

ANNUAL MEETING.

The fifteenth annual meeting of the Historical Society of Manitoba was held in the City Council Chamber, Winnipeg, on the 13 day of February, 1895.

The Hon. Senator Bernier, Ald. A. J. Andrews and E. A. Garratt, B.A., were elected members of the Society, and after the transaction of certain routine business the Society adjourned until 28 February, 1895, at the same hour.

At the adjourned meeting of the Society the report of the Executive Council was presented and adopted. It was as follows:

The only papers of importance read during the past year were those of His Hon. Lieutenant Governor Schultz, one on "The Old Crow Wing Trail," 5 April, 1894 (puband one on 29 November, 1894, on "Some Very Old Inhabitants' (unpublished). The latter chiefly related to the domestic life of the inhabitants of the Selkirk Colony, together with some discussion as to the native races and their places of abode.

MUSEUM.

The labor entailed in the arrangement of the Society's museum and reference library and removal to larger and more commodious quarters has prevented members from giving as much time and energy to original work in connection with the Society as might perhaps otherwise have taken place.

Mr. Emmanuel Ohlen gave his valuable services for almost three weeks to the removal and readjustment of the reference library, and the collections. By his removal to Sweden the Society lost a valuable member and caused a minute, expressive of the high esteem in which he was held, to be entered in the records of the Society.

VISIT OF GOVERNOR GENERAL.

His Excellency the Governor General, the Countess of Aberdeen and suite, visited the Society's rooms on the 27 day of September, 1894. They were met by Acting President Dr. Laird, who, at the request of the officers and members, tendered to the visitors a cordial welcome to the Society, and explained the objects which the members had in view; the results of their work, and the prospects for a continuance of interest in Historical enquiries in the Northwest. Their Excellencies examined very carefully the collections, expressed their surprise at the extent of the Society's work, and, prior to leaving the rooms, thanked the officers for the welcome which had been extended to them.

The Society has added to its reference library a complete set of the publications of Kongl. Villerhe Historie och Anhqiubets Akademiers Manadsblad, for which it is indebted to Dr. Anton Blomberg, of Stockholm, Sweden.

MEMBERS.

The Society has lost a member of the Council by removal of Mr. Emmanuel Ohlen. It has also to mourn the loss by death of three of its most prominent members. On April 16, 1894, Dr. Tache, brother of the Archbishop of St. Boniface, who died at Ottawa; Mr. Robert Campbell, of Elphinstone, Man., who died in May, 1894, both of whom were corresponding members, and the Most Rev. Alex. Tache, Archbishop of St. Boniface, a life member of the Society, who died on the 22 of June, 1894.

Joseph Charles Tache, M.D. Dr. Tache was born at Kamouraska, Quebec, the 24, December, 1820. He received his literary and professional education in the City of Quebec. He practised his profession for several years successfully at Rimouski, and for ten years represented the County of that name in Parliament. In 1864 he was appointed Deputy Minister of Agriculture. He represented Canada in France at the Paris Exhibitions in 1855 and 1867, and was the British

delegate for Canada at the International Sanitary Conference of 1881 at Washington. His writings are extensive and valuable, embracing works on literary, historical and scientific subjects. His death took place at Ottawa.

On the 22 of June last, 1894, the Right Reverend A. A. Tache, Archbishop of St. Boniface, one of the life members of this Society, died at St. Boniface in the seventy-first year of his age. He was born at Riviere du Loup, in the Province of Quebec, and was a younger brother of Dr. Joseph Tache. He received his literary education at St. Hyacinthe, and his theological training at Montreal. In 1845 he came out to the Red River country, where his life of influence and usefulness was to be spent. He passed the next seven or eight years of his life as an earnest and self-sacrificing Missionary to the Indians of the North-West. In 1853 he became Bishop of St. Boniface, and was so able and enthusiastic in the discharge of his duties that in a few years churches, seats of learning, and religious houses in a large measure corresponding to the wants of his people were established throughout his extensive diocese. He took a deep and active interest in the progress of this Province, and at an important crisis of its history took a prominent part in the interests of its peace and prosperity. He was held in high esteem by all classes in this community for his noble qualities, both of head and heart. His death was universally regretted, and his name will long be held in remembrance throughout this land.

