

CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

T.

The Society shall be called the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

II.

No constitution, bye law, rule or regulation of the Society, or any abrogation, repeal, change or alteration of the same, shall be of any force until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, and administering the Diocese for the time being, by writing under his hand.

TIL

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same a Member of the Society.

IV.

The Society shall have a President who shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese; two or more Vice Presidents, of whom the Archdeacon shall be the first; one or more Treasurers; one or more Secretaries; two Auditors of Accounts; and an Executive Committee of twenty four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members of the Society, or Subscribers of, at least, One Pound to the funds of the Society; who, with the exception of the President and Vice Presidents, shall be annually elected at the Angiversary Meeting.

The Officers of the Society and the Clergy of the Diocese shall be ex-officio Members of the Committee: five to be a quorum, and three of the five Laymen.

The Society shall embrace the following objects, and none other, viz:

1. Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled

Clergyman, and aid to new and poor Missions.

2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships at King's College, Fredericton; and assistance, where necessary, to those who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially Sons of Clergymen.

3. Aid to Sunday and other Schools in which Church principles are taught, and the training and encouraging of School-masters and Catechists.

4. The supply of Books and Tracts, in strict conformity

with the principles of the Established Church.

5. Aid to the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels.

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.

7. The creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of Clergymen who are poor; and towards the education of the Children of such Clergymen; and towards the making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity.

8. The creation of a fund for the Widows and Orphans of

the Clergy.

VII.

The Society will employ no Clergyman or Missionary services without the Bishop's license and appointment, and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholarships to His Lordship's approbation.

VIII.

The Society will circulate no Books which are not in the Catalogue of the Society for promoting Christian Knowledge, except such as the Bishop shall approve.

IX.

It shall be competent to any Member of the Society to limit his subscription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote.

Х.

The Members of the Society in each Mission, or in each Parish of each Mission, at the discretion of the Missionary, shall constitute a Local Committee.

XI.

It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XII.

The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately; at the latter place on

the Thursday after the third Tuesday in January, and at the former place on the Thursday after the second Tuesday in February in each year.

XIII.

The Committee of each Parish or Mission shall hold an Annual Meeting, on some convenient day, provious to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendation to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

XIV.

Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two Lay Members of the Society to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

XV.

For this purpose the Missionaries and Lay Deputies shall meet in General Committee on the two days, or more if need be, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, to make the annual appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XVI.

The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January, on the day after the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on the Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

XVII.

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a collection on each occasion for the General Purposes of the Society.

XVIII.

No Article of the Constitution of this Society shall be rescinded, altered or amended, except with the concurrence of two thirds of the Members present at a Meeting of the General Committee assembled under Article XV; and notice of any motion shall be given at the previous Anniversary Meeting.

REPORT.

This Society has now attained its Twentieth Anniversary, and as each year brings about the period of our Annual Meetings, the hope is strengthened that a blessing from

above rests upon the work in which we are engaged.

During the past year the usual Missionary Stations have been occupied: except in two instances, where there was an unavoidable interruption for a few months. the ministrations of the Church have been regularly performed in fourteen Missions, by the aid afforded by this Society. In addition to this, the Lord Bishop has provided an Assistant in the extensive Mission of Saint Stephen, in whose labours a deep interest has been substantially manifested.

By the grants made in aid of Churches, the one at Campobello, assisted by the liberality of a Layman, whose zeal deserves our special thanks, and in every way suited for its holy purpose, has been finished and consecrated, and the Stone Church in the lower part of Douglas has been brought to completion. The addition and improvements in the Parish

Church of Lancaster have been also carried out.

By the sums appropriated for Books, the grants to the Local Committees have been supplied by the Depositories, and the sales have been as great as the limited stock would allow. Little can be done to supply the increasing demand for Bibles, Prayer Books, and other publications of the Society for promoting Christian Knowledge, until the Society can afford to place a larger amount at the disposal of the Depository Committees.

Messrs. McMillan of St. John having undertaken the publication of the Diocesan Hymn Book, the grant made last year for this purpose was not called for. The publishers have some time since completed their engagement to the satisfaction of the Lord Bishop and the Committee, and have sold aready more than one thousand copies of the work.

By the kind Providence of God, no further demand has been made this year on the fund for the Widows and Orphans

of the Clergy.

As yet in two instances only has provision been required for this object; an object which so readily appeals to the best sympathies of all the members of the Society. The Lord Bishop has afforded aid in two cases from the grant made to assist in the education of the children of certain Clergymen. The Society, it is hoped, will keep in view this most desirable object, in which many influential members

of the Church have expressed a deep interest.

