St. Andrews, Saturday, Oct. 14, 1848.
The English Mail had not arrived at the time our paper was put to press.

THE WEATHER for the past week has been fine but cold during the nights and mornings. On Thursday night the water in the brooks was frozen nearly half an inch in thickness, and the vines, flowers &c. in the gardens in this vicinity were nearly all killed. Many of the Farmers have commenced pulling their Turnips, which are of an excellent quality, and average crop. Potatoes in most districts are far below an average crop, and in some places a total failure.

We are informed that the New Brunswick Electric Telegraph Company are progressing rapidly with the work. The cedar posts required for the line, have been placed some distance beyond Crocker's Hill. By the 25th of November next, it is expected the line will be completed to St. John, when our neighbours there, will be able to transmit and receive messages to and from New York in a few minutes!

A respectable mechanic, who recently left this Town, writing from the city of Portland, one of the most thriving places in the State of Maine, says, "all kinds of business is so dull and I may add that mechanics are working for their victuals alone! The labourers are being discharged from the Rail roads, daily, by hundreds."
