the mills are quite busy. For clear fir flooring and siding and spruce and cedar siding there is a steady call. Heavy fir timber is also in splendid demand. Stocks of lumber are low, but shingles are heavily stocked at all points on the B. C. coast. It is probable that the mills may decide upon a curtailment in the production of shingles until such time as the market recovers.

UNITED STATES.

General satisfaction is expressed with lumber market conditions in the United States. Trade during July has been typical of that month, being of a quiet character. During the past week, however, the demand has become more active and any weakness which developed early in the month has passed away. Those who hold large stocks of lumber are in no hurry to sell, for they believe that the fall will witness a heavy demand for all kinds of lumber. The New York labor difficulties having been finally adjusted, the outlook in that city is particularly bright. Plans were filed last week for 46 new buildings to be erected in the boroughs of Manhattan and the Bronx, at a cost exceeding \$1,600,000. Cleveland dealers report that Norway lumber is showing decided strength, and white pine shap, which weakened early in the spring, is rapidly recovering. No. 1 common boards, 8 and 10 inch, which suffered from the substitution of yellow pine, are again in demand. Box lumber has been bought in large quantities and dry stock is very scarce; in fact, the call is generally for the lower grades of pine.

In the Albany list one or two grades have been marked down, as follows: No. 1 cuts, 1 to 2 inch, \$55 to \$57; No. 2 cuts, \$35 to \$45; 10 inch common, \$20. In other grades and sizes advances have been made which offset these declines.

Hardwoods have even a better run than white pine. Boston reports a scarcity of thick maple, white ash and plain and quartered oak. Basswood is moving more actively, but there is still little dry stock available. The bulk of the visible supply of hardwoods is in the hands of a few large dealers. In Chicago \$38 is asked for first and second basswood, although a few sales are being made below this figure. Buyers, however, will probably find that they will have to pay the price or use a substitute. Birch and elm are scarce in the Eastern States and sell readily. The base price of hemlock has not changed, that lumber being sought after as much as ever. Eastern dealers report heavy sales of the Pennsylvania product. Michigan stock is beginning to make its appearance in greater quantities at Tonawanda and Buffalo.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Advices from Great Britain in respect to lumber are of a more favorable character than for some time past. The market

is more settled and importers and shippers are coming closer together on the question of price. Importers have changed their attitude somewhat and are now buying with more liberality. There seems to be a general improvement on all sides. Building operations are more active and retail dealers are replenishing their stocks. The absence of shipments of lumber on consignment has been noticeable this year, tending to prevent an overstock. A report from West Hartlepool states that the scarcity of best quality pine deals is causing a number of inquiries, and prices are exceptionally strong and show no signs whatever of weakening. The spruce market has been strengthened by the return to that lumber of many merchants who purchased heavily of whitewood a short time ago because of the high prices demanded for spruce. They appear to be convinced that whitewood cannot supply the place of spruce in the box-making industry. Predictions have been made that deals will shortly bring £10 per standard. They have recently sold at £9 15s. Some firms have given instructions to their representatives to withdraw all previous quotations, owing to the difficulty of obtaining supplies at a price which would leave a margin of profit.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

It is stated that log run basswood by lake from Michigan costs about \$28 in Buffalo.

Sales of hemlock for water delivery are being made on the basis of \$10.50 to \$11 at the mill. Delivered in Chicago the price is \$12.50.

Murray & Gregory, of St. John, N. B., who recently lost their fine saw mill by fire, have set up a portable mill capable of cutting about 30,000 feet per day.

Haines & Company, of Buffalo, have a single lot of about 3,000,000 dry pine lath ready to come down from the Lake Superior district as soon as a boat can be obtained.

Over 3,000,000 feet of logs reached Vancouver, B. C., about midnight on the 21st inst. The logs were divided into five tows, the largest belonging to the tug Pilot, which brought 1,250,000 feet from Toba Inlet.

The tug Roscebel reached Sarnia, Ont., on July 19th with a raft containing 8,000,000 feet of logs towed from Georgian Bay for the Cleveland-Sarnia Saw Mill Company. It is said to be the largest raft ever towed on Lake Huron.

The receipts of lumber at the Tonawanda by vessel during the third week of July were 13,000,000 feet, a gain of 4,000,000 feet over the previous week. Buffalo received by lake only 3,648,000 feet of lumber and 4,932,000 shingles. Probably the largest carload of shingles

over-landed at St. Thomas, Ont., reached the lumber yards of J. M. Green & Son early in July. It contained 370,000 red cedar shingles, and was shipped from Vancouver, B. C., on June 10th, the freight amounting to over \$300.