Thus we find good reason to give thanks to our Heavenly Father for having permitted us to do even so little for the glory of His Holy name, and for the benefit of his Church. But what we are doing only opens a greater work to our view. On this, our Twentieth Anniversary, it has been truly said our work has only just begun. It is begun, either to dwindle away, or be carried on by much united exertion with success, at a period to which those who come after us will look back as one of the most important in the history of the Among the marked features of the present time, is a general feeling of restlessness and instability with regard to all that effects this present scene. Who then does not feel that it is a good thing to be engaged in the furtherance of such lasting objects as this Society has in view? While man's projects excite for a while, but change and fail, the means we here employ point to the attainment of something more enduring. The mind finds here something worthy of exertion. While one with another we seek the good of those for whom Christ died, peace is brought to our own hearts and good will prevails around us. Our meeting together, on an occasion like the present, creates a lasting impression for Those necessarily engaged in worldly pursuits have their attention called to those high ends for the promotion of which the Creator and Saviour of the world came from Heaven to Earth. The lonely Missionary, toiling all the year round in remote districts, is encouraged by your assistance, though far more by your sympathy and co-operation. The members of the Church throughout the Diocese, scattered indeed, and comparatively few, begin to feel there is a bond of unity among us, something in common for which we may all act and work together. Our efforts may be small, the result may be imperfect, but faith looks up for that blessing from on high, which can make our "few loaves" suffice for as many "thousands." Through the means of this Society, God may be pleased to guide many of the weak, the ignorant and the erring, along the narrow way that leadeth to Eternal Life.

Annover .- Rev. S. J. Hanford again thanks the Society for the grant of Books made last year, and he hopes to be remembered in the next appropriation, the more so, because in this way only has his Mission asked anything from the Society's Funds. There are already three Lending Libraries in this extensive Mission, though necessarily small. Each year's grant has to be apportioned among them, after deducting Prayer Books, Tracts, &c., for distribution, so that the number of books in each Library is very limited.

"I need hardly say," Mr. Hanford writes "how highly we must value, at least in the Country Districts, the appropriation of books made by this Society. In truth, the only objection is, they are too small for the great number

of places where instructive reading matter is required.
"I am happy to state that notwithstanding the general check in the lumbering operations, and an outlay of some £30 on one of our Churches, the Contributions of the Society will exceed those of last year; and I may add, that the people appear in general to realize more and more the duty of regularly contributing to the funds of the Society, though indeed we must own there is yet abundant room for a deeper sense of this obligation."

 This Committee return their sincere thanks to the Parent Society for the liberal grants of Books annually made towards the augmentation of the Chatham Parochial and Sunday School Lending Library, which form a valuable acquisition to that institution, and are duly appreciated by the Parents, Teachers, and all the young persons who are in the habit of attending; and the Committee hope to be again remembered in the next appropriation.

2. That this Committee views with lively gratitude to the Great Head of the Church, the extraordinary success that has attended the Diocesan Church Society since its formation, which can be alone ascribed to the Divine Bles-

sing, and is an earnest of its future increase and prosperity.

3. That this Committee deeply regrets the inconsiderable amount of their Contributions for the present year, which must be attributed solely to the unprecedented pressure of the times.

Contributions for General Purposes are £17 14 1.

Douolas.-At the Annual Meeting of the Committee, a Resolution was passed expressive of thanks to the Society for the grant of £20 made last year towards the stipend of the Rector, and asking for a continuance of the same.

The Committee also return sincere thanks for the grants in aid of the Stone Church in the lower part of the Parish. This Church, they are happy to say, is finished, and they trust the Divine Blessing may be upon it, and that many may be brought to worship therein "in spirit and in truth" that God who so mercifully preserves them day by day.

The Committee take this opportunity to return thanks for the assistance they have received by subscriptions, both in England and the Provinces. Especially they feel indebted to John Henry Hakewell, Esq., of London, for his kindness and liberality in furnishing a beautiful and complete draft and plan for the building. The Church is built of stone, and is now nearly ready for consecration.

The Committee, with thanks for the past grant, hope for a further supply

of Books, which prove highly useful and beneficial to the Parish.

The Missionary reports that he has under his charge two Churches, in addition to the one just completed. During the Summer, he had on Sundays three Services, one at the upper Church, another at the Church near the mouth of the Creek, and a third at the School House, near the new Church. In the Winter months he holds Service twice each Sunday at two of the above Stations. The number of Communicants in the Parish are about 20. The average attendance is, at the upper Church, about 80; the Church near the Parsonage, 20; at the School Hoase, near the new Church, about 90; and at a Station in the Tay Settlement, where he has Service once in about two months, the average attendance is about 30. The amount contributed towards the support of the Clergyman during the year is from £20 to £25.

The Contributions to the Diocesan Church Society are as follows:—Missionary visits, 6s. 6d.; General Purposes, £14 8 8; Total, £14 15 2.

FREDERICTEN.—The Annual Meeting of this Local Committee was held on the 28th December ult., the Venerable the Archdeacon in the Chair, when it was reported that the subscriptions for the current year would probably equal any hitherto made. This was considered highly satisfactory and encouraging, as in addition to the unusual scarcity of money and general depression in all kinds of business, several contributors to the Society have during the past year removed from the Parish.

The Contributions are, for General Purposes, £184 14 10.

GAGETOWN.—Rev. N. A. Coster reports Contributions to the amount of £11 15 3.

GREENWICH AND PETERSVILLE.—Rev. J. Bartholomew writes, "that the only subject connected with this Mission on which I would remark, is my contemplated retirement from the Diocese. Circumstances, chiefly domestic, render this measure immediately necessary. My resignation has been ten-

dered to and accepted by the Bishop, and will shortly take effect.

