The Election Trials.

On the second day of the Montreal West election trial, Mr. Mackenzie's counsel intimated that he did not wish to press the case further, and after the evidence of a man named Finlay had been given, admitted that corrupt practices had been used, though without the knowledge of Mr. Mackenzie. This Finlay swore that a Mr. Russell, who was doing what he could to secure Mr. Mackenzie's election, had promised him money if he would vote for that gentleman. At first he refused to go, but afterwards went and voted for him, and on the way back Russell gave him one or two dollars, and they had a glass of beer each at a saloon. This evidence was considered sufficient to void the election, and Mr. Mackenzie was accordingly unseated.

In the South Huron case, Judge Galt declared the election void on the ground of bribery by agents. He found that the respondent himself (Mr. M. C. Cameron), was not guilty of corrupt practices, and decreed that he should pay the costs of the petition.

The examination of witnesses in the Niagara case closed on Wednesday night, and this (Thursday) morning Judge Hagarty gave his decision, making the election void, and that Mr. Plumb was not disqualified.

The Tory press have made a great ado about the evidence brought out at recent trials regarding the corrupt practices employe: by Reformers on behalf of their candidates. In order to change the tune, we would direct their serious attention to the no less corrupt practices indulged in by Mr. Plumb's friends during the contest in this old burgh. It conclusively confirms our already expressed opinion, that Conservatives are equally guilty with Reformers in indulging in these practices, and we do most heartily wish that the present stringent election law will put an end to all such corrupt agencies as have hitherto been employed by the friends of candidates belonging to both parties.

It was proved that Mr. Plumb contributed \$1,200 to his election expenses, which was disbursed in many curious ways. For instance a Mr. Best had the control of some money—he could not tell how much—and out of that he loaned two voters \$20 each, which has not been returned, and which, it was admitted, was given for the purpose of influencing their votes. Then a Mr. Lawry got \$20 in an envelope, which was handed to him by a Mr. Murphy, and strange to say he felt so little curiosity to know its contents that he did not open the envelope till week after the election. He got rid of the cash, however, for he paid a person named Stuart a bill of \$150 for legal expenses, besides other bills. This money came from Dr. Wilson, who was charged by Mr. Plumb with the work of disbursing the \$1,200. Again we have some curious evidence from a Mr. Thompson, who got an envelope containing \$250 in the place where he kept his curry comb. How this mysterious windfall came he did not pretend to know, but he knew well what to do with it, for the night before the election he distributed the whole of it among Mr. Plumb's most active friends, giving \$4 to one, \$40 to another, and so on. Each of these parties who received the money had a list of names of voters whom they were to call on and get to vote for Plumb. Of course everybody knows, or can rightly conjecture, how the money was used.

The evidence all through shows that Mr. Plumb's agents were as busy as could be in using the money so freely distributed, and even Mr. Plumb himself can hardly clear his skirts of the suspicion that he was concerned in offering inducements to electors.

COLD COMFORT.—The happy faculty of extracting comfort out of almost every political event. In the unseating of Mr. A. F. Macdonald, of Cornwall, it foreshadowed the ruin of the Reform party, and the break-up of the Government. He was re-elected on Tuesday, and this gives the Mail a chance for raising a song of rejoicing over what is pleased to call a "Grit defeat."

Will the Mail please fix Mr. Macdonald's political status, and keep him in that place. It won't do to dangle him on both sides of the fence, as it may suit circumstances.

REFORM DEMONSTRATION.—The Reformers of the County of Norfolk held a grand re-union at Simcoe on Wednesday. About 1200 were present. The Hon. Messrs. Mowat and McKellar, and Messrs. Charlton, Clarke, Stuart, Hawkins, Saunders, and J. I. Mackenzie, delivered stirring speeches. Letters of apology for non-attendance were received from Hon. C. F. Fraser, and Hon. David Christie, and from A. S. Hardy, M.P.P., S. C. Wood, M.P.P., W. Patterson, M.P., and others. The proceedings were enthusiastic throughout.

BLOODSHED and disturbances still mark the progress of the canvass in Louisiana, but they are confined to struggles between factions of the Republican party. The coloured citizens have been taught to rely upon force and violence in politics, and have learned their lesson only too well. Nevertheless there are cheering features in the contest, and the fact that in many cases the coloured voters join hands with the whites in seeking reform is a sure sign of improvement.

The Government have resolved, it is reported, to change the gauge of the Intercolonial Railway at once, so as to take advantage of the present prices of rolling stock and materials. The line will be reduced to the uniform American gauge, the width at which it should have been built in the first place. This is another expense that has to be borne to remedy the blundering of the former Administration.

Mr. Bannerman, who opposes the Liberal candidate in North Renfrew, has issued a circular in which he says he will support the Mackenzie Government in all far measures, and will not offer a fractious opposition, and says his politics are Canada First and party second.

It is said the Premier intends to visit the Upper Ottawa next summer in order to make himself acquainted with the condition of the Public Works in that section, and learn from personal observations the requirements of the timber trade.

Baptist Missionary Convention.
 London, Wednesday Oct. 21.
 The Baptist Convention met this morning at 9 a.m.
 The mission in Manitoba was the first subject up for consideration. A letter was read by the Secretary from Rev. A. McDonald, at present laboring in that field, giving a very cheerful and encouraging account of his work there. It was deemed advisable by the Convention to send another missionary to the field, and already a considerable sum of money has been raised towards that object.
 At the afternoon meeting the following office-bearers were elected for the Home Missionary Convention:—Charles Raymond, Guelph, President; Rev. W. Stewart, B. A., Secretary; George Bell, Treasurer.

An earnest discussion ensued on the desirability of appointing an evangelist to visit the different fields hitherto neglected, but where there are scattered families of Baptists eager to join in their favorite form of worship and organize Churches. A resolution was passed leaving it in the hands of the Board to carry out this object.

In order to raise the funds necessary, guarantees were immediately volunteered, led by Rev. Dr. Castle, of Toronto, and \$800 was found in a very short time. From the tone manifested there will be no difficulty in getting the required sum, about \$1,000.
 The following visiting brethren were then introduced:—Rev. Mr. Bottrell, lately arrived from England, who is to officiate in the new church at the east end of this city; the Rev. Dr. Jewett, a missionary just returned from India, who was received with great applause, and gave an interesting account of his labor in the far east; Bro. Ayer and Bro. Lenny, from the Eastern Baptist Convention; Bro. Youhill, a delegate from the New York State Convention; Rev. Mr. Gudenbager, from the Colored Baptist Convention of Amherstburg; Rev. C. Goodspeed, lately settled in Woodstock; and others.

After the appointment of delegates to the several Conventions, the meeting adjourned.
 The annual missionary meeting was held this evening.


