STEPHEN HUMPHREY, A. M., who was born in  
Amherst, N. S., February 29th, 1829.

Blessed with pious parentage he began in early  
life to seek the Lord, but subsequently fell into  
carelessness and walked according to the course  
of this world until he arrived at his 19th year.

Under the Ministry of the Rev. Thos. H. Davis  
he was brought to repentance, and through faith



in Christ to the experience of redemption in His blood the forgiveness of sins.

In order to secure preparation for the work of the ministry, to which he believed himself called, he yielded up his secular engagements and spent five years in study, partly at Sackville and partly in the United States. Ordained to the work of the Christian Ministry by Bishop Janes, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, he returned to his native country in 1858 and labored within the Dorchester, River John, Hillsboro', and Hamilton (Bermuda) Circuits.

For the last three years of his life he was quite unfitted for pulpit work, still he clung to the hope that he might again be raised up to do service for the Church, and with this in view he embarked for Bermuda last October. For a time he seemed to gain strength but new physical symptoms developed themselves some four weeks previous to his death and thenceforward he sank rapidly.

In the full possession of his faculties, and with the joyful assurance of abiding peace with God, he departed this life April 16th, 1875.

Bro. HUMPHREY'S ministry of the word was lucid and powerful and his pastoral habits such as endeared him to the people of his charge wherever he labored. The mortal conflict was brought to a close far from his home circle, but by the grace of God he was enabled to triumph. "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints."

I.—BOOK COMMITTEE.

That the Conference has heard with pleasure from the Rev. A. W. Nicolson, Book Steward and Editor for the Eastern Section of our Church, an account of the state and prospects of the Book Room and Provincial Wesleyan Office, and while thankful for the progress which he has been enabled to report in regard to both these interests of the Church, this Conference would assure Bro. Nicolson of its sympathy with him in his important work and would hereby express its thankfulness to him for his services during the past year.

II.—SABBATH SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

1. That the Rev. W. W. Percival be the Secretary, and the Rev. S. R. Ackman the Treasurer, for the ensuing year.

2. The Committee, recognizing the great importance of our Sabbath School work, rejoices to find that many of our schools are conducted in a very efficient manner; that during the year a number of our scholars have been converted to God, and united with us in Church fellowship. Yet, we regret to have to report a small decrease in the number of schools and scholars as compared with that of last year, owing, probably, to the numerous changes in Circuit and District boundaries.

3. The Committee would also express the hope that according to the Discipline, each District will take the necessary steps to hold a District Sabbath School Convention, at such time and place as will best secure the efficiency of our Sabbath School work.

4. Your Committee would also remark that while surprised at the small amount contributed to the General Sabbath School Fund, it is believed to have arisen from the comparative non-acquaintance of our people with the object contem-

4. The Conference recommends this fund to the intelligent and favorable consideration of the members of our Church.

The hope is cherished that the receipts for the ensuing year will be greatly increased and that the rule requiring an average contribution, of at least ten cents, from each member—which is hereby re-affirmed—will soon be generally observed.

IV.—CHILDREN'S FUND COMMITTEE.

1. That the Rev. James Taylor and George Thomas, Esq., be the Treasurers, and the Rev. Duncan D. Currie the Secretary.

2. That the period during which our Ministers shall have claims upon the Children's Fund, and the amount payable per annum shall continue the same in this Conference as obtained in the Conference of Eastern British America at the time of the dissolution of that Conference.

3. That a Committee composed of the Chairmen and Financial Secretaries of Districts for the previous year, and the Treasurer and Secretary of this Fund, shall meet annually, immediately after the final draft of stations is laid before the Conference, to determine the amount that shall be raised for the Children's Fund for the ensuing year and to apportion to the several Districts and Circuits the amounts to be raised by them for the year. The appointment to be made in accordance with a resolution adopted by the Conference of the present year in relation thereto.