"It may not be uninteresting to the Society to learn that during the period of my charge of the Mission, of upwards of nine years in one branch of it, and of nearly seven in the other, I have administered baptism to more than 350 persons; performed 60 marriages; and committed to the grave nearly 80 of the Parishioners. On my first assuming the charge of Petersville there were 16 Communicants, the number is now 40. More than £425, all in cash, has been subscribed by the people for the Missionary's support. It has been my happiness to live in uninterrupted harmony with the Church Parishioners, and I regret the occurrences that dissolve our connection. In withdrawing from the Diocesan Church Society, I beg to offer my grateful thanks that it has considered me worthy for several years of its employment, and trust that should the difficulties that occasion my return to England be overcome within a reasonable period, I may re-enter, with the Bishop's concurrence, the service of the Society.

That the members of this Committee are moved with heartfelt gratifude to Almighty God for the general success with which he has hitherto crowned the blessed work and labours of this, the first Colonial Church Society, and they now beg leave to commend that institution and its objects to the labours, interest and fostering care of their fellow-Churchmen throughout the Province.

2. That this Meeting desires to bear its humble testimony to the value and usefulness of the Books and Tracts circulated by the Church Society in this Settlement; and that the Parish Minister be requested to ask the General Committee for a grant of religious publications suitable to the present need of

the people.

The Missionary also states, that owing to severe snow storms, the meeting of the Glenelg Committee was postponed until the 2d instant, when resolutions similar to the above were adopted. Here, in Nelson, £7 2 7 has been eollected for the furtherance of the Society's objects; but when this Parish and Blackville (from which the sum of £3 6 11 has been received) are favoured with a resident Pastor, a hope long cherished and now about to be realized, and his whole heart and soul devoted to their spiritual wants, it may reasonably be expected that larger offerings will be cast into the Treasury of the Society, and the Church of Christ, which it is its object to extend, will diffuse her mild influence to the increase of true religion in this and the adjoining settlements.

The Contributions for the past year from this poor district are as follows: Point Escuminac, 9s.; Glenelg, £5 19 10; Newcastle, £5 4 2; Nelson, £7 2 9; Blackville, £3 6 11; Ludlow, 17s.; Boies Town, 5s. 6d.; Sunday offerings after Churchings, 11s. 10d.; Books sold, £1 19 3. Total, £25 16 4.

GRAND MANAN.-Rev. G. T. Carey has enclosed through Dr. Alley, £3 15, for general purposes of the Society, and requests a grant to aid in the repairs of the Parsonage House.

HAMPTON.-The Rev. W. Walker is happy in being able to report a large increase in the Contributions for this Parish. These are in all, £42 2 4, of which the sum of £14 is limited to the Widows and Orphans' Fund.

HOPEWELL.-Rev. R. D. Palmer has enclosed the following resolutions,

passed at a meeting of this Local Committee, held on the 4th instant.

1. This Committee deeply impressed with the necessity of a resident Clergyman, and thankful to the Society for the assistance it has hitherto rendered, earnestly solicit a continuance of its support, and also ask for a further grant

KINGSTON.—Rev. W. E. Scovil, encloses a list of subscriptions which, together with the Collections in Church, amount to £31 10, of which £1 10s.

Mr. Scovil writes that on the day of the Festival of Saint John the Evangelist, after Prayers, our Local Committee proceeded to choose their Lay Delegates, and the Meeting was closed with such good wishes and aspirations for the welfare of our Church Society, as might find suitable expression in the concluding words of the Prayer of Moses the Man of God. "Let the heauty of the Lord our God be upon us: and establish thou the work of our hands upon us, yea the works of our hands, establish thou it."

LANCASTER .- Rev. G. Bedell writes that at a meeting of this Committee

held on the 7th instant, the following resolutions were passed :-

1. That this Committee, on behalf of the Parish generally, beg to express the continued and lively interest felt in the welfare of the Diocesan Church Society, and to offer their sincere thanks for the grant towards the repairs of their Parish Church.

2. That they state with pleasure that the Parishoners have cheerfully subscribed £50 towards the stipend of their Rector, thereby enabling him to fulfil his engagement; that the Sunday School was well attended while the

weather permitted, and will soon be re-opened.

3. That it is with regret the Committee have to allude to the reduction made by the l'arent Society of £25 sterling per annum in the allowance to their Pastor, which is especially severe, as the increasing demand for his services involve additional expenses; and there are many calls made upon the Parishioners for local objects. They return thanks for the books, which are duly appreciated, and request a further grant.

duly appreciated, and request a further grant. The Rev. G. Bedell, in a letter enclosing the foregoing resolutions, statuthat the repairs and enlargement of the Church involved an outlay of £210, of which about £30 is still due. The calls on the Parishioners have been unusually heavy during the past year, and will probably be increased by the additional support required for their Rector; and he feels satisfied that the

request for assistance will not be unheeded by the Society. The Contributions are in all ± 35 1.

In compliance with the resolution of the General Committee, M. Bedell states that he has under his charge four Churches, viz.: at Lancast, Manawagonish, Dipper Harbor, and Pisarinco. At the former place of Service is held every Sunday, and on each of the Great Festivals and Fasts of the Church. At the two latter, on each alternate Sunday; and at Manawagonish once a fortnight during the Summer. The number of Communicanta is 39.

