MARSHAL.—Grand Master, is it your will and pleasure

that the ceremony of dedicating this hall to the business and purposes of Odd Fellowship do now proceed ?

GRAND MASTER. —Such is my will and pleasure.

MARSHAL. Perhaps around no one thing in human history have the thoughts of man clustered with more of interest and reverence than around the altar. Before it all nations have bowed. At its sacred shrine all have worshipped. Here all sects and creeds, however divergent in faith, have offered their most hallowed sacrifices. An Eastern tradition tells us that the first man was made upon an altar which God Himself had prepared for that purpose and that both the Patriarchs and King Solomon erected theirs on the same spot where this one stood. Whether from this tradition or otherwise the solemn reverence for the altar sprang, certain it is that everywhere and in all ages, whose records have come down to us, the hallowed associations of the altar have formed the great central attractions in all worships.

The Targumists tell us that Adam built an altar after he was driven from the Garden of Eden, and that on this altar Cain and Abel, and after them Noah and Abraham, offered sacrifice. The first authentic account, however, of an altar, is that of the one built by Noah after leaving the ark, in commemoration of that wonderful deliverance. Altars were first erected on some spot hallowed by some great event or sacred association. Later they were erected on some eminence, and were called "High Places." But wherever erected, or for whatever purpose, whether for sacrifice or memorial, they have, in all ages, commanded the most profound reverence. Moved by this universal sentiment, Odd Fellowship has her altar—her sacred shrine—around and before which we, as Odd Fellows, bow and worship. Taking possession of this beautiful temple which is about to be solemnly dedicated to the ennobling principles of our Order, no further ceremony should or can lawfully proceed until we build our altar.

Heralds of the North, the South, the East and the West, are all things now in readiness?

HERALDS.—They are.

MARSHAL.—Herald of the North, where mountain and valley are perpetually robed in crystalline white, as purity of life and conduct is the first tenet of our Order, without which no one can become a true Odd Fellow, bring forth and place as the base of our altar a white stone—white being the universal emblem of Purity.

MARSHAL.—And may our lives be as pure and spotless and our integrity as firm and unyielding as the material of which it is composed.

The next principle we meet in our onward progress is Friendship—the emblematic color of which is PINK.

MARSHAL.—Herald of the South, the glow of whose genial warmth bedecks all nature with beauty and fragrance, giving to life new impulses and to development grander growth, bring forth and place upon this base the symbol of FRIENDSHIP—that with which the ancients represented the warmth and ardour of youth.

Herald brings in a Pink Stone.

MARSHAL.—It has been hallowed in poetry as typical of the springtime of life. Interwoven, by the great Architect of Nature, in every beam of light, as one of the seven primary colors; when disentwined by the power of the prism from its sister rays, it is found to possess the warmest glow and bends least from a straight line. This teaches us that our friendship should be ardent and true, and by no circumstances be turned from a worthy Brother. Heed well its admonition.

MARSHAL.—Herald of the East, whence the rising sun sweeps

from earth the gloom of night, and bathes nature in the beams of the morning—bring hither thy treasures, LOVE, the central link of our welded three, whose emblematic color is BLUE.

Herald brings in a Blue Stone.

MARSHAL.—How deeply significant. Blue is everywhere and universally the synonym of true. When this ray falls upon the polished steel, that steel acquires polarity and becomes a magnet, ever pointing unerringly "to its mysterious attraction in the chambers of the north."

Thus every Brother, like the polished steel, when brought under the influence of the principles of our Order, becomes, or ought to become, so filled and permeated with love and goodwill towards his fellows, that, like the magnet, he shall be a sure guide to the struggling, care-worn mariner amid the fiercest storms of life.

Last in the triple link comes TRUTH, that imperial virtue fitly emblemed by SCARLET.

MARSHAL.—Herald of the West, sitting on thy throne of glory, as

"Twilight lets her curtain down
And pins it with a star,"

bring forth thy treasure, TRUTH, robed in the crimson hues of thy most glorious setting.

Herald brings in a Scarlet Stone.

MARSHAL.—Place it upon the altar. (HERALD PLACES IT THERE.) Symbol of glory, rank and power, it is worn not less by Priest than King. Out of it Moses was commanded to make a garment for Aaron, and it formed a part of the robe, the ephod, the curious girdle and the breastplate of Judgment.

How beautifully appropriate this color to the completed character of the true Odd Fellow! See to it well, my Brothers, that no one bearing this high distinction wears it unworthily.

Leaving the Subordinate Lodge, we now ascend still higher to the Encampment Branch. Here cluster virtues more **ETHEREAL**, if not more excellent. **FAITH, HOPE, CHARITY**, daughters of Heaven, fairest of the celestial visitants, in this sanctuary, upon this altar of Odd Fellowship let thy names be inscribed.