The Society has unfortunately been unable to obtain particulars with reference to the life of Mr. Campbell.

Report of the Archæological and Scientific Committee.

To the Executive Council of the Historical and Scientific Society of Manitoba:

The Archæological and Natural History Committee begs to report that the donations to the museum during the past year have not been as numerous as might be desired, yet the department has not been neglected. We are glad to report very much increased accommodations and better facilities for making a proper use of our collections than the Society has heretofore had, the space now placed at our disposal being such as to admit of much greater convenience in arranging and displaying specimens. In the re-arranged quarters of the Society, the northwest corner room and the room next to it on the north side of the city hall have been allocated to the museum, and, with the adjacent corridor, they are already full of cases.

There is still room, however, for improvement, many of the specimens not as yet being properly classified, and in a few cases the description has unfortunately been lost trace of in process of removal. It is expected, however, that these defects will shortly be remedied.

The most considerable addition to the Society's archæological collection during the year, is the loan of Mr. Basil Hamilton, of the C.P.R. Land Department, which includes a number of arms and other relics commemorating the regime of the Nor'-West Fur Trading Company in Fort William, a collection of about 130 antique coins and other miscellaneous articles. This loan is now is process of being received and catalogued.

Report of Library and Publication Committee.

To the Executive Council of the Historical and Scientific Society of Manitoba:

Your Library Committee begs to report that the chief event of the year 1894 in its department was the removal to new rooms in the front part of the city hall. As soon as the Council had made the necessary arrangements for a transfer, it was agreed, after a good deal of deliberation, that the arrangement of rooms likely to prove most satisfactory was to devote the centre room on the east side to library purposes, for which it had been intended in the original plan of the building. this room, in addition to the ordinary book cases, a large case was erected for the accommodation of the bound volumes of city papers, now one of the valuable articles of the Society. The room adjoining this to the south it was agreed to use as an office, as a newspaper reading room, for the accommodation of part of the library and for the catalogues. Through this room also is the only entrance in daily use to the whole library. Passing through the library room access is gained to the room adjoining it to the south, where the magazines and illustrated papers are displayed. The north-east corner room is used for the library of books relating to this country, and the room adjoining it on the west is the reference library, which overflows into the neighboring corridors. The work of removal was begun on the 16 of March, and the library was open again for the issue of books one week thereafter.

The removal into more commodious quarters made possible the plan of re-cataloguing the references and North-West Libraries, which had been in abeyance for some time. It was agreed to adopt Dewey's system of relative classification, which has been strongly advocated in recent years of American libraries, and it was agreed that the catalogue should be preserved in Rudolph's Patent Indexer, a recent invention which is highly commended. The work of re-cataloguing is now in progress. The books in the north-west library have been

On account of the many expenses incurred in moving, and especially in fitting of the new rooms, the Committee, acting under instructions from the Council, has bought but few books during the year. Among the additions it is perhaps worth while to mention two books which record the history of the Society itself—the first, Visitors' Book, which was displaced by a new volume, and the first large volume recording loans from the Library. Both these volumes now pass into our historical collection.

During the past year, too, an engagement was reached with the City Council in virtue of which a part of a vault in the basement of the City Hall is placed at the disposal of the Society for the fire-proof preservation of such possessions of the Society as can be stored in a vault.

The number of books purchased during the year was 315, at a cost of \$389.69. The amount on hand at date, including the 1893 balance to carry the committee on to May, is \$118.

The books are distributed in departments as follows: History 42; Fiction 186; Science 32; Voyages and Geography 18; Biography 15; Poetry 9; Literature 13.

War News, April-August, 1885.