4. That provisions be made this year for the support of one hundred and fifty-one and a half children.

5. That the amount required be apportioned to the several Districts and Circuits as follows:—

ST. JOHN DISTRICT.—St. John, Germain Street, shall provide for four children; Centenary, five; Portland, two; Exmouth Street, Carleton, Fairville, Sussex, Apohaqui, Hampton, Grand Lake (East), Jerusalem, Welsford and Kingston, two and a quarter each; Carmarthen Street and St. Martin's one and a quarter each. Total, 36.

FREDERICTON DISTRICT.—Fredericton, three and a half; Marysville, Nashwaak, Keswick, Sheffield, Gagetown, Benton, Jacksonville, Florenceville, Andover and Tobique, two and a quarter each; and Woodstock, Gibson, Stanley, Grand Lake (West), Canterbury and Hartland, one and a quarter each. Total, 32½.

#### V.—EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY COMMITTEE.

Your Committee would call attention to the fact that the Educational Society established five years since in connection with the Conference of Eastern British America was, by the change in the organization of our Church, merged in the Educational Society of the Methodist Church of Canada. The second article of the Constitution of this Society states "That the objects of this society shall be to assist in maintaining our Universities, Theological Schools and Higher Mission Schools, and to defray the expenses of the Examination of Candidates for the Ministry in our Church and to aid such candidates in obtaining an education." In accordance with Article V, a Branch Society has been organized in the Conference and we now present our first Annual Report.

# APPENDIX A.

## STANDING ORDERS, ETC.

---

### I.—DISTRICT MEETINGS.

The Chairmen of Districts are peremptorily required to procure three complete copies of the minutes of the several annual and other meetings of the District Committees, financial and ordinary, duly signed by the Chairman and Secretary; one of these copies shall be inserted in the District Records, the second shall be reserved for the use of the Conference, and the third shall be delivered to the Secretary for preservation in the archives of the Conference. Furthermore, it is required that the last mentioned copies be handed in on the forenoon of the day preceding that on which our first preparatory committee meeting may be appointed to be held, that the secretaries may prepare classified lists of all matters which are to come before the Conference, and thereby expedite business.

2. That as much trouble has been caused at different sessions of Conference in consequence of alterations made in the District Minutes, it is determined that when the Minutes of the several Districts shall have been signed by the Chairmen

and Secretaries, they shall not be altered, except by special permission of the Conference.

#### II.—PROVINCIAL WESLEYAN.

That in regard to subscriptions for the *Provincial Wesleyan*, enquiry to be instituted in the District Committees respectively, as to the fidelity of each brother responsible for the collection of such monies—the accounts being previously sent to the chairmen, and distributed at the Annual District Meetings.

#### III.—MISSIONARY LISTS.

Each Superintendent is required to present, at the Annual District Meeting, prepared on foolscap paper and made up in Canada currency, a perfect list of all Missionary monies collected on his Circuit; and each Chairman is required to present such lists to the Missionary Secretary, in a state ready for publication, on the day previous to the meeting of the Missionary Committee.

#### IV.—CHILDREN'S FUND.

The Financial Secretaries of the several Districts are required to send to the Secretary of the Children's Fund, immediately after the Annual District Meeting, the names of all the Ministers in their respective Districts who are claimants upon the Children's Fund for the current year; and to state the number of children for whom allowance is claimed; and, as far as possible, the name and date of birth of each of the said children.

v.—BOOK ROOM ACCOUNTS.

*Resolved*, That every Minister and Preacher is peremptorily required to settle his account with the Book Steward each year, at or before the meeting of Conference.

VI.—TIME FOR COLLECTIONS IN AID OF THE CONNEXIONAL FUNDS.

Supernumerary Ministers' and Ministers' Widows' Funds :—

- (1) Collection in Classes,.....September
- (2) Public Collection,..... December
- Contingent Fund—Yearly collection, classes, ..... March
- Contingent Fund—Yearly collection,.....August
- Public Collections for Education Society,.....April
- The Annual Conference Collection,.....May

VII.—FINANCIAL ECONOMY.