MARSHAL.—Heralds of the North and South, **FAITH** in ever-living green shall bloom, symbol of Nature's universal livery, upon which the eye resting never tires.

MARSHAL. It points us to that undying trust, which, when the body crumbles, lights the valley of shadows. Planted on the rock of Truth, it shall spread its never-fading verdure along life's thorny pathway, cheering the despondent, and bearing up, as an eagle's pinions, the fainting, sinking, careworn child of toil.

MARSHAL.—Heralds of the East and West, now in golden beams let **HOPE** appear, and spring the rainbow arch of promise from out the falling tears of life's weary pilgrimage.

MARSHAL.—Buoyed up with Hope, we will struggle on 'mid darkest hours, guided by that golden rule, "Whatsoever ye would that others should do to you, do ye even so to them." So when we near the verge of the dark valley, as brightest day goes out in the golden sunset, may it be ours to sink to rest amid Hope's brightest visions of golden promise.

Now abideth Faith, Hope and Charity, but the greatest of these is **CHARITY**.

MARSHAL.—Heralds of the North, the South, the East and the West, let it crown the altar. Its emblematic color shall be Royal Purple.

Heralds bring in Royal Purple stone.

MARSHAL.—Type of the highest rank and power, it comes freighted with earth's richest treasures. It brings to man the highest earthly good. It spans the river of death. Radiant with celestial light, 'tis the symbol of "The Brotherhood of man, the Fatherhood of God, everywhere proclaiming as it goes, peace on earth, good-will to men."

Thus stands our completed altar, embodiment of the grand principles that underlie the stupendous fabric of Odd Fellowship. To-day we assemble in the name of our Order to set apart and dedicate to these ennobling virtues this edifice—PURITY, FRIENDSHIP, LOVE, TRUTH, FAITH, HOPE, CHARITY, rising in climatic beauty, from the "Mystic Seven" whose charms have drawn from the paths of error many a noble heart.

'Tis fitting now that the dedicatory ceremony should proceed.

Chairman of Trustees presents Keys.

CHAIRMAN.—GRAND MASTER: We meet you here to-day to announce that the work in which we have been engaged is finished, and our temple is at last ready to shelter us within its walls. It is not the business of the committee to allude to their own labours, or the manner in which those labours have been performed; nor would good taste permit them to descant on the fitness of our edifice for the sacred purpose to which it is designed. It is capable of speaking for itself through its proportions and its style. If these fail to impress you, any words of mine would prove worse than useless. I have only to repeat that our work is finished, and in behalf of Otter Lodge, No. 50, Tilsonburg, and of the Order in this place, I make request that this hall be set apart and dedicated to the business and purposes of Odd Fellowship.

GRAND MASTER.—MR. CHAIRMAN: In the name of and in behalf of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows of the Province of Ontario, I accept for dedication to the uses of Odd Fellowship this hall, which has been constructed under your supervision. To you and your associates the present must be an occasion especially gratifying. To-day you witness the consummation of that for which you have zealously and faithfully laboured, and to-day you behold the recognition by your Brethren from the North, the South, the East and the West, of this, the result of your efforts, as a Temple, devoted to the service of those whose vocation it is to visit the sick, relieve the distressed, bury the dead, and educate the orphan—duties which neither interfere with nor supersede the discharge of any other, social, moral or religious.

Brethren! I congratulate you upon the completion of this beautiful hall, which we are about to dedicate to those cardinal virtues which should adorn and elevate humanity, and the names of which we have selected as a motto and watchword of our

beloved Order. Beneath this roof you are to encourage one another in the duties of benevolence and charity; before the Altar the good words of Friendship, Love and Truth are ever to be presented as the only acceptable sacrifices. From hence, as from a perennial fountain, are to flow the gentle streams of true Friendship, to gladden and make green many waste places. In this quiet retreat are to be cultivated those flowers that Love unfeigned shall scatter on the rugged pathway of life, under many bleeding feet. Here is to be sown the good seed of Truth in many hearts, to spring up and yield its hundred-fold harvest. It is, therefore, not so much this Temple made with hands that should occupy our attention at present as the great principles that are here to be disseminated. I hope and trust, Brethren, that our united efforts, with those of our Brethren throughout the globe, may lead to the raising and adorning of a still nobler Temple, which shall be consecrated by the approval of the Supreme Grand Master of the Universe, without the invocation of whose blessing no work should be undertaken.

MARSHAL.—Brothers, Heralds of the North, of the South, of the East and of the West: By the solemn act of the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ontario this hall is duly dedicated to the business and purposes of Odd Fellowship, to disseminate Friendship, Love and Truth, Faith, Hope and Charity in their fullest extent, to all its worthy members. It is his will and pleasure that the same be proclaimed, which duty you will now perform.

HERALD OF THE NORTH.—Hear all men: By command of the Grand Master, and in the name of Friendship, as pure, refreshing and life-giving as this water [sprinkling it], I dedicate this hall to
