it ought to be placed in that position to do the work for which it was intended.

Your Trustee has caused one hundred and fifty copies of the Calendar for 1892 and 1893 to be placed on the table for the use of the Synod.

I hope the Synod will renew the grant of \$55, which was voted last year for prizes.

In Fredericton the quarterly meetings have been held regularly, and in March, a public Missionary meeting as well. There are 120 names on the roll.

The Secretary of the Woodstock Branch reports 32 members, with 30 in the Girls' Branch. They are still working for the Parish hall, and hope by a sale in July to realize funds sufficient to make it fit for use.

In the Parish of St. Mary's, York County, the members have been working to pay off the debt on the Church hall. As a result of their efforts they have been able to contribute \$125 for that purpose, \$80 for seats for the hall, and \$15.75 interest on the debt. There are now 21 members. In the Town of Marysville the members have been working for the building fund of the Church, and have been able to contribute the sum of \$207 towards it.

In the Mission of Ludlow and Blissfield there are four branches of the Association. The sum of \$28 has been given to defray Church expenses. At Lower Ludlow the members are working for the completion of the Mission room, and have given \$20 to pay what was due on the work. The windows, doors, and inside work have still to be provided for. At New Bandon \$30 have been deposited in the Savings Bank for a Sunday School in that settlement. The Doaktown branch was able to hand in a considerable sum for the new Church, and through the kind aid of friends the Church for which these poor people have laboured so long was at last consecrated on May 24th.

In Kingsclear the members are working for a fund to put a new roof on St. Peter's Church, and have also contributed one hundred dollars (\$100) to pay off the debt of the Parish.

In the Parish of Burton a carpet has been purchased for the chancel of St. John's Church, Oromocto, the cost of which was \$53.81. The Church has been supplied with new lamps, for which \$9.63 was paid, and the insurance on the Church has been renewed for three years.

A Branch of the Association was formed in St. Martins a year ago. The sum of \$138.94 has been realized by sales of needlework. Lamps have been provided for the Church, costing \$25.59; repairs made to Rectory, \$74.35; balance paid on Church seats, \$25; and interest on Church lands, \$9.

In the Parish of Waterford the "Guild of St. Anne" was affiliated with the Association within the year, with six working members. They have earned money by means of needlework, which has been applied as follows: For Clergyman's stipend, \$9; vessels for Holy Communion, \$6; sanctuary curtains, \$6.53; organ and music, \$9.02; total, \$30.55.

Mrs. Arnold, Vice-President of the St. John Girls' Branch, writes that in November, 1891, she remitted to the Bishop Coadjutor the sum of \$25, being part of the annual donation of \$50 for the maintenance of the work in Ludlow. This payment completed the term of five years, for which this donation had been promised. In April, 1892, the sum of \$20 was sent to the Bishop Coadjutor for Home Missions.

In the Parish of Stanley a Branch was formed in May, 1891, with 20 members; there are now 26. The sum of \$117 has been devoted to repairs on the Rectory, and fencing and improving the grounds. The members are anxious to aid the building of a Church at Cross Creek, an important part of the parish. Not only the people of Cross Creek, but those living in the adjacent settlements of Williamsburg and Maple Grove will be greatly benefited by this Church. The Secretary, Mrs. Howe, further writes: "In conclusion, I may say that since this Association was organized in Stanley the women of the Church here have shown a far greater interest in the work of the Church than they formerly did, and the interest is steadily increasing."

Branches of the Association have been formed in Douglas and in Edmondston.

APPENDIX O.

Resolved, That the draft Manual prepared by the Committee should be considered by the Synod, and that the following clause be inserted at the commencement of the Manual, viz.: "It is understood that this Manual is not to be considered as legally binding, but only as a guide to members of the Church, for the purpose of assisting them in carrying out the Statute law, and other laws relating to the Church of England in this Province;" and that the Manual, as passed, be issued by the Synod.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS AND RULES OF ORDER.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

1. The business of every day shall be preceded by special prayer for the Divine guidance and blessing, according to a form authorized by the Bishop.

