CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

The month of July has afforded manufacturers a very acceptable opportunity to devote attention to the sawing end of their business and to lumber shipments. Trade has been good but not as brisk as during the spring season. It now shows signs of improving and optimistic opinions are exseed as to fall business. The person who sees in the near future a decline in lumber, prices la a rare excep. The many advocates of a firm market point with much satisfaction to the large quantity of this season's production of both pine and hardwood lumber that has already passed out at first hands, ssuch of it for export, and the demand does not yet seem to be satisfied. Offerings of white pine have been readily absorbed, and in addition considerable southern pine has been imported. There is a beavy call for box lumber. Ten inch box and common ranges from \$16 to \$17 and 12-inch from Big to Sec.

Hardwood lumber has been bought urgently all season. The conditions have been favorable to the buyer and are likely to continue so. So much of the hardwood production is consumed by local aranufacturing industries that there is a very small quantity for export.

The shingle market is steady at the recent decline in prices. As country buildings become more nearly completed asincreased demand may be looked for. At the present time the buying is by no means inmenificant, the unfavorable feature being the heavy stock of red cedam. Upon the development of fall trade a firming up of prices may result. Manufacturers are asking \$2.70 for XXXX pine shinites and \$1.00 for XX.

OUPBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The strength of the spruce lumber market is well illustrated by the prices ruling for logs, which are probably the highest ever known. Twelve dollars per thousand was recently paid for one sufficen feet of spruce logs located above Fredericton. and at the annual sale of unmarked logs, held last week, \$13 was paid for spruce of an average quality. In order that the buyers may make a profit on the transaction it will be necessary to obtain about \$17 for deals. This figure, however, is so near the present selling price in England that there is very little bulying. Such shipments as are being made are to fulfil contracts made early in the season. The buyers of logs at these prices are, of course, not counting on a loss, and it would seem that they anticipate an advance in the price of spruce tumber. This anticipation is doubtless based on the shortage in the log supply. Recent rains have brought the main corporation" drive on the St. John river into the boom at Frederiction, but they have not been sufficient to move the stranded logs above Grand Falls. Although there has been a rise in the river, the water is still four feet lower than when the drives were abandoned. The prospects of bringing out stranded logs in midsummer are never considered good, because the water falls very fast again after a rise.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

Lumber continues to sell very readily throughout Manitoba and the Territories. Buildings under way are being pushed forward as rapidly as possible and are consuming a large quantity of lumber, but a slight falling off in the volume of new work is reported. Prices are steady. The situation in British Columbia has been improved by the abundonment of the strike mangurated by the meh employed in the mills and wood-working factories of Vancouver. Lumber is now being delivered throughout the city as usual, and UNITED STATES.

market recovers.

Acqueral natisfaction is expressed with lumber market conditions in the United States. Trade during July has been typial of that month, being of a quiet character. During the past week, however, the demand has become more active and any weakness which developed early in the month has passed away. Those who hold large stocks of lumber are in no burry to sell, for they believe that the fall will witness a heavy demand for all kinds of lumber. The New York labor difficulties having been finally adjusted, the outlook in that city is particularly bright. Plans were filed last week for 46 new uildings to be erected in the baroughs of Manhattan and the Bronx, at a cost exceeding \$1,600,000. Cleveland dealers report that Norway lumber is showing decided strength, and white pine shop, which weakened early in the spring, is rapidly recovering. No. 1 common boards, 8 and 10 inch, which suffered from the substitution of yellow pine, are again in demand. - Box lumber has been bought in large quantities and dry stock is very scarce; in fact, the call is generally for the lower grades of pine.

In the Albany list one or two grades have been marked down, as follows: No. 1 cutu, 1 to 2 inch, \$55 to \$57; No. 2 cuts, \$35 to \$45; to inch common, \$20. In other grades and sizes advances have been ade which offset these declines.

Hardwoods have even a better run than rhitè pine. Boston reports a scarcity of thick maple, white ash and plain and quartered oak. Basswood is moving more actively, but there is still little dry stock available. The bulk of the visible supply of hardwoods is in the hands of a few large desiers. In Chicago \$38 is asked for first and second basswood, although a few sales are being made below this figure. Buyers, bowever, will probably find that they will have to pay the price or use a substitute. Birch and elm are scarce in the Eastern States and sell readily. The base price of hemiock has not changed, that lumber being sought after as much as ever. Eastern dealers report heavy sales of the Pennuylvania product. Michigan stock is beginning to make its appearance in greater quantities at Tonawanda and Refelo.

Advices from Great Britain in respect to lumber are of a more favorable character than for some time past. The market

is more notated and importors and ships ng ch or on the quee flow of price. Importors have changed their attitude agnew bat and are son buying with more liberalty. There seems to be a general improves est on all sides. ng operations are more active and retail dealers are replenishing their stocks. The absence of shipments of lumber op ignment has been noticeable this year, tending to prevent an overstock. A report from West Hartlepedi states that the scarcity of book quality pine deals is causing a number of inquiries, and prices are exceptionally strong and show no signs whatever of weakening. The spruce market has been strengthened by the return to that lumber of many merchants who purchased heavily of whitewood a short time ago because of the high price sanded for spruce. They appear to be convinced that whitewood cannot supply the place of apruce is the box-making industry. Predictions have been made that deals will shortly bring £10 per standard. They have recently sold at £9 15s. Some firms have given instruction to their representatives to withdraw all previous quotations owing to the difficulty. of obtaining supplies at a price which would leave a margin of profit.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

It is stafed that log rue basswood by lake from Michigan costs about \$28 in Buffala.

