CONDENSED REPORT

OF THE

EIGHTH ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE

CANADA CONGREGATIONAL WOMAN'S BOARD OF MISSIONS.

EMMANUEL CHURCH, MONTREAL, June 13th, 1894.

The Convention assembled at 10 o'clock, the President in the chair. The meeting was opened by devotional exercises, consisting of singing, reading and prayer, led by the President.

The minutes of the last meeting, held in Bond St. Church, Toronto, on the evening of June 1st, 1893, were read and confirmed.

Miss Rhoda James was appointed Minute Secretary.

The following ladies were then appointed to serve on the different committees:

Business.—Mrs. Moodie, Montreal, Convener; Mrs. Powter, Montreal: Mrs. Robertson, Winnipeg; Miss Wood, Ottawa; Mrs. Roberts, Toronto; Mrs. Nasmith, Toronto.

Resolutions.—Mrs. Barker, Toronto, Convener; Mrs. Roberts, Toronto; Mrs. McKechnie, Granby; Mrs. Macallum, Martintown; Mrs. McDermid, Martintown.

Finance.—Mrs. Williams, Montreal, Convener; Mrs. Chas. Gurd, Montreal.

Credentials.-Mrs. Nasmith, Toronto; Mrs. Garlick, Montreal.

After some discussion it was decided to elect the officers by ballot, instead of, as heretofore, on the report of a Nominating Committee; and Thursday morning, immediately after the reading of the minutes, was the time fixed for the election.

Branch and Auxiliary Reports were next called for, and responded to as follows:

On motion, these reports were adopted:

Much regret was felt at the withdrawal of Queen's Co. (N.S.) Branch from the Board, and the Secretary was instructed to write to them to that effect.

Dr. Pauline Root, late of Madura, India, and Miss Lily Lyman, till recently a missionary of the Board in Bombay, were introduced to the meeting by Mrs. Williams and cordially welcomed.

The devotional hour followed, led by Miss Dougall. Her words were helpful and encouraging, and the texts of Scripture quoted by one and another as incentives to missionary work, inspired all with a desire to do more than ever before for its advancement.

The meeting then adjourned for luncheon.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON.

2 O'CLOCK.

The afternoon session was opened by singing and prayer. The minutes of the morning session were read and confirmed.

The President then delivered her annual address, in which, after referring to the pleasure it gave her to be again with the Board in its Annual Meeting, she briefly sketched the events of interest in the missionary world during the year. She then read a letter from Miss. Emily Macallum, asking if it were possible for the Board to establish a Canadian scholarship in the Girls' Boarding School, Smyrna, under her charge.

The roll was then called, and fifty-one delegates were reported to be in attendance.

The Rev. W. T. Gunn, for the C. C. F. M. S., conveyed greetings to the Board.

The address of welcome was then given by Mrs. J. B. Silcox, Montreal, and replied to by Mrs. Roberts, of Toronto.

Sister societies were next heard from, and Mrs. W. R. Ross, for the Methodist W. F. M. S., Mrs. T. J. Claxton, for the Baptist Board, and Mrs. Grier, for the Presbyterian W. F. M. S., extended their greetings to the Board.

The Secretary read a letter from Miss Anne McCord, conveying the greetings of the Church of England W. F. M. S. Letters of greeting were also read from Mrs. Boult, of Guelph, and Mrs. Freeland, of Bowmanville, expressing their warm interest in the work of the Board; also one from Miss Melville, of Cisamba, one of our missionaries.

The Secretary's report was then read, showing on the whole a satisfactory condition of the work of the Board.

The Treasurer then gave the financial statement, which was most encouraging, showing larger contributions than in any previous year. It will be found in full on another page. Thanksgiving and dedicatory prayers were offered after the reading of this report. Both of these reports were, on motion, adopted.

Miss Effie Gurd sang very acceptably the solo, "One Sweetly Solemn Thought."

A "Free Parliament," on "Our Mission Bands," lasting one hour, was then conducted by Mrs. Williams, in the absence of Miss Richardson. The topic, "Who should belong," was ably taken up in a paper by Miss Campbell, of Paris. "How to interest the mothers to secure regular attendance," was written on by Miss Edith Macallum. "What work to attempt" was the subject of Miss Rawlings' paper, and "The best time of meeting" was discussed by Miss Hattie Day. Each paper was followed by a free expression of opinion on the subject, and much information was gained from the "Parliament."

The meeting closed with the singing of the Doxology.

WEDNESDAY EVENING.

8 P.M.

The President occupied the chair.

After devotional exercises, Mrs. Williams introduced Dr. Pauline Root, who gave a most interesting and instructive talk on the conditions of life among the people of the southern part of India, among whom she had laboured. At the close of her address Mr. Alexander sang a solo, "I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say," and the meeting was closed with singing and prayer.

THURSDAY MORNING.

10 O'CLOCK.

The meeting was opened by singing and prayer. After the reading of the minutes, the following reports, left over from the previous day for lack of time, were read: Literature, by Mrs. Moodie; Organization, by Miss Dougall; Letters, by Miss Foggin. All of these reports were, on motion, adopted.

