THE GLOBE AND THE MANUFACTURERS. The Globe is terribly wrathful with the manufacturers of Cobourg because of their alleged interference in the West Northumberland election. It first assures them, with the air of one better acquainted with their particular business than they can possibly be, that really the tariff is an enquiry to them rather than a benefit, and then threatens them with the vengeance of the farming community should they persist in daring to have opinions on the tariff question which do not coincide with those held by the Globe.

In the first place the manufacturers may fairly be supposed to know quite as much of the needs of their own business and of the effect which the tariff is having on it as the members of the Globe staff who are innocent of all knowledge of manufacturing except the manufacture of alleged free trade facts. In the second place the figures of elections held since the general election, do not bear out the Globe's assumption that the agricultural portion of the community are any less enthusiastic for protection than they were in 1878. It is all very well to be gossamer about "deceived" and "trayed" farmers and "starving" protectionists, but all the evidence obtainable goes to show that the principle of protection is at least as popular among farmers now as it was in 1878. If the Globe has any evidence to the contrary, it could not advance the cause of the Cobden club better than by giving that information to the public. Bald unsupported assertions will not do. If it knows the names of farmers who were protectionists in 1878 and who are now free traders, let the public have the names. For our part—and we have just as good opportunities of knowing as our contemporary—we do not believe that the Globe could name a score of such converts among farmers.
