tempt and seduce Eve came in the garden and with the language of a gentleman!

His Excellency said: "The introduction of the name of the Pope may be unusual, and very likely unpalatable to some as Protestants; but as it appears in course of a recital of facts which had previously occurred (and which, of course, legislation could not obliterate or annul), and these being, moreover as I have before stated, such reference in the Act, I did not consider that her Majesty's authority was in any degree weakened or assailed, nor that I was compelled in the exercise of my duty as her representative to disallow the Act on that account."

Now let us see. In a letter of Cardinal Sinigaglia from Rome to Mr. Mercurio under date of March 24th, 1888, occur the following words:—"The Pope allows the Government to retain the proceeds of the sale of the Janina Estates as a special deposit to be disposed of hereafter with the sanction of the Holy See." Does Mr. Mercurio repudiate the claims of the Pope as thus set forth? No, but on May 1st, writes: "That any agreement made between you and the Government of the Province will be binding only in so far as it shall be ratified by the Pope and the Legislature of the Province." In his estimation the Queen has no claim.

Then A. D. Turgeon, S. J. Procurator of the J. Suits Fathers, acting under authority from Rome, writes to Mr. Mercurio on May 20th, asking for a grant of the Communion of Laprairie, and says: "It is one way of commemorating in the political history of the County, that glorious concord, the effecting whereof would be associated with the name of your Government as soon as the Holy Father has ratified it." See, p. 12.

Now then we find that the first article in the body of the Act reads thus: "The aforesaid agreement, entered into between the Premier and the very Rev. Father Turgeon, are hereby ratified, and the Lieutenant Governor in Council is authorized to carry them out accordingly in their form and tenor." Thus the Act endorses every claim put forth in the name and by authority of the Pope. Is it any wonder then that His Excellency says that "the introduction of the name of the Pope may be unusual and very unpalatable to some as Protestants? Doubtless he means by some Protestants, all intelligent and loyal Protestants—all Protestants who are unwilling to let the Queen's name be replaced by that of an alien and a foreigner."

Is it any wonder then that that deposition in a meeting subsequently held should have unanimously adopted the following resolution:—

"That members of the deposition from Ontario and Quebec in meeting, assembled, after the interview with his excellency, the Governor General, express their unfeigned regret that his excellency while intimating his wish that remarks leading to argument and discussion should be avoided by those presenting the petitions should have made his reply on the advice of his ministers by stating in effect the arguments already urged by the minister of Justice, and which, in the opinion of the deposition, had already been thoroughly refuted; further, that the deposition, learned with unfeigned astonishment and regret that his excellency had been advised to intimate to them that no case would be submitted by the government to the Supreme Court, thereby preventing the opponents of the measure from obtaining the opinion of that Court upon the validity of the act. In view of the tenor of the application already made, this deposition urges the continuance and extension of the present movement throughout the entire Dominion, in order to carry out the principles of the Equal Rights Association, and the formation of similar organizations in the other Provinces with a view to the establishment of a Dominion Association, and to procure a proper representation of their views in Parliament."

Thus the agitation must go on. On the 8th of August the Queen's Act has become law, but the Queen may within two years disallow the Act. To Her Majesty let urgent appeals be made. Let Protestants and intelligent Catholics unite in demanding the repeal of the obnoxious Act.

OTTAWA LETTER.

(From our regular correspondent.)

OTTAWA, August 19.  
The Secretary of the Equal Rights Association in Ottawa says it is probable he will resign. I asked him why. Because, he said, the equal rights men here were willing to overthrow the Macdonald government but unwilling to punish the Mowat administration. Mr. Bradbury, the secretary, is a Conservative and he thinks the Liberal majority, or the executive of the association is determined to make party capital out of the agitation. In the meantime word comes from Mr. McCarthy, via Calgary, that if this French question isn't settled now with children will have to settle it with adults.

A reverend delegate to the Quebec interview told me in private that after the report from Lord Stanley the delegates, some of them, propose to petition the Queen to recall his Excellency but this was overruled by a large majority. Lord Stanley remains at Quebec where Lady Stanley, good motherly soul that she is, is showing a lively interest in female immigrants.

Captain John Gaskin, a Kingston Orangemen, in a speech there last week proposed the formation of a Protestant party with Dalmeida McCarthy as leader. Col. O'Brien, one of the thirteen, is opposed to the formation of a Third Party but Mr. McCarthy has not expressed himself on it.

Mr. McCarthy's visit to Manitoba precipitated the local government's decision to consolidate both Roman Catholic and Protestant schools into one public or national system under single control and to abolish the official use of the French language. Mr. Prendergast, the French member of the cabinet has therefore resigned and no Frenchman can in future accept seat in the Greenway government.

Mr. Prendergast has been four years in the House and has a seat in the "Académie des Sciences" of France.

ENLARGING THE HOUSE OF COMMONS.