The Conference recommends to the Quarterly Official Meetings of the several Circuits the following plan, by which it is hoped they may more effectually secure the amount necessary to meet the allowance of the ministers and preachers.

1. Let the Quarterly Boards at the beginning of each financial year estimate the amount needed for the year.
2. Then ascertain from each member of the church, and, as far as practicable, from each attendant of the congregation, what each proposes to give as his or her weekly or monthly contribution.
3. Let these sums be entered by a steward appointed for that purpose in a book which he shall keep as Treasurer of the Quarterly Board.
4. If the total amount of these sums does not

equal the amount needed, then let the steward apportion the deficiency among all such as are willing, for Christ's sake, to assume such deficiency, setting down to each person, with his or her consent, the additional amount which they think he or she ought weekly or monthly to pay.

5. Let the Steward then adopt and carry out a plan by which every one shall have the opportunity of regularly contributing each week or month by envelope or otherwise, not grudgingly or of necessity, the sum which has been pledged by him or her. Let these contributions be paid over regularly to the steward appointed to receive them, and be brought up by him to the Quarterly Meeting. The said steward shall keep an individual account of all these pledges and contributions, and shall pay over the same, under the direction of the Quarterly Official Meetings, to the preacher or preachers authorized to receive them.

6. That Quarterly Official Meetings, adopting the envelope system, be recommended not to include in their estimate the claims of Missions, but to provide for these as in time past by special collections and subscriptions.

7. That in the opinion of this Conference, the minimum salary of the ministers should be \$750.

8. That in the opinion of this Conference the minimum amount of Young Men's salary should be \$200.

9. That in the opinion of this Conference the salary of ordained, but unmarried ministers, should be \$520

10. When a deficiency occurs upon a Circuit having two preachers (a married and single man) it shall be borne by each according to a *pro rata* amount.

## APPENDIX C.

### MISSIONARY SOCIETY.

The Rev. Howard Sprague, A. M., is the Secretary, and the Rev. Joseph Hart, the Treasurer for the present year.

#### REPORT.

This being the first anniversary of the Auxillary Missionary Society of the New Brunswick and P. E. Island Conference in connection with the Methodist Church of Canada, the material at the command of the Committee for the preparation of a report of the work of the Society is not so abundant as it may be expected hereafter to be.

Missionary work has been carried on by different branches of the Methodist Church in what is now the Dominion of Canada, for a period of 50 years. The Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada, whose missionary operations now constitute by far the larger part of the work of the united Church, celebrated its jubilee last year.

The mission field of the Methodist Church of Canada embraces the Dominion, the Island of Newfoundland, St. Pierre, the Bermudas, the coast of Labrador and the Empire of Japan.

The work prosecuted throughout this extended field may be classed under the following heads:—

1. Domestic Missions connected with the several Conferences in Ontario, Quebec, and the Maritime Provinces, with missions of a very similar character to the settlers of British Columbia and Manitoba.

2. Missions to the Indian tribes of the Saskatchewan, Hudson's Bay Territory, British Columbia and the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec. These missions number 40, and employ 29 missionaries, 12 local assistant missionaries, 17 interpreters and 19 teachers.

3. Missions to the French and German populations of Ontario and Quebec. Of these eight are amongst the French, and six among the Germans. In this latter de-partment of our work, a paper is published in the German language and has a large circulation through the mission.

4. Foreign Missions, the field being Japan. Two of the best men that the Canada Conference could select for this work have been for about two years laboring in that interesting empire, and have laid the foundation of what promises to be a successful and growing empire. Already a considerable number of Japanese have embraced the Christian religion, and united themselves with our Church. They find that the peculiar institution of Methodism has played an important part in the history of our church; the class meeting is also a very precious means of grace in the Empire of Japan. Several of these converted Japanese are men of culture and position and promise to be, in due time, of great help to the work of the mission.

