MATCH BY 8 TO 1.

Sided Championship Contest at Rosedale
Tennis Grounds.

The young players that so much were
expected by Toronto lacrosse supporters,
after their gallant fight with the
Cornwall twelve, played their first home
game yesterday in the N.A.A.A. series
with the veteran Ottawa Capitals, before
1500 spectators at Rosedale. Presi-
dent Bagley of the Caps had his men
in extra trim for the game here, Corn-
wall friends of the Ottawa team warn-
ing them to beware of a surprise.

But the Capitals were in it, they were
thoroughly outclassed. Two men only
on the local team, Archie Allen and King-
ston, seemed to figure in the game.

That Ottawa was raising young players
to take the places of retiring ex-
ponents of the national game was evidenced
by the increase put on Smith and
McDonald, who played last year with the
Young Stars of Ottawa, now the intermediate
Capital team, and the trio of other
young players, Templeton, Grimes and
Nolan, who will yet figure for Capital
supremacy. Where Toronto is to get
a team to make the old game of
lacrosse again thoroughly popular here
it is hard to say.

The match was a gentlemanly game
all through, the only unpleasant feature
being an injury to Murphy by the
eighth game. Knowles and Murphy were
out of the teams in the ninth.

The first game started with Hendry
getting the face, and the ball was soon
on the visitors' flags. Quinn got pos-
session of the rubber, and passing it east
on Toronto's flags, Allen came into ac-
tion, relieving the local citadel three
times in succession in a brilliant man-
ner. The Toronto boys played good lac-
rosse, and the spectators thoroughly
enjoyed the sport. After 7-2 minutes
the Capitals went up with a score of 8
to 1.

The second and third went in minute
spurts to the victory. The Capitals men
uncovered and assaulting
Goalkeeper Allen's flags as they pleased.
The fourth game, and the best of the
match, opened with the Toronto boys
playing with a determination. Many a
time Tommy Crown was called upon.
The perfect combination work of the
Caps was evident in this game. "Chris-
ty" Ketchum, Kingston, the point man for
Toronto, sped, distinguished himself.
Time and again he evaded Ketchum,
Smith and Power, and gave the Capital
defense men work. But the Ottawa men
were in to score, and tally they did,
after 12 minutes varying play.

Mr. Joseph Tait, who has seen many
a game of lacrosse put up by Toronto,
kept best heart together—"Our boys
won't score a single point," he said,
"but they'll play lacrosse to-day." But Mr. Tait's
predictions are not always accurate, for
Hendry, Smith and Power, captain, Bissonette,
and the rest of the Capitals, in the
first score for Toronto of the day in
the fifth.
