THE METHODIST CHURCH,
HELD IN CANSO.

The TENTH SESSION of the NOVA SCOTIA CONFERENCE was opened in the Methodist Church, Canso, on Thursday, June 22nd, 1893, at 9 o'clock, a. m., the President, the REV. WILLIAM RYAN, in the Chair.

After devotional exercises, the retiring President addressed the Conference.

JOSEPH F. BENT

Was born in Granville, N. S., on the 26th April, 1806, and died near the same place, March 19th, 1893.

His conversion in early life was evidently genuine. His own account of his conversion is as follows:—"I was blessed with pious parents. From early infancy they taught me the fear of the Lord and prayer. I had a very early and vivid apprehension of the evil of sin, frequently prayed, and felt the drawings of the Holy Spirit, yet was often convicted of doing wrong. At about eleven years of age, I had a very alarming view of my state while in the house of God. I retired immediately in silent prayer, pouring out my soul to God, until I felt His love shed abroad in my heart." Three years after this experience he had a powerful manifestation of God to his soul, and at the same time a deep conviction and impression were made on his mind that he must engage in the work of calling sinners to repentance. His early efforts were owned of God, so that he was encouraged to give himself up fully to the work of the ministry, which he did in his 22nd year.

He discharged the duties of his high calling with great earnestness, fidelity and success, on the following circuits:—Annapolis and Digby, (one circuit), Peticodiac, N. B., Sussex Vale, Bathurst, St. Stephens and St. David's, Western Bay, Nfld., Westmoreland, St. Stephen, 2nd time, Aylesford, Sheffield and Gagetown, Woodstock and Andover, Sussex Vale, 2nd time, Hopewell, Lunenburg. In 1858, in consequence of failing health, he sought a Supernumerary relation which he occupied till death.

But during the whole of these years (35) he continued to preach the Gospel almost every Sabbath until a few months before his decease.

He was a devout Christian minister, firm in his convictions and decided in his religious opinions which were never at variance with the theology of Methodism.

His preaching was sound, earnest, evangelical, pointed and practical. Less eloquent than some others, his gift and power in prayer were remarkable. He did not attempt to remove the old landmarks of Methodism, and strongly disapproved of any innovation in its doctrine or discipline. After a brief illness he passed to his eternal reward.

JONATHAN R. BORDEN

Was born at Cornwallis, King's Co., N. S., 17th day of March, 1836, and died at Canning, Jan. 21st, 1893. From his boyhood, our brother was noted for his piety; but it was while a student at Sackville that he first made a public profession of his faith. Some few years afterwards he yielded to the call of the Spirit and offered himself as a candidate for the ministry. He was accepted by the Conference of 1870 and stationed at St. Margaret's Bay where he remained two years. His subsequent appointments were, Port LaTour, Guysboro', Shelburne, Nappan, Bridgewater, Barrington, and St. George's. At the Conference of 1890, he was granted leave of absence; but his health not materially improving, he reluctantly took a supernumerary relation the following year.

The two prominent characteristics of our lamented brother were, *first*, the metaphysical cast of his mind; and, *second*, the simplicity of his faith in God. In certain direction she seemed to possess an intuitive insight into the heart of things. His reading was with discrimination. He mastered what he read; but it never mastered him. He was not dominated by the last book. He was profoundly versed in philosophical and theological literature; but his faith in God was as the faith of a child in its mother. He knew whom he had believed. Here was no questioning. Here was no theorizing. His heart took hold on Christ. His head bowed to the vision of his heart.

As a member of Conference he was eminently useful. He loved his brethren. He never sought a position; but if placed in one, he shrank not from the performance of involved duty. As a preacher he was earnest, faithful and practical. Whilst he could not be called a revivalist, on many of his circuits he was favored with gracious manifestations of the converting grace of God.

His last illness was brief. He preached on Sabbath. The following Tuesday he was attacked with his old disease, *Biliary Calculi*. On Saturday he was not; for God had taken him. Whilst he left no dying testimony, the consistency of his life and the transparency of his character, give every reason to believe that the final message though unexpected did not find him unprepared.

R. O. JOHNSON.

The subject of this notice was born at Greenfield, Colchester County, N. S., on the 29th September, 1833. He was converted to God when he was thirteen. When quite young he had impressions of a call to the ministry and shaped his course in that direction, ultimately attending Mount Allison, Sackville, N. B. At the Conference of 1863, he was received as a candidate, and in 1867, having satisfactorily completed his probation, he was received into full connection and ordained.

