Washington, June 11-Further evidence that Germany, in its efforts to end the war this summer, is planning against the combined British and American grand fleet, is given in an official despatch today from Switzerland.
"A telegram of an official nature," says the despatch, German admiralty is considering a big naval offensive Orders are supposed to have been given to keep the whole high ranks have been xecalled from Switzerland and othe neutral countries where they have been spending their leaves.
The Kieler Zeitung speaks of extraordinary activity in the ports and the Hamburger Post publishes an interview with Von Tirpitz, who was asked if Germany was in a position to measure herself with the British fleet. The admiral naturally replied in the affirmative, saying that after their land forces have pushed the French and English back on the other sides of Paris it will be the turn of the Kaiser's boato to drive the British off the high seas.