An improved market for cooperage stock is reported by Chicago. Pork barrels are selling at \$1.15 to \$1.20 for oak; \$1.00 1/2 to \$1.05 for ash; tierce staves are quoted from \$28 to \$29; pork staves at \$28 to \$29; tierce hoops from \$15 to \$15.50.

No. 1, 2 and 3 white pine lath are quoted in North Tonawanda at \$3.75, \$3.25 and \$2.50 respectively, and some dealers say they have secured an advance over these figures in certain instances. In Chicago No. 1 white pine lath are quoted at \$3.50, No. 1 mixed at \$3, and No. 2 at \$2.75.

The United States Consul at St. John, N. B., furnishes the following statement of lumber exports from that port to the United States during the fiscal year ending June 30th, 1903: Lumber, value \$173,307.04; laths, \$211,118.83; piling, \$9,695.36; shingles, \$28,963; staves, \$446.25; wood pulp, \$253,403.61. The above exports comprised Canadian lumber exclusively. The export of the lumber product of main logs is given as follows: Lumber, \$438,746.79; clapboards, \$9,046.00; laths, \$84,111.62; pickets, \$23,631; shingles, \$77,910.21; shooks, \$1,008.00.

There is a slight stiffening of the shingle market at Buffalo, says the American Lumberman, on account of the good demand, but it looks as though it will take some time before the red cedar demoralization will cease, and until it shall there will be few others sold here, especially as it is taking redwoods so long to come through by rail. Dealers say that there is no accumulation of stock yet and possibly when it may become necessary to order more freely for the winter supply, there will be a general firming up of the prices and the trouble will be over.

Fourteen cars of white pine arrived in Port Arthur, Ont., recently, over the line of the Canadian Northern Railway, destined for Glasgow, Scotland, to be used for ship-building. The pine, which had been squared, averaged 35 feet in length and 22 inches on the face. Some of the pieces were 50 feet long. The timber was put into the water, loaded on vessels and taken to Quebec, where it will be transhipped into one of the ocean liners. This is said to be the first material which has been shipped all the way from the head of the lakes to be used for the construction of ocean carriers.

The Barbados market is thus reviewed by S. P. Mutton, Son & Company, under date of July 4th: "The only arrival to note is the 'Foster Rice' with 40,000 feet shipping and 72,000 feet second quality

No receipts of spruce, which is not wanted at present. Shingles—No receipts of Gaspé Long Cedar. The 'Foster Rice' had a small lot of 16,000 Spruce Laying, which were sold at \$3.24, and the 'Orinoco' brought 100,000 Laying Cedar for importers' account."

THE BOSTON MARKET.

Spruce lumber is quiet at Boston and yet the situation is strong. The cargo mills are getting their logs very slowly and some of the saw mills have already shut down. New York prices are reported about \$1 higher than Boston: Ten and 12 in. dimensions, \$31; 9 in. and under, \$19; 10 and 12 in. random lengths, 10 feet and up, \$20.50; 2x3, 2x4, 2x5, 2x6, 2x7 and 3x4, 10 feet and up, \$17 to \$17.50; all other randoms, 9 in. and under, 10 feet and up, \$18 to \$18.50; 5 in. and up, merchantable board, \$17; matched boards, \$18.50 to \$20; out spruce boards, \$13 to \$14; bundle furring, \$17 to \$18.

Hemlock lumber is quiet and unchanged: Boards, 12, 14 and 16 feet stock, \$15 for good eastern; Pennsylvania, No. 1, \$18.50 to \$19.50; No. 2, \$15 to \$16.50.

Western pine lumber is firm and unchanged: Uppers, 1 to 2 in. \$84 to \$87; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$92 to \$97; 4 in. \$96 to \$100; select, 1-in. \$76; 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 in. \$76 to \$78; 2-in. \$78; 2 1/4 to 3 in. \$84; 4-in. \$86; fine common, 1-in. \$67; 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 in. \$69; 2-in. \$72; 2 1/4 to 3 in. \$80; 4-in. \$82; barn boards, \$23 to \$33; coffin boards, \$28 to \$32.

Clapboards are steady and unchanged. Extra, \$45; clear, \$43; second clear, \$40; extra No. 1, \$30.