Average attendance at each Church, between 50 and 60.

MAUGERVILLE AND BURTON.—The Contributions reported by the Rev. A. V. G. Wiggins, D. D., are:—from Burton: Widows and Orphans' Fund, 2s. 6d.; General Purposes, £15 13 11; Total, £15 16 5. From Mau-

gerville, General Purposes, £11 0 54; Total, £26 16 104.

Dr. Wiggins writes that they are proceeding well with their new Church at Maugerville, and he trusts they will obtain further assistance from the Society. On this subject he encloses a resolution passed at a meeting of the Maugerville Local Committee, held on the 1st January, 1856, wherein it is stated that £350 has been raised by the people, £300 of which are already

expended, and that they trust the Church will be ready for consecration by the 15th June next.

Moncton.—Rev. W. N. Boyer reports £1 7. 6. as the Con'ributions from this place. He regrets that the sum is so small, especially as the Society has dealt so bountifully with his Parish. It is owing to the scarcity of means. What is done for the Church here, is done by a few families, and they not blessed with much of this world's goods, "But amidst this gloom which prevails there is," writes Mr. Boyer, "much cause for thankfulness to Almighty God. The few who do belong to the Church, are, most of them, constant, sincere, and devout, and never lose an opportunity of shewing kindness to myself as their Clergyman. During the past year the members of the Church have been engaged in creeting the Parsonage House, but if spared to another year, the good-will and gratitude which exists towards the Society may be manifested by larger subscriptions to the funds."

New Maryland.—The Contributions from this Settlement amount to $\pounds 6$ 3 11 for General Purposes.

Norton.—Rev. E. A. Warneford reports Contributions as follows:—Widows and Orphans' Fund, 17s.; General Purposes, £19 16; Total, £20 13.

PRINCE WILLIAM AND DUMFRIES.—Rev. P. W. Loosemore reports Contributions as follows:—Widows and Orphans' Fund, 6s. 3d.; General Purposes, £11 13 9; Total, £12.

This is a considerable increase on the amount lately obtained from this Mission, which is especially worthy of notice, as Mr. Loosemore has only been a few weeks in charge.

PORTLAND.—Rev. W. Harrison has enclosed returns exhibiting a large increase in the Contributions: in all £49 for General Purposes of the Society.

PORTLAND, DISTRICT OF ST. PAUL.—Rev. Charles Lee has enclosed the returns from this District, amounting to:—for Widows and Orphans' Fund, £1; General Purposes, £67 19 4; Total, £68 19 4.

QUEENSBURY.—Rev. Henry W. Tippett encloses a list of Subscribers, which, he writes, though exceedingly small, is as much as he could obtain. long and expensive sicknesses having prevented many from contributing as usual. The subscribers reside very distant from each other, and this has made it impracticable to hold a Public Meeting for the purposes contemplated in Rules 13 and 14 of the Constitution.

This Parish formerly constituted a part of the Mission of Prince William, but through the aid of the Society, has possessed a settled Clergyman for about eight years. It is inhabited almost wholly by Dissenters of the Free-Will Baptist persuasion, the members of the Church of England being few and scattered over a line of about thirty miles. Divine Service is performed at four Stations; at two of which, since under the writer's charge, Churches have been erected, and in them the Holy Communion is administered monthly. The number of Communicauts, out of from 130 to 150 members of the Church of all ages, is 25. The Congregations are ordinarily small; thus at Station No. 1, from twenty to forty; No. 2, twenty-five to fifty; No. 3, fifteen to twenty-five; No. 4, twenty-five to fifty. There are five Meeting Houses in which the Societies of Baptists assemble every Sunday. From these, the Missionary writes, he has not been successful in winning numbers to the Church; though they sometimes attend our Public Worship. The Church, however, happily loses none, and there are, thank God, many in the Parish deeply and intelligently attached to her Communion. The baptisms during the year have been nine; marriages three, and burials five. Amongst the latter, three of our oldest and most constant members, one of them remarkable in a high degree for "whatsoever things are just, pure, honest, lovely and of good report." His aged and venerable form, in that lowly and reverent attitude which always marked him in the House and at the Table of the Lord.

SACKVILLE AND DORCHESTER .- Rev. T. N. DeWolfe reports Contributions for General Purposes from the former Parish £13 17 54, and from the latter £13 15 64; in all £27 13.

SAINT JOHN, TRINITY.-W. P. Dole, Esq., Secretary of this Committee, has enclosed returns, shewing an increased amount of Contributions, as follows: Schools, 10s.; Widows and Orphans' Fund, £5; General Purposes, £108 16 11d; Total, £114 6 11.*

SAINT JOHN, St. MARK's .- The Rev. G. M. Armstrong has enclosed returns from this Parish; for Widows and Orphans' Fund. £1 10s.; General Purposes, £100 4 3; Total, £101 14 3. This is nearly double the amount reported last year.

SAINT JOHN, St. JAMES .- H. W. Frith, Esq., Secretary of this Committee, has enclosed the returns, which also show a large increase on the amount contributed last year, being in all £45 12 3.

