A CHAT WITH LORD ORBELESPORE, than whom I doubt if there's a sadder man in South Africa. The disasters at his camp, and to his camp guard resulted from a breach under his own yes of a rule framed by himself for the campaign, and which every intive war renders necessary. The waggons, instead of being packed into laager, were left higgledy-pigledy. The strength of the camp guard was drawn away by a feint by Eulu skirminhers, whose reserve closed in our rear and deatroyed piecomeal the whole force. Eight hundred and twenty-five European soldiers and nearly as many natives and camp followers lost their lives, not from everwhelming numbers, for on the next night 10 good men kept of 3,000 natives, but from bad generalship. Lord Chelmsford and all his staff, with hundreds of colonists, myself among them, underrated the foe. The town authorities were told by the General on Wednesday last that the town was in danger of a Zulu attack. I was recalled by telegram, and marched 25 miles in sea hours. I shall unphealthe death