There is a falling off in the demand for finishing hardwoods, but they are relatively doing better than other kinds: Quartered oak, \$75 to \$83; plain oak, \$45 to \$47; common and rejecta, \$20 to \$25; red oak, plain, \$43; white wood, \$54 to \$60; sap, \$43 to \$48; common, \$38 to \$45; brown ash, \$41

to \$44; white ash, \$43 to \$46; maple, \$33 to \$37; end dried white maple, \$46; birch, 75 per cent. red, \$43 to \$50; northern elm, \$29 to \$31; Michigan elm, \$34 to \$37.

Shingles are quiet: Extra cedar, \$2.40 to \$3.50; clear, \$2.90 to \$3; second clear, \$2.25 to \$2.40; extra No. 1, \$1.50 to \$1.75; British Columbia red cedar, 16-in. five butts to 2-in., \$3.50 to \$3.60; 18-in. five butts to 2 in., \$3.75; five butts to 2 1/2 in., \$3.90.

Laths are quiet and easier: One and five-eighths in. \$3.10 to \$3.20; 1 1/2-in. \$3.00 to \$3.10.

HIGH PRICES FOR LOGS.

The annual sale of unmarked logs rafted by the Fredericton Boom Company this season took place at Fredericton, N. B., on July 22nd. Great interest was taken in the sale, as was evidenced by the large number of lumbermen present, among whom were W. H. Murray, A. H. Hilyard, Chas. Miller and Fred Miles, St. John; R. A. Estey, T. Lynch, Donald Fraser, jr., Robert Aitkin, John A. Morrison, John Kilburn, Jacob Hazleton and T. E. Babbitt, of Fredericton; Wm. Hennesbury, of the Fredericton Boom Company; George Perley, of Mauderville; Parker Glasier, M. P. P., of Lincoln, and others. Bidding was lively at times, and competition was keen, on account of the scarcity of lumber at present. Prices went a little above the average for the spruce lumber, which sold at the high figure of \$13 per thousand.

The first lot for sale was 153 pieces of unmarked hemlock, 14,300 feet, and 7,620 feet of mixed, which was bid in by R. A. Estey, of Fredericton, for \$4.50, per thousand. The next lot offered for sale

was 1,860 pieces, containing 60,930 feet of unmarked and 6,510 feet of mixed cedar. There was some sharp bidding on this, but it was finally knocked down to Charles Miller, of St. John, at the figure of \$10.25 per thousand.

One hundred and twenty-nine pieces of pine, containing 10,490 feet unmarked and 560 feet mixed, was bid in by G. A. Perley, of Mauderville, for \$11.25 per thousand. The keenest competition was for the spruce logs, of which there were 5,993 pieces, containing 301,544 feet of marketable and 42,216 condemned, all unmarked, and 44,335 feet of mixed. After some sharp bidding the spruce was knocked down to Charles Miller, of St. John, who was bidding for John E. Moore, at the high figure of \$13 per thousand.

CROWN TIMBER SALE.

There is to be an extensive sale of timber on Crown lands in New Ontario during the latter part of the summer or in the early autumn of this year. The rush of settlement and the consequent surveying of dozens of new townships has been invading the region of the forests, and in consequence the danger that sections of them will be wiped out by fire is great and is constantly increasing, although the fire ranging is as stringent as possible. It is therefore considered wiser policy to turn some of the exposed timber into a cash asset of the Province as speedily as possible. The locations of the townships and parcels of land off which the timber is to be sold will be announced by the Crown Lands Department as soon as possible, so that all intending buyers may have an ample opportunity of sizing up the properties for themselves.

INCREASED STUMPAGE DUES.

Hon. A. T. Deas, Surveyor General of New Brunswick, has given notice to licensees of crown timber lands and others interested that he will on August 5th hold a conference of lumbermen and others at Fredericton, for the purpose of considering the advisability of increasing the stumpage on crown timber lands during the present season. The notice assigns as a reason for the increase, re-forestation, protection against fire, and the interest of the department and province. A large and representative attendance is asked for and the attendance of an expert on forestry is promised.

FIRE.

The saw and planing mill of Knechtel & Young, at Rossau, Ont., was totally destroyed by fire on the 22nd inst. The only lumber destroyed was a small quantity inside the mill. The loss is about \$2,000, partly covered by insurance. They will probably rebuild.

The lumber yard of George Wilson & Company, St. Catharines, Ont., was burned on July 26th, together with two sheds which contained a quantity of dressed lumber and interior work for building. The planing mill and box factory were saved. The loss is estimated at \$35,000, largely covered by insurance.