Though never of robust constitution he continued in the active work until 1884, when failing health and family affliction necessitated his seeking a supernumerary relation. In 1866, he was appointed to the Wentworth Circuit, but in 1887 was obliged again to retire from the active work. During the remaining six years of his life he resided in Middle Musquodoboit and Truro, but was able to do very little to assist his brethren. Paralysis, the first stroke of which he received in the fall of 1892, caused his death, on the 1st June, 1893, having just completed the 20th year of his ministry and well nigh the 60th of his life.

Brother Johnson's life and ministry were peculiarly and strikingly a life and ministry of sorrow. He had great sorrows of his own which added to a natural sensitiveness made him exceptionally sympathetic.

While the closing scenes of his life were not marked by special manifestations of Divine favour he had enjoyed at earlier periods of his life, he nevertheless enjoyed a clear sense of the goodness of God and of his own acceptance.

While unable to speak any words of farewell, the power of articulation having left him in his last moments, all may be sure that he has changed mortality for life.

What are the arrangements for the examination of Candidates for the Ministry in the Course of Study?

TIME AND PLACE OF EXAMINATION.

The Examinations shall take place on the first Wednesday in May, beginning at 9 o'clock, a. m., and in six Sections, as follows :-

SECTION I. -The Halifax District. In Halifax, under the charge of Revs. J. L. Dawson, A. B., and J. A. Rogers.

SECTION II. -The Truro and Cumberland Districts. In Truro, under the charge of Revs. W. H. Hertz, D. D., and Wm. G. Lane.

SECTION III. -The Annapolis District. In Granville Ferry, under the charge of Revs. L. Daniel and J. Strothard.

SECTION IV. -The Guysboro' and Cape Breton Districts. In Sydney and Guysboro', under the charge of Revs. D. Hickey and J. G. Anguin.

SECTION V. -The Liverpool and Yarmouth Districts. In Liverpool, under the charge of Rev. G. W. F. Glendenning.

SECTION VI. -The Bermuda District. In Hamilton, under the charge of Rev. Wm. Dobson.

NOTE 1. -Superintendents of Circuits are required, immediately after the March Quarterly Meeting to forward to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, the names and addresses of Candidates recommended to be received on trial by their respective Quarterly Boards.

NOTE 2. -The Examiners are requested to forward their questions upon the books allotted to them to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, on or before the 31st day of December.

NOTE 3. -The Examiners are also requested to transmit to the Secretary the result of their examination of the papers submitted to them as soon as possible after their reception, so that the Secretary may tabulate and report.

NOTE 4. -The standard of qualification for young men recommended to be received into our Conference as Probationers shall not be lower than 50 per cent. of the marks on the Preliminary Course of Study in the aggregate, and thirty-three and one-third per cent. in each subject; also a standing of thirty-three and one-third per cent. shall be required in order to pass in each subject of the subsequent course.

CONSTITUTION FOR SUSTENTATION FUND.

I.

This Fund shall be called "The Sustentation Fund of the Nova Scotia Conference."

II.

The Fund shall consist of such monies as may be raised in the bounds of the Conference in the manner following, viz. :—

- (a)—By Legacies or Special Donations.
- (b)—By Donations or Annuity.
- (c)—Subscriptions and Collections on various Circuits.

IV.

In making disbursements the Committee shall be governed by the following regulations.

I.—Probationers shall be estimated to receive a salary of \$300. Ordained unmarried men in full connection \$350. Married men in full work \$650.

II.—Should there be any balance after raising the salaries to the above mentioned figures, such balance to be divided pro rata until young men receive \$350. Ordained unmarried men in full connection \$400. Ordained married men \$750. Provided always no claimant receive from all sources beyond disciplinary allowance.

III.—The basis of distribution shall be the amount estimated by Financial District Meetings.

IV.—The Committee shall have power to consider any special cases which may arise, and to take such action as may be considered necessary.

V.

The Committee shall, through its Secretary-Treasurer, make an annual report of its work to the Conference. This report shall include that of an audit of accounts.

VI.

That the Ministers endeavor to secure subscriptions to this Fund on all Circuits, and that a list of subscriptions of one dollar and upwards be published in the minutes of the Conference at the expense of the Fund.

VII.

That the Financial District Meetings be required to make arrangements for at least one public meeting in behalf of the Sustentation Fund on each Circuit at which collections will be taken and subscriptions solicited.

REPORT OF SUPERNUMERARY FUND COMMITTEE.

The Committee is glad to be able to report that the Circuits of the U. S. Conference have again substantially met the obligation of the Conference to raise for the Fund at the rate of ten cents per member on the membership reported at the General Conference of 1890. The schedules, while exhibiting an increase of one school, show a decrease of one hundred and eight teachers and two hundred and twenty-six children. The number of conversions reported is four hundred and thirty-one, a decrease of fifty-two on the previous year. 1,790 are returned as members of the church, an increase of 22.