On the Missions, there are 31 day schools and 31 teachers, 25 interpreters, 5 ministers on circuits, supplying small bands of Indians, making a paid agency in this department of the work, exclusive of the Maritime Provinces, amounting to 320, sowing the seed of life from Labrador and Newfoundland to the borders of Alaska, and in the densely populated Islands of Japan.

being an increase on the amount raised last year for Home and Foreign Missions by the Circuits now constituting the Conference, of \$719.06.

The total income of the Society this year will approximate the sum of \$200,000.

In reviewing the work of the year and the efforts made by our own congregations to sustain this great and growing enterprise of the church, your Committee feel that there exists cause of hearty gratitude to God, and of confidence and hope. They commend this great work anew to the sympathy, the prayers and the liberality of our people, and pray that upon all our wide field of improving labor, the gracious and reviving influence of the Spirit may come down, making the wilderness and the solitary places glad, and the desert to rejoice and blossom as the rose.

## APPENDIX D.

### PASTORAL ADDRESS.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE METHODIST CHURCH OF CANADA WITHIN THE BOUNDS OF THE CONFERENCE OF NEW BRUNSWICK AND PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND.

*Dearlly Beloved,*—Assembled in Annual Conference, as the united pastorate of that portion of the Methodist Church embraced in the Provinces of New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, and feeling deeply solicitous for the spiritual welfare of the flock committed to our charge, we greet you in the name of the Lord Jesus. “Grace unto you, and peace be multiplied.”

We give thanks unto God that he has called you to the possession and enjoyment of Gospel blessings in connection with Methodism. We trust that this distinguished favour of Divine Providence will ever be highly appreciated by you.

Partakers with you of the common salvation, and prompted by the constraining love of Jesus, we embrace this opportunity of calling your attention to those interests of our Church, which are, in our judgment, at the present time of special importance.

We are hopeful that the union recently effected

between the Methodist Conferences of the Western Provinces of the Dominion of Canada and the Conference of E. B. America, changing greatly the government of our Church, will tend to the wider extension, greater usefulness and firmer consolidation of our beloved Methodism.

In reviewing the year we find abundant cause for gratitude to the Giver of all good. The lives and health of the Preachers have been graciously preserved. None have been removed by death from the active work, or compelled through failing health to seek a supernumerary relation, and only one of the Supernumeraries, the Rev. Stephen Humphrey, A. M., has exchanged mortality for life.

Our hearts have been affected with feelings of sadness occasioned by the absence from our midst of many brethren with whom we have been accustomed to enjoy delightful fellowship in our annual Conferences. Our sorrow has been lessened, however, by the consideration that they are still engaged with us in the same blessed work, though in different portions of the wide Methodistic field in British America.

In reviewing the operations of our Missionary work during the year we have been greatly encouraged, both in regard to the good effected and the liberality manifested by our people. It was feared last year that the suspension of special meetings for Home Missions would result in a decrease of Missionary receipts. Such, we rejoice to inform you, is not the case. There is an encouraging increase in the amount contributed for the support of Missions this year, as compared

with the united proceeds of both Foreign and Home Missions for the previous year. To continue the operations already commenced and progressing favorably, and also to enter the opening doors that invite the messengers of salvation, the watchword must still be "Advance."