SAINT MARY'S .- Rev. W. Jaffrey in making the report as requested by the General Committee, states that he h s three Churches under his charge, in each of which, when practicable, he holds Service once every fortnight. He has also four other Stations, where he has occasional Services. The number attending these Churches and Stations, ran es from 10 to 120, among which are now 22 Communicants. Five of the latter have during the year been removed by death, which, though a loss to the Church militant on Earth, is, he is assured, an addition to the Church triumphant in Heaven, their last end having been peace.

The amount contributed for the support of the Missionary during the past year has not exceeded six or seven pounds, which he hopes the Society will not consider a fair index of the liberality of his people, who have been called

upon to the extent of their ability for other religious objects.

The number of baptisms in the Mission has been 22. During the past Summer, the writer after one of his Parochial visits to the rear of his Mission, which is forty miles in extent, passed on for a few days through some of the more north-westerly districts, and he can testify to the truth of what has been so often said respecting their spiritual destitution. In that very large field of labour, there is only one Missionary, the Rev. J. Hudson, who is obliged to do the work of three or four Parishes, each of which nearly as large in extent as many of the Dioceses of the Mother Country. Much good might result by supplying an additional Missionary for that portion of the Diocese. May God, he concludes, so strengthen the hands of the Society as to enable it to provide the means for more labourers in the Vineyard, and to His name will be the praise.

The Contributions which exceed those of former years are for Widows and Orphans' Fund, £1 8 9; General Purposes, £14 1; Total, £15 9 9.

The Contributions amount to £20 13 9.

SAINT ANDREWS.—Rev. J. Alloy, D. D. has enclosed £24 15, the amount of the Contributions for this place and Chamcook. He regrets the falling off in the sum, compared with former years, which is owing solely to the present depressed state of business. He requests the annual grant of books for Saint Andrews and Chamcook.

SAINT GEORGE AND PENNFIELD.—Rev. J. M'Givern has enclosed returns as follows: Saint George, £16 15 10. Pennfield, £5 3 3. Total, £21 19 1, and the following Resolution passed at a Meeting of the Committee on the 6th instant.

"That the steady progress made by this Society as the handmaid of the venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in promoting the interests of the Church during the last twenty years, in this Diocese, demands the expression of our heartfelt gratitude to the Author and Giver of all good. And that one of its objects, viz.: 'to afford aid to new and poor missions,' should in the opinion of this Committee, be a strong motive for increased exertion and entire co-operation on the part of all true Churchmen among us."

Mr. M'Givern writes that notwithstanding the depression in business and consequent scarcity of money, the friends of the Society in this Mission have shown no disposition to relax their efforts in behalf of this good cause, but have cheerfully given their contributions. My earnest desire is "that they may abound more and more." If the Society could be induced to alter its present rule, and hold its meetings during the Summer months, it is my settled conviction that larger subscriptions would be obtained, especially in the lumbering districts, as the laborers are at this season at home. Besides this, by the present arrangement, the Clergy are kept away by the inclemency of the season, and the expenses of travelling. This difficulty, the writer would not wish to see obviated by any allowance for that purpose from funds already too small for more important objects.

Springfield.—Rev. C. P. Bliss writes that at a Meeting of the Local Committee, resolutions were passed expressive of thanks to the Society for its liberal grant in support of this Mission, and asking for a continuance of the same. They express their conviction of the great benefits derived from the books imported by the Society.

They feel strongly opposed to any change in the time of holding the Meetings. The Society is doubtless aware, Mr. Bliss continues, that this Mission is composed of the united Parishes of Springfield and Johnson. Last year I performed Service at the Church in the Parish of Johnson every third Sunday, alternately in the morning and afternoon. At the Irish Settlement every other Sunday, and so here at the Parish Church. Thus I had four different Stations. The Communion is administered once a month. The number of Communicants is 80; average attendance 35. The Congregations are good, increasing in some Stations. Contributions to the Missionary's support, £35. I have had 40 baptisms during the year.

During the past Summer, being called upon to visit a sick person in the Parish of Wickham, I there found the necessity for a regular Service, to which I have attended every third week, in addition to my other duties, Contributions, £9 14s. 14d.

SAINT DAVID.—Rev. J. S. Thomson has enclosed a list of subscriptions amounting to £6, and he states that although we value the Church Society and regard its noble objects and operations with love and unabated interest, yet our means, which are but limited, and at prosent burdened with the

expense of building our Church, prevent our hands from doing what our hearts would dictate. We willingly and cheerfully give what we can, and sincerely pray that the Most High may still further bless the operations of the Society with harmony, and its objects with all that prosperity so richly

Shediac.—Rev. G. S. Jarvis, D. D., reports Contributions for General Purposes, £8 17s. 6d.

SIMONDS.—Rev. J. W. Disbrow reports £9 4s. 9d. as the Contributions to the Society. The amount is little less than last year, solely owing to the state of travelling having prevented him from calling on all who would have

subscribed, as the attachment to the Society is unabated.