The number learning catechism is 3,302, which is a decrease of 285, while

on the other hand an increase of 150 volumes in the libraries have been noted, besides an increased circulation of our Sunday School papers.

How to retain the larger scholars is an inquiry of special importance to Sunday School workers, and we would earnestly solicit the co-operation and prayers of the parents in this important enterprise of Sunday School work.

We again direct the attention of our workers to the advisability of holding a children's day in all our circuits, on the second Sunday in September, and of sustained attendance upon Sunday School conventions.

We also recommend our superintendents to report, not the number who have taken temperance pledges during the year, but the total number of pledged abstainers in the school.

REPORT ON STATE OF WORK.

Your Committee having had under review the state of the work within the bounds of our Conference during the year, beg leave to report as follows:—

We find that on many of our circuits and mission fields, particularly in the Yarmouth and Annapolis Districts, there have been gracious outpourings of the Holy Spirit resulting in the conversion of over 1000 souls. We regret, however, that owing to the remarkably large number of removals from the Province, there is a net decrease in the membership of 43 as compared with that of last year.

With regard to the necessity of a more general recognition of the Class-meeting and Love-feasts referred to in some of the District books, we would strongly emphasize the report of last year. Whilst duly recognizing the great usefulness of the spiritual agencies of more modern origin that have recently been introduced among our people, we are at the same time convinced that none of them can take the place of those peculiarly distinctive Methodist means of grace which have been, wherever properly utilized, so marvelously blessed of God. Whilst we would not utter a word that might be construed into a reflection upon other agencies, we are nevertheless of the opinion that the class-meeting especially is calculated to do a work for our Church which they can never accomplish. We would not however, convey the impression that our investigations along these lines have led to the belief that there has been any marked deterioration in the spiritual condition of our people. On the contrary an impartial survey of the work has convinced us that, whilst there are some things to be deplored, there is nevertheless in our Churches everywhere throughout our Province, much vital godliness which is being daily manifested to the world in works of faith and labors of love.

With regard to the recommendation of the Guysboro' and Cape Breton Districts, the appointment of an itinerant missionary for the District, we believe that were it possible to carry out the suggestion much good would be the result.

On the whole, we have, as a Conference every reason to thank the great Head of the Church for what He has done for us during the last twelve months. Let us in His name and fear, with renewed consecration, go forth to the work that lies before us, conscious that as the work is His, He will neither neglect the work nor ignore the worker.

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE REPORT.

The Conference of 1892, having expressed itself in favor of additional evangelistic help, the secretary was instructed to put himself in communication with such agents as were available. Besides Bro. Herd, two others were recommended, but one was not considered by your Committee as suitable to our work. The other, an estimable young lady, we had about engaged, when failing health interfered with her plans and ours. This left us where we were last year, with but one evangelist, whom we engaged on the same terms as previous years, \$5 per week and board, and travelling expenses provided him from September 25th. He has labored with varying success for 36 weeks. We regret, however, to report that Bro. Herd's health was very indifferent for months, having been taken very ill while on the Boylston Circuit.

From September 25th to October 4th he labored at the Jost City Mission. From October 5th to 25th, he was on the Onslow Circuit with Bro. Swallow. At East Mountain appointment there were four conversions, and an interesting prayer-meeting formed where there had not been one previously.

On October 31st Bro. Herd went, under Bro. Angwin's direction, to New Harbor, and spent four weeks, resulting in a general revival of the work of God. Nine persons professed conversion and united with the church.

On November 30th he went to Boylston under Bro. Pentelow. The report is that, although 12 persons manifested a desire for salvation, only two professed conversion and joined the church. The membership, however, have been helped and quickened. On January 16th, 1893, went to Bay Shore under Bro. Angwin's instructions. This congregation has preaching once in four weeks. Here the Lord gave them six souls. On January 26th went to White Haven. On February 8th commenced work at Gardiner Mines, where twenty professed conversion, six joining us, and other denominations taking the balance. At Bridgeport services were held for 10 days without any visible results. At Cow Bay the Baptist minister offered the use of their church for special services, our people paying light, fuel and sexton. Services were held for three weeks, 40 confessing conversion, 4 uniting with us, the rest with other churches. On April 3rd went to Gabarus, under Bro. Croft. Spent four weeks. Weather and roads very bad, which interfered with the work. The results were a quickening and reviving of the membership generally. Some 3 or 4 backsliders reclaimed. Bro. Croft reported the absence from home of a large number of young men, the very class he was exceedingly anxious to reach. It is exceedingly refreshing to read Bro. Croft's report and his estimate of the value of souls.