Sales of bemlock for water delivery are being made on the basis of \$10.50 to \$11 at the mill. Delivered in Chicago the price is \$12.50.

Murray & Gregory, of St. John, N. B., who recently lost their fine saw mill by fire, have set up a portable mill capable of cutting about 30,000 feet per day.

Haines & Company, of Buffalo, have a single lot of about 3,000,000 dry pine lath ready to come down from the Lake Superior district as soon as a boat can be

Over 3,000,000 feet of logs reached Vancouver, B. C., about midnight on the 21st mst. The logs were divided into five tows, the largest belonging to the tug Pilot, which brought 1,250,000 test from Toba Inlet.

The tug Roscebel resched Samia, Ont., do July 19th with a raft containing 8,-200,000 feet of logs towed from Georgian Bay for the Cleveland-Sarnia Saw Mill Company. It is said to be the largest rait. ever towed on Lake Huron,

The receipts of lumber at the Tonawan has by vessel during the third week of July were 13,000,000 feet, a gain of 4,-000,000 feet over the previous week. Buffalo received by lake only 3,648,000 feet of lumber and 4,952,000 shingles

verancelized at the The pass, Ont., canched the Humber-yards of J. M. Oreen & Son early in July. It contained 270,000 rededar shingles, and was shipped from Vanesuver, B. C., on June 10th, the freight amounting to over \$300.

An improved market for cooperage stock is reported in Chicago. Pork barrels are selling at \$1.15 to \$1.20 for oak ; \$1.00% to \$1.05 for mah; tierce staves are quoted from \$50 to \$39; pork staves at \$20 to \$23; tierce boops from \$15 to \$15.50. 0 .

No. 1, 2 and 3 white pipe iath are quoted in North Tonawanda at \$3.75, \$3.25 and \$1.50 respectively, and some doubers say they have secured an advance over tee figures in certain instances, In Chicago No. 1 white pine lath are quoted at \$3.50, No. 1 mixed at \$3, and No. 2 at \$2.75.

The United States Consul at St. John. N. B., turnishes the following statement of lumber exports from that port to the United States during the fiscal year ending June 30th, 1903: Lumber, value \$113 307.04; laths, \$211,118.83; piling, \$9,-695.36 ahingles, \$28,963; staves, \$446,-25; wood pulp, \$253,402.61. The above exports comprised Canadian lumber exclusively. The export of the lumber product of main togs is given as follows: Lumber, \$438,746.79; clapboards,\$9,046.00; laths, \$84,112.62; pickets, \$223.63; shingles, \$77,910.21; shooks, \$1;008.00.

There is a slight stiffening of the shingle market at Buffalo, says the American Lumberman, on account of the good demand, but it looks as though it will take ne time before the red cedar demoralisation will coase, and until it shall there will be few others sold here, sepecially as it is taking redwoods so long to come through by rail. Dealers say that there is no accumulation of stock yet and possibly when it may become necessary to order more freely for the winter supply, there will be a general firming up of the prices and the trouble will be over.

Fourteen cars of white pine arrived in Port Arthur, Ont., recently, over the line of the Canadian Northern Railway, destined for Glasgow, Scotland, to be used for ship-building. The pine, which had been squared, averaged 35 feet in length and 22 inches on the face. Some of the pieces, were 50 feet long. The timber was put into the water, loaded on vessels and taken to Quebec, where it will be transshipped into one of the ocean liners. This. is said to be the first material which has been shipped all the way from the head of the Jakes to be need for the construction of ocean carriers.

THE BOSTON MARKET.

Spruce lumber is quiet at Boston and yet the situation is strong. The cargo mills are getting their logs very slowly and some of the car mills have already shut down. New York prices are reported about \$1 higher than Bouton: Ten and 12 in. dimensions, \$25 ; 9 in. and under, \$19; 10 and 12 in. random lengths, to feet and up, \$20.50; 213, 2x4, 2x5, 2x6, 2x7 and 3x4, 10 feet and up, \$17 to \$17.50; all other randoms, gin. and under, to feet and up, \$18 to \$18.50; 5 in. and up, merchantable boards, \$171 matched Boards, \$18 50 to \$20; out apruce boards, \$13 to \$14: bundle farring, \$17 to \$18.