He reports that there are three Churches under his charge, at Loch Lomond, Black River, and on the Quaco Road; at the two former of which Services on Sunday are held alternately. At the Church on the Quaco Road during the Summer months, there is Service once a fortnight on a week day. The number of Communicants in the Mission is 36. The attendance at Black River Church is from 80 to 100; at Loch Lomond, 40; on the Quaco Road, about 20. No contributions are made to the support of the Missionary: they have not been asked for sinco the present incumbent's charge; although he is convinced that if the people knew they were actually needed, they would "out of their poverty," furnish a small amount for that object.

Sussex.—Rev. Thomas M'Ghee reports Contributions for Books and Tracts, 13s. 6d.; Churches and Chapels, £3 4s. 6d.; Widows and Orphans' Fund, £2 6s.; General Purposes, £6 19s.; Total, £13 3s.

He solicits a grant in aid of building a Church in Dutch Valley to accommodate 150 worshippers. A grant for that object was made by the Society in 1847, but owing to the affliction of the Rev. H. N. Arnold, at that time in charge of the Mission, it was not called for.

UPHAM AND St. MARTINS .- Rev. W. H. DeVeber writes that the Parishioners of Upham having been called upon to paint their Parish Church, and those of St. Martins being engaged in building a Church at that place, the Contributions will not exceed the sum of £24.

Welford.—Rev. D. J. Wetmore encloses a Subscription list amounting to £8 18s. for General Purposes, and writes that the great depression in the lumbering business, and the high price of provisions, has prevented his obtaining more. He reports that at St. Paul's Church he has held 62 Services during the year; the number of Communicants is 15; the average attendance 50, and the amount contributed by the Parish, £17 16s. 2d.

WESTFIELD .- The amount of Contributions reported by the Rev. C. Milner is £9 15s.

the regular routine of Missionary work, with the many discouragements to which others of the Clergy are equally subject. But there are also, by the kind mercy and blessing of God, many things to encourage and stimulate us in the work in which we are engaged; and though the prospect may seem gloomy to a desponding mind, from the continual decrease and threatened withdrawal of the support of the Parent Society, yet with a firm and steadfast faith in the promises of God, we may go on in our work and labour of love, fully assured that He will never leave nor forsake His Church; and if her members are faithful and true, she will rise above all the troubles and difficulties to which she may be exposed, and come forth from the furnace, purified, and more like what she ought to be and really is, as the true Church

We have indeed much to be thankful for, in having been so long and liberally aided through the generosity of our brethren in England; nor can we be surprised that now, (so many other pressing calls engressing their attention,) they should require us to do more for ourselves than we have hitherto done. To this end, a good commencement has been made by the Diocesan Church Society. But it is only a commencement; for though now in operation twenty years, and gradually through that time, by the blessing of God, increasing in usefulness and importance, through much discouragement, it may be said to be still in its infancy, compared with what by more united efforts, we may yet hope it will be. And when Churchmen beside to the still the standard of the standar gin to see and feel more clearly that upon this Society they must, at some not very distant day, mainly depend for the maintenance and extension of the Church among us, its means of usefulness will be proportionably enlarged. To this, indeed, many are already beginning to be aroused, as the increasing funds of the Society during the last few years testify. Still, in looking at the Report, we cannot but lament, in many instances, the want of that true and heartfelt interest in the cause which has in every age characterized the faithful servants of God.

With regard to this Mission, it is gratifying to be able to say that there are many who regard the Church Society in its true light, and are consequently ready to contribute to its funds, and to promote its objects to the best of their ability. Many others again, seem to regard it with thoughtless indifference; they give with a grudging hand, as if to get rid of an unpleasant application, with the least possible inconvenience to themselves. The Contributions have been kept up at no common amount of labour, a large portion being collected in the produce of the Country and then sold. In this work the writer has, year after year, spent many days of hard labour and expense in travelling through unbroken roads, through the back settlements of his extensive Mis-

sion.

In a subsequent letter, the Rev. Mr. Street writes that extreme illness has prevented him from giving any assistance in making the Collections, the labour of which has fallen upon his Curate, the Rev. H. B. Nichols, who has been indefatigable in the work. The amount is £41 2 10.

Thus we find the whole amount contributed to the different objects of the Society, as follows: Missionary Visits, £1 16s. 6d.; Sunday and other Schools, £1; Books and Tracts, £1 3s. 6d.; Churches and Chapels, £3 4s. 6d.; Aged Clergy Fund, £2 15s.; Widows and Orphans' Fund. £26 10s. 6d.; General Purposes, £1169 18s. 2d; Total, £1206 8s. 2d.

It is truly most encouraging, that notwithstanding the depression in all pursuits of industry, so frequently alluded to in the preceding Reports, that from so many quarters we have received an increased amount of contributions. In St. John and the neighbouring Parish of Portland, this increase above the returns of last year amounts to the sum of £113 7s. 8d. Had the like exertion been made in every Parish, we cannot doubt but a much larger amount had been

placed at the disposal of the Society.

On this subject it is well to be reminded that we need no longer look elsewhere for assistance in extending the ministrations of the Church among us. Too long already have we depended upon the bounty of our brethren in the Mother Country. It is with the Church in this matter, as in the affairs of private life, dependence on others damps individual exertion. Our energies soon become paralyzed when we leave to others what is clearly appointed for ourselves to do. Besides this, we lose all the blessings which ever attend the right performance of the duties to which we are called.