May 6th left for New Germany under Bro. Hemeon, who reports up to end of May some 14 conversions, and gives testimony to Bro. Herd's usefulness.

Your Epworth League Committee desires to present the following report :
 That there are now 60 Leagues with a membership of 2,197, an increase of 9 Leagues and 400 members during the year. The amount raised for League purposes is \$534.57, a decrease of \$8.06.

It is recommended that the name Epworth League of Christian Endeavour be adopted wherever possible, and while we preserve our identity and maintain our principles as Methodists, we also recommend fraternal relations to kindred societies of other Churches. We also desire to reaffirm with increased emphasis the resolution adopted last year, viz :

That this Conference desires to place on record its profound conviction of the value of the Epworth League, as a means for the intellectual and spiritual culture of our young people, and a field for their practical Christian aggressiveness, and would urge the formation of Leagues and the development of their work wherever possible.

Resolved, That this Conference hereby urges upon the several Circuits that all such applications be refused, except to those who produce unmistakable credentials.

SPIRITUAL REPORTS.

Resolved, That written spiritual reports be required of Superintendents of Circuits as well as from Missions at the Annual District Meeting.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS.

THANKS TO EX-PRESIDENT RYAN.

Resolved, That this Conference hereby expresses its deep sense of the value of the services rendered to the Conference and the Church, during the

past year, by the Rev. Wm. Ryan, who now retires from the presidential chair. Particularly would it place on record its appreciation of his unflinching urbanity, his great fervor of spirit, his impartiality in rulings, and his faithfulness in administration.

The thanks of the Conference were extended to the Canso friends for their generous hospitality, the Rev. A. C. Borden, B. JUBILEE FUND.

It was ordered that chairmen of districts obtain information, at the financial district meetings, from the superintendents of Circuits, as to the amounts of subscriptions towards the Jubilee Fund of the Mount Allison institutions, and report the same to Rev. J. L. Dawson.

Revs. Dr. Lathern, D. W. Johnson and J. L. Dawson were appointed to confer with the executive of the Board of Regents for the further prosecution of the Jubilee Campaign.

EMPLOYMENT OF STUDENTS.

It was ordered that the chairmen of districts be instructed to employ students during their vacation, and it is further recommended that a claim be sent up to the General Missionary Board to supplement amounts raised by missions so supplied.

It was further ordered that Revs. J. L. Dawson, Dr. T. W. Smith and D. W. Johnson be a committee to devise a method by which employment may be given to our probationers attending college during the months of vacation, and by which adequate financial support may be provided for them.

SECRETARY-TREASURER OF SUPERNUMERARY FUND.

It was resolved, That in the opinion of this Conference, the interests of the Supernumerary Fund will be greatly conserved by the presence of the general secretary-treasurer, and earnestly expresses the hope that he will visit this Conference year by year, and inform its members of the condition of the Fund, and that the secretary may furnish frequent reports to be inserted in the **WESLEYAN**.

CLAIMANT ON SUPERNUMERARY FUND.

Resolved, That, in the opinion of this Conference, a minister, having received, as a supernumerary, from this fund, an amount equal to the annual payments with interest contributed by him, and then ceases to have connection with our Church, should not be regarded as having any further claims.

LOCAL PREACHERS.

It was ordered that the names of local preachers of five years standing appear on the printed station list.

APPEAL.

The name of a woman appearing on the list of lay delegates, elected by the Liverpool District, and being reported without comment by the Credential Committee, the ruling of the chair was asked as to the legal right of said woman to a seat in the Conference, and the president ruling that she had such right, the Rev. J. Lathern, D. D., appealed from the decision of the chair as follows, viz. :—" Notice is hereby given that, in accordance with the provision of discipline, page 40, sub-section *a*, an appeal is taken from the ruling of the president in the case of Mary Dauphinee, elected by the Liverpool District as one of its lay representatives, on the ground that it declares the eligibility of women for representation in conference contrary to the established usage of the Methodist Church. and the accepted interpretation of law on the subject of lay representation."

CHILDREN'S DAY.

It was recommended that the second Sunday in September be observed as Children's Day, in all our Churches.

SYSTEMATIC BENEFICENCE.

It was recommended that special sermons on systematic beneficence be preached in all our churches, on the third Sunday of October.

The next session of Conference, will be held in the town of Amherst, on the third Thursday in June, 1894, at 9 a. m., the Ministerial Session to be held on the Wednesday, immediately preceding, at 9 a. m.