Chief Architect Fuller is engaged on plans for enlarging the House of Commons. As it is it is devoid of light or air. It is proposed to extend the west wall of the Chamber some 25 ft., make new entrances and other improvements. The new Press room will be on a level with the Gallery and thus obviate the necessity of crawling up a dark narrow and almost perpendicular flight of stairs. A private entrance to the Chamber for Mr. the Speaker is also down, but to one seems to be in any hurry about the alterations. They only statement who appears to thrive on the noxious air of the House is the Premier.

MR. ELLIS FOUND GUILTY.

The Supreme Court of New Brunswick does not get along very well with members of the Fourth Estate. They imprisoned editor Hawke and have now found editor Ellis guilty of contempt of court. Mr. Ellis's besides being the proprietor of the St. John N. B. Globe is a member of Parliament for the same city, a Liberal. He commented on the Baili Queens County election and in the opinion of the Court overstepped the bounds. He has taken an appeal to the Supreme Court of Canada, sitting here, and pending the appeal sentence has been withheld. Mr. Ellis says he will go to prison sooner than apologize.

THE VICE-ROYAL PROGRAMME.

Lord and Lady Stanley, Hon. Edw. and Lady Alice Stanley, Hon. Victor and all the other Stanleys will return to Ottawa in about ten days and shortly after start on the British Columbia trip passing through the Northwest. Hon. Edward Stanley the governor's eldest son, replaces Capt. Dugan as chief aide de camp. He married last January Lady Alice Mandeville, youngest daughter of the Duke of Manchester.

POT POURRI.

There has been nothing of absorbing interest during the past week. Beginning next month with the return of the Premier and his advent to the political pot will begin to boil.

Sir Hector Langevin, Mr. Bowell and Mr. Haggart are the ministers who remain in town pretty constantly, Sir Hector's house is here, Mr. Bowell is a widower, and Mr. Haggart lives apart from his wife. Sir Adolphe Caron and Mr. Contag joined them on Saturday when Mr. Bowell laid before them the report on the Behring Sea seizures, a copy of which was ordered to be transmitted to England.

The Commissioner's enquiry into the charges against Supt. Ellis, of the Welland Canal, has been taking evidence at St. Catharines.

The Exchequer Court, which hears claims against the Crown, will sit here Oct. 1st.

Since the above was written Mr. Bradbury has resigned the secretaryship of the Equal Rights Association.

J. J. Curran, M. P., has been made a Papal advocate by the Pope.

It is said that Mr. Mercurio will bring on the Quebec elections as soon as the Dominion general elections are announced.

The Ottawa contingent of the Wimbledon Rifle team arrived home Saturday evening and were warmly received. The team brings the Kolapore Cup.

It is now announced from Winnipeg on authority that the government is going to take the bull by the horns and abolish separate schools altogether instead of reforming them.

NEWS FROM EVERYWHERE.

A ship has just arrived at Philadelphia which is said to be the largest sailing vessel in the world. She is the *Ellenore* of London, England. Her length is 308 feet, breadth 45 feet 2 inches, and depth 24 feet 7 inches.

DALHOUSIE, N. B., Aug. 16.—The body of Colonel Walker, of Toronto, was brought here to-day and will be sent to Toronto by to-night's express. While fishing on Grand River six days ago he was struck with paralysis and died yesterday.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 15.—The Supreme Court of the State of California, of which the late David S. Terry was formerly Chief Justice, this morning refused to adjourn out of respect to Terry's memory. This decision was announced from the Bench, and the reasons given were that Terry resigned his judicial position to fight a duel and that he was killed while in the act of assaulting a Justice of the United States Supreme Court.

On Saturday last a bolt of lightning struck a house at Ellerslie, P. E. I., and almost completely smashed it to atoms. Two French women were in the house at the time. One of them was struck and a strip of flesh about two inches wide and running from her foot up her leg, body and out on her arm to her hand was severely burned by the lightning. The other woman was struck on the foot and her shoe torn into rags. The lightning split her foot between the big and second toe up for an inch and a half. Besides there were spots all over their bodies which were burned. It is thought they will recover.

ST. JOHN, N. B., Aug. 16.—Mr. Davy, engineer of the Transatlantic railway and Mr. Scramston, C. E., have been in Fredericton for some days, with Mr. Logie examining maps and getting information in regard to alternative routes for a railway from a point near Edmundston to Moncton. Mr. Scramston it is said will begin at once an exploratory survey from the neighborhood of Boiestown northward. A party is now examining the country east of the Grand Falls. Mr. Davy will visit Moncton before returning to River du Loup. It is not stated in what interest the exploration and inquiries are made, but the name of the Grand Trunk has been used in the connection.

AUSTIN, TEX., Aug. 15.—For some weeks myriads of small black rats have been observed on the prairie and in the cornfields of this section of Texas. There are thousands of them, and out on the prairie campers have trouble keeping them off. It is impossible for them to climb the cornstalks to satisfy their hungry, and they are becoming dangerous.
