ECLIPSES AND TIDES.

In the year 1872, there will be four Eclipses; two of the Sun and two of the Moon.

1. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, May 22, 1872, invisible at Washington.
2. An annular Eclipse of the Sun, June 5, 1872, invisible at Washington, visible in Asia.
3. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, November 14, 1872, visible at Washington, beginning at 9 o'clock P.M., and being full at midnight 11 minutes, and ending at 2 o'clock 29m. on the 15th.
4. An annular Eclipse of the Sun, November 29, 1872, invisible at Washington, and partly visible in the southern part of South America.

The Tides are calculated from the Meridian of the Moon, called vulgarly Moon's southing or Moon highest, as inserted in the 5th column of the Calendar.

For the Tides of New York, add 8h. 13m. to each day; for Boston add 11h. 27m.; for Philadelphia, 13h. 44m.; for Baltimore, 18h. 59m.; and for Charleston, 7h. 26m.

Spring, March 21—Summer, June 21—Autumn, September 23—Winter, December 22.

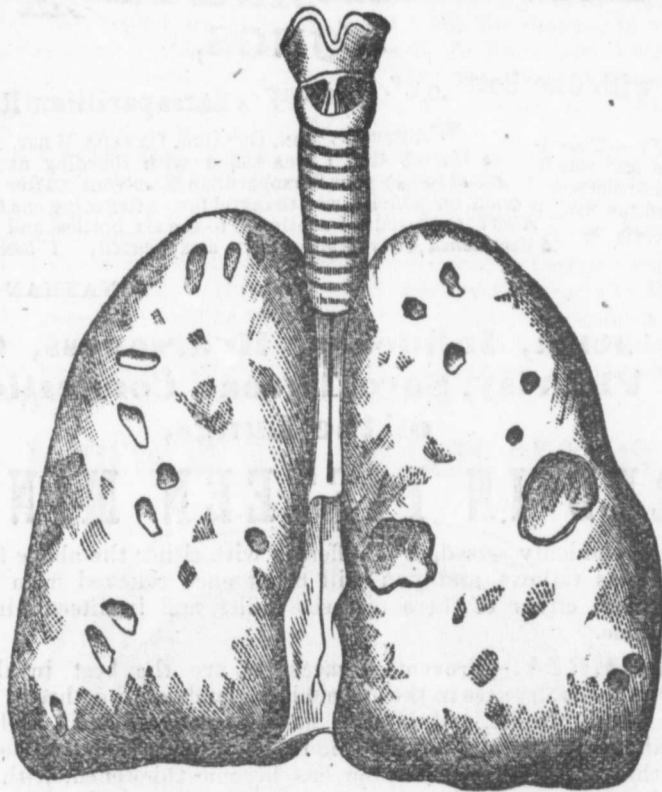

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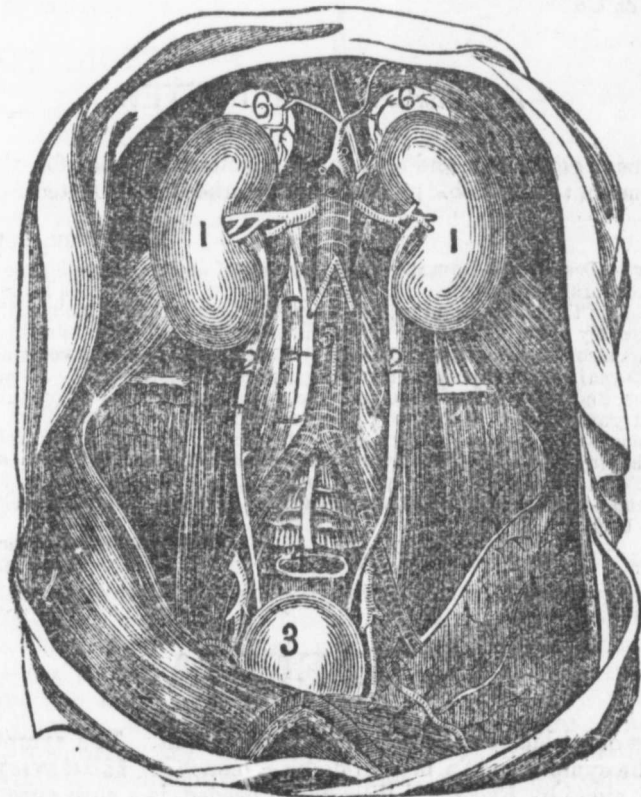

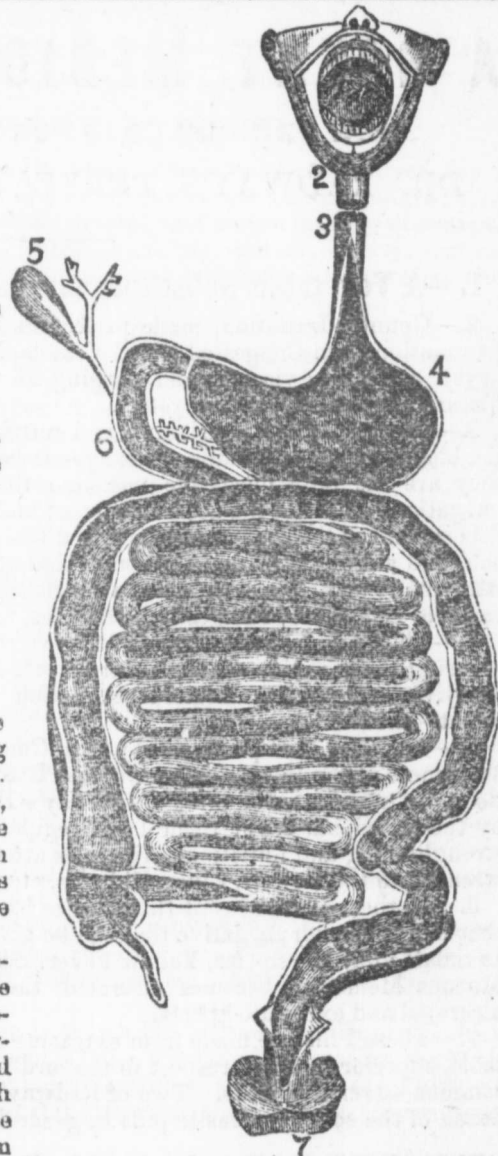