Hemlock lumber is quiet and unchanged: Boards, 12, 14 and 16 feet stock, \$15 for good eastern; Pennsylvania, No. 1, \$18.50 to \$19.50; No. 2, \$15

Western pine lumber is firm and unchanged: Uppers, 1 to > in. \$84 to \$87; 21/2 to 3 in., \$92 to \$97; 4-in. \$96 to \$100; selects, 1-18. \$76; 11/4 to ru in. \$76 to \$78; 2-in. \$78; 214 ta 3 in. \$84; 4-in. \$86; fine common, 1-In. \$67; 15/ to 25/4in. \$69; 2-in. \$72; 25/2 to 3 in. \$80; 4-in. \$82; barn boards, \$23 to \$33; coffin boards,

Clapboards are steady and unchanged. . Extra, \$45; clear, \$43; second clear,\$40; extra No. 1, \$30.

There is a falling off in the demand for finishing hardwoods, but they are relatively doing better than other kinds: Quartered oak, \$75 to \$83; plain oak, \$45 19 \$47; common and rejects, \$20 to \$25; red oak, plain, \$43; whitewood, \$54 to \$60; sap, \$43 to \$48; common, \$38 to \$45; brown ash, \$41

to \$44; white ash, \$43 to \$46; maple,\$33 to \$37; and dried white maple, \$46; birch, 75 per cent. red, \$45 to \$50; northern elm, \$29 to \$31; Michigan elm, \$34 to \$37.

Shingles are quiet : Extra cedar, \$3.40 to \$3.501 clear, \$2.90 to \$3 1 second clear, \$2.25 to \$2.40; extra No. 1, \$2.50 to \$1.75; British Columbia red cedat, 16.in. five butts to 2-in., \$3.50 to \$3.60; 48in. five butts to z in., \$3.75; five butts to 21 in., \$3.90.

Laths are quiet and easier: One and five-eighths in. \$3.10 to \$3.20; 114-in. \$3.00 10 \$3.10.

HIGH PRICES FOR LOGS.

The annual sale of unmarked logs rafted by the Fredericton Boom Company this season took place at Fredericton, N. B., on July 22nd. Great interest was taken in the sale, as was evidenced by the large number of lumbermen present, among whom were W. H. Murray, A.H. Hilyard, Chas. Miller and Fred Miles, St. John ; R. A. Estey, T. Lynch, Donald Fraser, ir., Robert Aitkin, John A. Morrison, John Kilburn, Jacob Hazleton and T. E. Babitt, of Fredericton; Wm. Hennebury, of the Fredericton Boom Company; George Perley: of Maugerville: Parker Glasier. M. P. P., of Lincoln, and others. Bidding was lively at times, and competition was keen, on account, of the scarcity of lum. ber at present. Prices went a little above the average for the spruce lumber, which sold at the high figure of \$13 per thousand.

The first lot for sale was 153 pieces of unmarked hemlock, 1 5,360 feet, and 7,620 feet of mixed, which was hid in by R. A. Estey, of Fredericton, tor \$4.50, per thousand. The next lot offered for sale was 1,860 pieces, containing 60,930 feet of unmarked and 6,510 feet of mixed cedar. There was some sharp bidding on this, but it was finally knocked down to Charles Miller, of St. John, at the figure of \$10.25

One hundred and twenty-nine pieces of . pine, containing 10,490 feet unmarked and 560 feet mixed, was bid in by G. A. Perley, of Maugorville, for \$11.25 per thousand. The keenest competition was for the spruce logs, of which there were 5,983 pieces, containing 301,544 feet of marketable and 42,216 coademned, all unmarked, and 44,335 feet of mixed. After some sharp bidding the spruce was knocked down to Charles Miller, of St. John, who was bidding for John J. Moore; the high figure of \$13 per thousand.

CROWN TIMBER SALE.

There is to be an extensive sale of timber on Crown lands in New Ontario during the latter part of the summer or in the early autumn of this year. The rush of settlement and the consequent surveying of dozens of new townships has been invading the region of the forests, and in consequence the danger that sections of them will be wiped out by fire in greatand is constantly increasing, although the fire ranging is as stringent as stoosible. It is therefore considered wiser policy to turn some of the exposed timber into a cash asset of the Province as speedily as possible. The locations of the townships and parcels of land off which the timber is to be rold will be announced by the Crown Lands Department as soon as possible, so that all intending buyers may have an ample opportunity of sizing up the properties for themselves.

INCREASED STUEPAGE DUES

Hon. A. T. Dunn, Surveyor General of New Brunswick, has given notice to licensees of crown timber lands and others interested that he will on August 5th hold a conference of lumbermen and others at Fredericton, for the pur pone of considering the advisability of increasing the stumpage on crown timber lands during the (present season. The notice assigns as a reason for the increase. re-forestation, protection against-fire, and the interest of the department and province. A large and representative altendance is asked for and the attendance of an expert on forestry is promised. ...

The saw and planing mill of Knechtel & Young, at Rosseau, Ont., was totally destroved by fire on the sand inst. The only side the mill. The loss is about \$2,000, partly covered by insurance. They will probably rebuild.

The lumber yard of George Wilson & Company, St. Catharines, Ont., burned on July 26th, together with two sheds which contained a quantity of dressed lumber and interior work for building. The planing mill and box factory were saved. The loss is estimated at \$35,000, largely covered by insurance.