Never can the Church here, or elsewhare throughout the Colonial Empire of Great Britain, repay the debt of gratitude due to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, for the bounty it has hitherto extended with so generous a hand. This we may safely hope will be continued, till occasions arise, when, without injustice to individuals, a portion of the amount now received may be applied to the extension of the Church in less favoured regions. Now, suppose that each member of the Church in this Diocese could be persuaded to devote to the glory of God the one-tenth of his substance, a proportion which the Scripture often mentions, would there not be enough for the support of the Church in the more wealthy communities, and also in the poor and more destitute places? And might we not then hope that God would bless us the more, and many of our present difficulties pass away? It is clear that no duty is more expressly enjoined in Holy Scripture; and why should we wait for others to provide that they who preach the Gospel among us "should live of the Gospel," when ample means are found to maintain all other callings and professions? As well might we crave assistance to procure the bread which sustains our bodies, as the means of conveying spiritual sustenance to our souls. Until the Church throughout all its members is aroused to a sense of its obligation and privilege in this matter, we cannot expect any vigorous effort for its increasing usefulness. This Society has already done something in shaking off this deadly apathy. And for this reason it bears a heavy responsibility, which rests alike on all connected with its management, on all parce pa ac cri wh for tri lit lo te wh po be

Already it has taken much time and passed through many difficulties to gain the confidence it has acquired. To retain this, and to increase it, we need to crave together that blessing from God in those prayers with which all our proceedings are commenced. Kindness and forbearance, economy and strict integrity must mark all our And while our chief dependence rests on the transactions. liberality of the Laity, it is to the Clergy the Society must look, that through their labours, true religion will be so extended, that the hearts of men will be influenced to do that which the Gospel of Christ enjoins. Especially the Society will look with hope to those Missionaries who receive support from its funds; and when they are seen spending and being spent in the service of the Church, constant in labours of self-denial and of love, seeking out the straying and bringing the lost ones back again to the fold, comforting the afflicted and carrying to the troubled hearts messages of peace, then will the members of the Church count it a privilege to share in a work, which, while conveying blessings to others, will be sure to call them down abundantly on themselves.

APPENDIX.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION,

TO THE DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

The Committee appointed at the last Anniversary Meeting of the Society to consider the present Constitution of the Society and whether any amendments are required in the same, and to report thereon at the next General Meeting of the Society, have attended to that duty, and after due deliberation are of opinion that certain amendments are desirable, which are embodied in this their Report, which they respectfully and unanimously submit for the consideration of the Society, and recommend for adoption at the Anniversary Meeting in 1857.

FIRSTLY.

It is proposed and recommended by the Committee that Article II. and XVIII. of the present Constitution be rescinded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof.

TT.

No alteration shall be made in the Constitution of this Society, nor shall any Bye Law, Rule, or Regulation of the Society be repealed, annulled, or altered, except at one of the Anniversary Meetings, by the vote of at least two-thirds of the members present, qualified to vote, nor until it shall have received the sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, which sanction must be given in writing and delivered to the Secretary within six months of the said Meeting.

III.

No alteration or amendment in the Constitution, nor any repeal, cancellation, alteration or amendment of any Bye Law, Rule or Regulation of the Society, shall be proposed or made at any Meeting, unless notice shall have been given in writing at the next previous Anniversary Meeting of such proposed repeal or cancellation, nor unless the terms of such proposed alteration or amendment shall have been stated in writing at such previous meeting, from which without the unanimous consent of the members present, qualified to vote, no deviation, except of a mere formal nature, shall be permitted.

IV-

No repeal, cancellation, alteration, or amendment, shall be proposed, except by a member qualified to vote at the General Meeting, whose name shall be entered on the Minutes by the Sceretary, together with the said proposition; but it shall be competent to any qualified Member of the Society to require such proposition to be put to the vote at the next Anniversary Meeting, whether he be the original proposer or not.

SECONDLY.

That Article III of the present Constitution do stand as No. V, with a proviso defining the qualification of Members entitled to vote at the General Meeting; and the Article so amended will stand thus:

\mathbf{v}

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same a Member of the Society. Provided that no Member shall be qualified to vote at any General Meeting of the Society, unless of the full age of twenty one years, nor unless he be a Life Member, or shall have subscribed and paid at least Five Shillings during the year preceding such Meeting,

THIRDLY.

That Articles No. 4 and δ of the present Constitution be rescluded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

VI.

(Officers.)

1. The Officers of the Society shall be a President, two or more Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, one or more Secretaries, and two Auditors of Accounts.

2. The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the President of the Society, and the Archdeacon the Scnior Vice-President; and any Life Member may at any Anniversary Meeting be elected a Vice-President of the Society.

3. The Treasurer, Secretary, or Secretaries, and the Auditors, shall be annually elected at the Auniversary Meeting; and in case of the death, resignation, or removal from the Province of any such Officer, the vacancy shall be filled up by the Executive Committee, at its next or any subsequent Meeting within the year; and the Lord Bishop shall, if he see fit, call a Special Meeting of the Executive Committee for the purpose of filling any such vacancy.

