TORONTO GARRISON ARTILLERY.

A Movement on Foot Looking to the Re-organization into a Brigade of Four or Six Batteries.

The Re-organization Committee will meet at Captain Harrison's 239 Beverley-street, tonight at 8 o'clock. Up to the beginning of 1895 this corps appeared in the militia list as commanded by Capt. W. B. McMurrich. Since that date, it has been signed by every non-commissioned officer and man asking, with Captain McMurrich's consent, that it might be re-organized as a brigade, under the command of Captain Harrison, who is not only a qualified officer, but has commanded a volunteer artillery corps. This petition was presented to the Minister of Militia by Mr. E. Coatsworth, M.P., on Aug. 15, but owing to the lack of funds at the time, nothing could be done. It will be remembered that only sufficient funds were then in hand to pay the militia for the last two-thirds of their annual pay—that is, after the militia had been disbanded.

The men of the Toronto Garrison Artillery are not easily daunted, and quietly went to work and prepared a petition from the citizens of Toronto generally, to the Governor-General in Council, and to the presentation of the same to Parliament. A SCARBORO ROMANCE.

A YOUNG MAN ARRESTED FOR RUNNING AWAY FROM HIS WAGES.

New Brings Suit for Damages Against His Former Employer and the Man Who Assisted His Detention—Evidence Given at the Trial Yesterday—Craik Receives \$1000.

The case of Grimes v. Miller and Kennedy occupied the entire afternoon. The plaintiff is a young Englishman, named Thomas Grimes, who has been in this country a little over a year. The defendants are William Miller, a Scarboro farmer, and Henry Kennedy, a prominent miller, who handed Grimes over to the police. Grimes says he was to get \$10.00 a month and that no time of engagement was fixed. Miller says that Grimes was hired for a year and was to receive \$125. Grimes left before the end of the year. He was overtaken at Agincourt Station by Miller and Kennedy and he says that he was arrested by the latter. Kennedy denies that he did any arresting, for he is not a constable. He says that Miller asked him to help to detain Grimes. Grimes, as a matter of fact, was detained or imagined he was detained, and was brought before Magistrate John C. Clark and sentenced to jail for 21 days in default of payment of a fine of \$5 and costs, for breach of contract. The defendant was subsequently quashed by the Court of Queen's Bench, which brings an action against Miller and Kennedy for damages for wrongful arrest. Mr. Ashworth has charge of the plaintiff's case, and Messrs. Titus and Bradford are looking after the defence.

Mr. Titus moved for a non-suit on the grounds of malice on the part of the defendants, and that the want of a reasonable and probable cause had not been proven.
