## ALDERMEN DIED EXPEDITIOUSLY WITH MANY MATTERS.

All the aldermen were in their places when Mayor Fleming opened the city council last night's meeting of the city council.

An unusually large number of communications were submitted. These were the most important of the batch: Joseph Barrett, asking that a commission be appointed to gather information as to the use of manufacturing and the benefit to be derived by investing in the same, with a view of inducing manufacturers in different parts of Canada and the United States to locate in this city; E. Farguhar, stating that he is desirous of having a new and better moved from the sidewalk in front of his residence by corporation employees during the winter months and his taxes next year; proffer collected with his taxes next year; Engineer Keating, pointing out that the Toronto Railway Co. were getting some of their horse manure from the city and wanting to know if council desired him to act in the matter; the President of the Young Men's Association, asking that a liberal grant be made to that institution; Solicitor Henry M. East, requesting a grant for a lease of the eastern half of Ashbridge's Bay; Daniel King and others, praying for electric gas lights in Logan-avenue.

A Question of Privilege.

Ald. Crawford rose to a question of privilege. "I ought to make an apology to Ald. Bell. I find that he does not own that property in Grove-avenue. I learn that he sold it to his son and his wife's sister."

Ald. Bell said he sold one part of the property four years and the other a year and a half before the light over which the trouble had arisen had been erected.

Notices of Motion.

Ald. Bailey gave notice of motion, asking that the Executive Committee be requested to apply to the Ontario Legislature at its next session for an amendment to the Municipal Act so as to provide that farmers and gardeners coming to the city with produce and other goods for sale shall be compelled to drive direct to the city market place provided therefor, instead of peddling the same as at present.