VII.

(Executive Committee.)

1. There shall be also an Executive Committee, to be composed of the following Members, viz.:

The Officers of the Society as provided for in the next preceding Article.

All Clergymen resident in the Diocese, duly licensed by the Lord Bishop, and Subscribers to the Society.

And Twenty-four Lay Members of the Society being Life Members, or Annual Subscribers of at least One Pound; to be annually elected at the Anniversary Meeting, provided that no Annual Subscriber shall be qualified to be elected, unless he shall during the year preceding such Meeting have paid his subscription of at least One Pound.

2. Five Members of the Executive Committee, three of whom to be Laymen, shall form a Quorum.

3. The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John on the first Wednesday in January, on the day next following the Annual Meeting; on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

FOURTHLY—(Objects.)

That the Article VI shall be numbered VIII and stand as at present, with the exception of that relating to Books, which shall be amended as follows:

4. The supply of such Books and Tracts as are on the Catalogue of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and none other.

The Article of the present Constitution No. VIII to be reseinded. The Article No. VII to be numbered IX, and the Article No. IX to be numbered X.

The Articles No. X, XIII and XIV of the present Constitution to be rescinded and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

XI.

(Local Committee.)

1. The Members of the Society in each Parish, or in each Mission, consisting of two or more Parishes, shall, at the discretion of the Missionary of such Mission, constitute a Local Committee; and so also the Members residing in any District of a Parish set off under the authority of the Lord Bishop, with the concurrence of the Rector and Church Corporation of such Parish, (there being in such District a Church duly consecrated and a resident Clergyman licensed thereto by the Lord Bishop,) may at the desire of such Clergyman, and with the approval of the Bishop and the Rector of the Parish,

form a separate Local Committee; and in that ease the District shall for th

purpose of the Society be considered as a separate Parish.

2. Each Local Committee shall hold an Annual Meeting on some convenient day, previous to the 1st day of December, when they shall elect two Lay Members of the Society as their Deputies or Delegates in General Committee, and when a return of the amount collected and the names of the subscribers shall be laid before the Meeting, which Return after having been signed by the Chairman and Secretary, shall be sent to the Secretary of the Society, and the money paid to the Treasurer thereof on or before the twentyfourth day of December.

FIFTHLY.

That Articles XI and XII of the present Constitution be numbered successively XII and XIII, the following addition being made to XIII: A Special General Meeting may be called at any time by the President, or in his absence, by any two or more of the Vice-Presidents, four weeks notice being first given thereof by advertisement in one or more newspapers, published in Fredericton and Saint John respectively. And Article XV rescinded and the following substituted.

XIV.

(The General Committee.)

1. The General Committee of the Society shall be composed of the following Members, viz.: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese who shall be the Chairman; but in the absence of the Lord Bishop the Committee may elect a Chairman, the Secretary or Secretaries who shall also serve in that capacity at the Meetings of the General Committee, the Treasurer and the Auditors, the Rector or Missionary of each Parish, or of a Mission composing two or more Parishes, and the Clergyman of any separate District of a Parish. Provided that in the absence or sickness of the Rector of any Parish, the duly licensed Curate or Assistant Minister shall be considered pro hac vice a Member of the General Committee, and the Lay Deputies elected by the Local Committee as before provided, all such persons being Subscribers to the Society.

Proof of the election of such Deputies by each Local Committee to be

the Certificate of the Chairman or Secretary thereof.

2. The General Committee shall meet on the two days next previous to the Anniversary Meeting to make the Annual appropriation of the funds of the Society; and a Report of the proceedings of such Meeting shall be made at the Anniversary Meeting.

3. The Order of Business in General Committee shall be as follows:

Firstly. Production of Certificates of Lay Deputies.

Secondly. Secretary's Report to be read, and also a Report of the Proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year.

Thirdly. Report of the Auditors to be read and laid before the General Committee.

Fourthly. Such appropriations or disposition of the funds to the objects of the Society as a majority of those present may determine.

SIXTHLY.

That the Article XVII of the present Constitution be numbered XV, and Article XVI form part of Article VII, as above set out.

RESOLUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

That all future grants by this Society for any purpose, may be re-appropriated as the Society shall think fit, if not claimed within three years from the date of the respective grants. (5th Report, page 8.)

RESOLUTIONS OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

That the title to all Churches towards the erection or completion of which any grant is made from the funds of this Society, be vested either in the Church Corporation of the Parish in which such Church is situated, or in some party or parties in trust to convey the site, as soon as practicable, of such Church to the Church Corporation as soon as the same may be legally constituted. (14th Report, page 24.)

That no grants from this Committee, subject to conditions, be paid until an order is issued from the Executive Committee, who will previously ascertain that the conditions of the grants have been fulfilled. (17th Report, page 21.)

That no application for grants shall be considered, which are not made on the first day of the meeting of the General Committee, or previously. (18th Report, page 24.)

That each Missionary receiving a salary from this Society, be requested to make an annual return to the Secretary, to be handed in by him at the first meeting of the General Committee, as follows, viz.:

The number of Churches under his charge.

The number of weekly or other stated services held in such Churches or Stations.

The number of Communicants.
The average number of attendants.