We would have you to feel with us the importance of this great truth, that the best arranged human plans for the accomplishment of good are utterly ineffective without the presence and power of the Holy Ghost. Therefore, we desire that you will join with us in earnest and continuous prayer for the constant outpouring of the Spirit upon us as a Church, and upon the unconverted multitudes that throng our sanctuaries. The promise of the Father, contained in the 28th and 29th verses of the second chapter of the Book of Joel, has been fulfilled only to a very limited extent. But from the signs of the times we feel assured that the great Mediator is rapidly preparing the world and the Church for its fullest accomplishment. This encouraging truth, rightly understood, will not lead to the restraint of prayer, inasmuch as we know that God will be enquired of to fulfil his promises. The value of prayer cannot be overestimated. The life of God in the soul cannot be maintained, much less be vigorous, without it. Take heed lest the vanities or the anxieties of earth interfere with the important duties of secret and family intercession. Cultivate a deep sense of your entire dependence on God as the bounteous giver of all good, and cherish a grateful spirit, without which none of God's gifts are really enjoyed.

If you would retain the favour of God, grow in grace, and be useful; you must be workers together with him.

The present state of the world affectingly appeals to the Church for the devoted services of earnest men and women. There is room in the Gospel vineyard for all to work. Every individual has his day and his work, and every day has its morning, noon and evening. Happy are they who begin early, faint not at noon, and at eventide are found at the post of duty. Our religious enterprises require not only attention and earnest toil, but increased liberality as well. As the sun of prosperity is shining upon many of you, see to it that the Lord's tithes are brought into the store-house, otherwise the increase of wealth will produce more than a corresponding decrease in grace. Remember and practice the sage advice of our venerable founder: "Get all you can, save all you can, and give all you can."

Maintain then in efficiency the Institutions of our Church, by your contributions and prayers. Forget not our Educational work, the vital importance of which is apparent, especially as connected with a ministerial supply for our pulpits. The approval of the Head of the Church has been pleasingly manifested during the past year at Sackville, not only in the general prosperity of our Institutions there, but also in the bestowment of saving influences in the conversion of sinners.

We exhort you, as parents, not only to give your children to God in Holy Baptism, and by religious training, but ask him in believing prayer to make them useful, and if it be his will, to call



into the ministry the most talented and promising lads of your households.

Endeavour to place in your families a wholesome literature. Such you will always find in the papers, periodicals and books recommended by our Editor and Book Steward.

We are glad to perceive among you a growing desire, practically manifested, to place ministers and their families above worldly embarrassment. This is in accordance with New Testament principles, "Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things." While attending to this duty cease not to pray for us.

We earnestly entreat you to attend constantly, and to value highly, the class and prayer meeting, and the sacraments of the Church. We fear that in some cases there is serious neglect in reference to all these means of grace.

Indifference to these things most certainly indicates a low state of grace. "Forsake not the assembling of yourselves together."

We are thankful to God that we are able to report an increase in our Church membership, as compared with last year, of three hundred and thirty, with more than seven hundred on trial; yet we are humbled that the increase is not greater. Surely if we, as ministers and people, were all enriched with the gifts of power from on high, the ingathering of souls to the fold of Christ would be much more abundant than it has been in the past.

We would also bring before you the claims of the Temperance Reform, especially in its

present efforts to obtain such a prohibitory enactment as will doubtless greatly lessen the terrible evils of intemperance. With gentle firmness denounce those habits and customs of society which are insiduously leading our youth into the pathway of drunkenness.

We were much refreshed in spirit by the presence and counsels of the Rev. Dr. Ryerson, of Toronto, President of the General Conference. His excellent Address in a Special Conference Session, and his pulpit ministrations were profitable and were highly appreciated by ministers and people. Our prayers shall follow this aged and venerable servant of God to his happy home in the land he so much loves and whose best interests he has so efficiently served for the last fifty years.

We have prayerfully endeavoured to appoint the ministers to those circuits in which, in our judgment, they would best subserve the interests of our cause, which is the cause of God. We may possibly have erred, as we lay no claim to infallibility, but our motives have been pure.

We advise you not to be over-anxious about a supply for the pulpit. The most certain way of securing the right man is to make special prayer to the Head of the Church.

And now, Brethren, we commend you to God and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up and to give you an inheritance among them which are sanctified.