2. After prayer the Secretary of the Synod shall call over the Roll of the Clergy, to be furnished by the Bishop, and mark the names of those in attendance, and shall then call over the names of the several Parishes entitled to send Lay Representatives, and the Roll of the Lay Representatives and Substitutes certified to him to be elected.

3. The order of business on each day shall be as follows :

- (1). Calling the Rolls.
- (2). Reading, correcting, and approving the Minutes of the previous Meeting.
- (3). Appointing Standing Committees.
- (4). Presenting, reading, and receiving Memorials and Petitions.
- (5). Presenting Reports of Committees.
- (6). Giving notice of motions.
- (7). Taking up unfinished business.
- (8). Consideration of motions, and appointing Special Committees.

4. An address from the Bishop shall be in order at any time.

5. Notices of motion to be submitted to the Synod may be sent to the Secretary at least one month previous to its Annual Meeting ; and the Secretary shall cause such notices to be printed in the order in which they are received, and forward to the members of the Synod with the usual notice of the Synod meeting ; and motions of which notice has been given in such manner shall have priority of consideration, but shall not necessarily exclude other motions.

6. Notices of motion, if any, given by a member of the Synod, for proceeding at a subsequent meeting, shall be read over at such meeting, and may be taken up by any member present, in the same manner as if he had himself given the notice.

RULES FOR THE PRESERVATION OF ORDER.

1. When the Bishop or other person presiding has taken the chair, no member shall continue standing.

2. When any member is about to speak for the information of the Synod, he shall rise and address himself to the Chair.

3. No motion or amendment shall be considered as before the Synod unless seconded and reduced to writing.

4. No member, save the mover of a motion, who is entitled to reply, shall speak more than once on the same question without leave of the Synod, except in explanation of a material part of his speech, which may have been misunderstood, and then he is not to introduce new matter.

5. When a question is under consideration, no other motion shall be received, unless to adjourn, to lay it on the table, to postpone it to a certain time, to postpone it indefinitely, to commit it, to amend it, or to divide upon it; and motions for any of these purposes shall have precedence in the order here named.

6. Motions to adjourn, to adjourn the debate, or to lay on the table, shall be decided without debate.

7. When a motion shall be before the Synod, it cannot be withdrawn by the mover without the consent of the Synod.

8. Each member shall have the right to require at any period of the debate that a question in discussion be read for his information.

9. A member called to order whilst speaking shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

10. All questions of order shall be decided by the Chair.

11. When a proposed amendment is under consideration, a motion to amend the same may be made, but no after amendment to such second amendment shall be in order; yet a substitute to the whole matter may be proposed and received, provided it deals directly with the subject in hand.

12. All amendments to any question or amendment shall be decided on before the question or motion on which they arise is proposed for decision.

13. Whilst any question is being put from the Chair, the members shall continue in their seats, and shall not hold any private discourse; and when a motion is so put, no member shall retire until such motion is disposed of.

14. In voting, those who vote in the affirmative shall first rise, and then those who vote in the negative.

15. Whenever, on the occasion of any vote, the names shall be called for, such names shall be taken by call of the Roll of the Clergy and Lay Representatives, each of those present answering yea or nay as his name shall be mentioned, and such names shall be entered in the minutes.

16. A question being once determined shall not again be drawn into discussion in the same session without the special sanction of the Chair.

17. No protest or dissent shall be entered on the minutes of the proceedings; but, when required by any three members standing up, the names of affirmative and negative votes shall be recorded.

18. All committees shall be appointed by the Chair, unless named by the Synod, and the names shall be publicly announced while the Synod is in session.

19. The reports of committees shall be in writing, signed by the chairman of the committee or a majority of the members thereof.

20. No member of the Synod shall leave the place in which its meetings are held, during the time of its meetings, without permission from the Chair.
