REPORT.

TO THE BENEFICIARIES OF THE TEMPORALITIES BOARD.

At the meeting of the Board held on the 10th of November last, Mr. William Walker of Quebec, and Mr. Alexander Mitchell of Montreal, gave in their resignations as members of the Board respectively. The resignations were, after due consideration, accepted by the Board, who at the same time recorded its sincere thanks to these gentlemen for their disinterested and valuable services in past years. In conformity with the by-laws, immediate steps were taken to secure the election of two laymen to fill the vacancies. Circulars with voting papers were sent to each of the beneficiaries. The result of the examination by the Executive Committee of the papers returned to the Secretary was that Mr. Alexander Macpherson of Montreal, and Mr. James McLennan, Q.C., of Toronto, were declared to have received the largest number of votes, and were elected accordingly in room of Messrs. Walker and Mitchell.

INVESTMENTS.—Important changes have been made in the investments since the date of last report. At that time there was a large amount of money in the bank, awaiting investment, to which a further sum of \$28,000 was added by the maturing of a number of Harbour Bonds. The Board is happy to say that the whole of that money has since been invested in mortgages on first class city property, bearing interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum. Corporation Bonds, to the value of \$16,000, have since matured and were paid on the 1st of May, for which it is hoped that profitable investments will also be found before long. The par value of the investments and cash in the bank is \$265,296.26, and the cash value \$275,944.26.

The draft upon capital to meet the payments of the year was \$9,839.74. If Mr. Michie's bequest of \$4,000 were considered as capital in last year's account, the draft on capital this year is less by \$2,550.41 than that of the previous year. The annual interest from investments is now \$16,165.96.

In view of the satisfactory condition of the investments, the Board feels justified in continuing for the current half-year the scale of payments made last year in terms of a resolution of the Board passed on the 14th of November, 1884, "to continue the payment as heretofore to the commuting and privileged ministers, and that in the present state of the fund, the payments to the non-privileged ministers and to Queen's College be reduced to *fifty per cent.* of the amounts formerly paid." It was also agreed that no retired ministers "except those who have already been in the receipt of increase payments, as such, are to receive any increase of their allowances by reason of their retirement." Reference to the accounts herewith will shew that, in accordance with the above cited resolution, the commuting ministers were paid last June and December at the rate of \$450 each per annum; the privileged ministers \$400; Rev. Hugh Niven, Rev. M. W. Livingstone, and Rev. James Herald—non-privileged ministers retired—at the rate of \$200 each per annum; to all the other non-privileged ministers at the rate of \$100 per annum, and to Queen's College at the rate of \$1,000 per annum.

CHANGES IN THE ROLL.—The names of four commuting ministers have been removed from the list of beneficiaries by death during the year, as follows: (1) Rev. Thomas Macpherson, M.A., of Lancaster, who died on the 14th of May, 1884, in the 83rd year of his age. (2) Rev. Thomas Fraser of Montreal, who died on the 15th of July, 1884, in the 93rd year of his age. (3) Rev. Alexander Mann of Pakenham, who died on the 15th of September, 1884, in the 84th year of his

age. (4) Rev. William Simpson of Como —formerly of Lachine—who died on the 29th of April in the 78th year of his age. The name of Rev. Alexander N. McQuarrie, late of Morrin College, Quebec, has been removed from the list, for the reason that it is not certified by any Presbytery that Mr. McQuarrie is engaged in the active service of the Church.