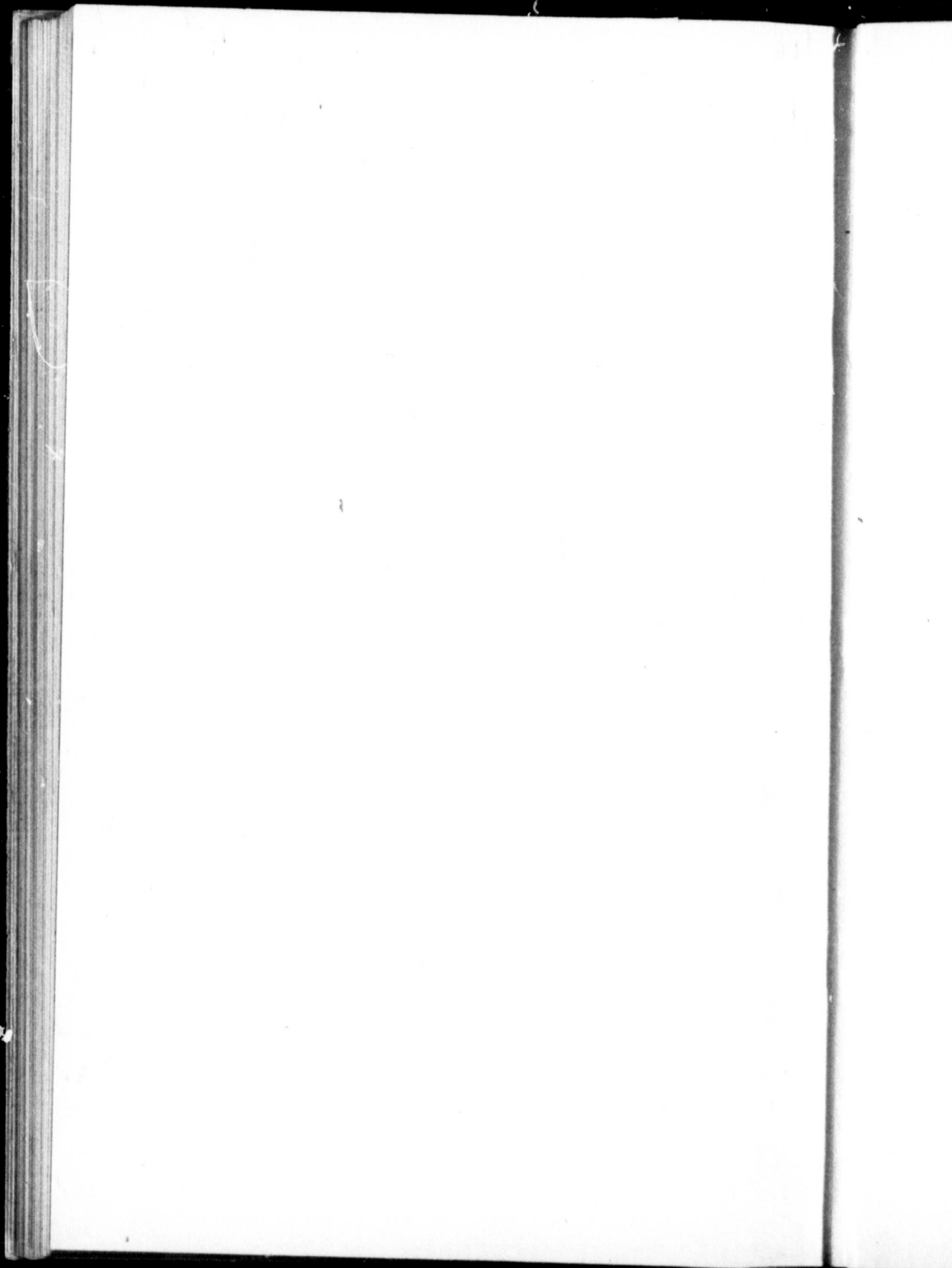
