Jonathan Parsons, B.A., a native of Liverpool, was baptized there in 1862 by Pastor D. O. Parker, and joined N. B. Church by letter in 1868. He came to Halifax as Principal of the Brunswick Street School just after graduating at Acadia in 1867: For some years he was Inspector of Schools, sub-equently a practising Barrister, and now Agent of the Dominion Government in N. S. of the Marine and Fisheries Department. For nearly 16 years he was Superintendent of our Sunday School. Several seasons he conducted the C. C. courses of our B. Y. P. U. Throughout the Maritime Provinces brother Parsons has long been known as an outspoken advocate for Temperance and social and moral progress. He is a Senator of Acadia University, and several years ago was President of the Baptist Convention.
