FULTON FIRES BIG TORPEDO

Remarkable Test of the New Holland Submarine Boat on Saturday.

SHOT WENT AS TRUE AS A DIE

Ship Dived Like a Porpoise and Sped One Mile Submerged at Five Knot Rate.

New York, Dec. 8.—All her previous efforts were surpassed yesterday by the submarine torpedo boat Fulton for the special benefit of Commander V. Geelmuysen of the Royal Norwegian navy, who was delegated by his government to investigate her achievements. This twentieth century realization of Jules Verne's dream of the Nautilus was put thru her paces on the Great Peconic Bay, a few miles from the Holland company yard at New Suffolk, L.I.

Starting over the surface like an arrow, cleaving the waters with only the tip of her mast exposed, sinking like a plummet, she dived like a porpoise, and sped one mile submerged at five knot rate. The full headway of her electric engines, she discharged a regulation Whitehead torpedo, which shot towards its mark with such accuracy that had its target been a cruiser or a battleship the torpedo would probably have been blown out of the water.

Turning over the surface like an arrow, cleaving the waters with only the tip of her mast exposed, sinking like a plummet, she dived like a porpoise, and sped one mile submerged at five knot rate. The full headway of her electric engines, she discharged a regulation Whitehead torpedo, which shot towards its mark with such accuracy that had its target been a cruiser or a battleship the torpedo would probably have been blown out of the water.

By this means it was seen that the projectile was as true as the needle to the pole. Six hundred yards the torpedo ran straight, then it came to the surface directly in the centre of the course. Most warships are now being fitted with torpedoes that are as true as the needle to the pole.