A paper on "Room in the North-west" was read by Mrs. J. B. Silcox, in the absence of the writer, Mrs. Moor, of Brandon.

Ballotting for officers was next proceeded with, resulting in the election of the following officers:

A standing vote of thanks was tendered Mrs. Williams, the retiring Treasurer, for her valuable services, so cheerfully rendered, extending over a period of four years.

Mrs. Powter and Mrs. Gurd were appointed Auditors.

The devotional hour followed, conducted by Mrs. Barker, and was participated in by many of those present.

The meeting adjourned for luncheon at 12.30.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

2 O'CLOCK.

After devotional exercises and the reading of the minutes, the Committee on Resolutions, through Mrs. Barker, Convener, reported as follows:

- 1. That we record our thankfulness to our Heavenly Father for having restored to health our beloved President, so that she is permitted to be with us again; also that those of us who have travelled have been brought here in safety. Carried.
- 2. We rejoice that during the year another missionary, Miss A. M. Barker, has offered herself for work in the foreign field, and will soon leave for her future home in Constantinople; we would express our thankfulness to God for having put it into her heart to thus go forth. Carried.
- 3. In view of the withdrawal of the Queen's County Branch from the Board we recommend that we pay the expenses of the President

and Mrs. Williams to the Maritime Provinces in order to awaken fresh interest in the working of our own Board, especially in connection with Foreign Missions.

After some discussion of the above resolution, it was moved, seconded and carried that the above mentioned ladies form a committee to communicate with Queen's County Branch on the subject, and on their reply to do as they think proper.

- 4. That we tender our hearty thanks to the officers of Emmanuel Church for the use of their building; also to the ladies who have so kindly entertained us in their own homes, and at the lunch table. Carried.
- 5. That we send our sincere thanks to Miss Foggin for the trouble she has taken, from time to time, in copying the Foreign Missionary Correspondence for our Auxiliaries. Carried.

The Business Committee, Mrs. Moodie, Convener, recommended that the following questions be considered:

1. Of federation in the National Council of Women.

Moved, seconded and carried, "That we do not federate in the N. C. W."

2. Of retaining our two African missionaries, Miss Johnston and Miss Melville.

Moved, seconded and carried, "That we continue to support Miss Johnston and Miss Melville for the coming year."

3. Of founding a Canadian scholarship in Miss Emily Macallum's girls' boarding school, Smyrna.

Moved, seconded and carried, "That we pledge \$70 to establish a Canadian scholarship in Miss Macallum's girls' boarding school, Smyrna."

4. Of pledging a portion of our income during the coming year to the C. C. M. S.

Moved, seconded and carried, "That we pledge ourselves to raise \$500 towards the funds of the C. C. M. S."

5. Of abolishing the one dollar membership fee.

Moved, seconded and carried, "That the question be dropped."

6. Of printing and distributing 2,000 Annual Reports.

Moved, seconded and carried, "That we print and distribute in the usual manner 2,000 Annual Reports."

7. Of granting \$20 towards a monthly leaflet, and discontinuing the Literature and Foreign Correspondence Departments.

Moved, seconded and carried, "That a committee, consisting of the President, Secretary, Treasurer and Mrs. Williams, enquire cost of such leaflet, and do as they see fit; the literature on hand to be left with Mrs. Moodie and used at her discretion."

8. Of taking up the usual thankoffering.

Moved, seconded and carried, "That the Auxiliaries be asked to take up the usual thankoffering as near Thanksgiving Day as possible."

9. Of place for next meeting.

Moved, seconded and carried, "That we accept with thanks the invitation of Toronto Branch to hold our next Annual Meeting in Zion Church, Toronto."

Miss Lamb here sang a solo very acceptably.

A concise and instructive paper was then read by Miss Wood on "Our work in Africa during the past year."

A "Free Parliament," lasting one hour, was next held, the subject being "How to make our Auxiliary meetings more successful." The discussion was led by Mrs. Garlick, and the following ladies spoke on the subjects named: I. As to programme, Mrs. Granger. 2. As to attendance, Mrs. McKechnie. 3. As to singing, Mrs. Williams. 4. Financially, Mrs. Sanders.

Many helpful suggestions were made, all emphasizing one point, that success was only to be attained by persistent, personal, patient efforts.

The Question Box was conducted by Mrs. Williams.

The meeting was closed by singing the Doxology.

THURSDAY EVENING.

8 o'clock.

Mrs. Williams occupied the chair. After devotional exercises, Mrs. Williams gave a resume of the work of the Board. She was followed by Dr. Pauline Root, who gave a thrilling account of the medical work in Madura. Mrs. Chambers sang "There is a green hill far away," and the singing of "Blest be the tie that binds" brought the Convention to a close.

EXTRACTS FROM OFFICIAL REPORTS.

MRS. J. D. NASMITH, Corresponding Secretary:

"On the whole, we feel that this past year has been one of encouragement. New auxiliaries have been formed, which we trust may be centres for fresh work and workers; old friends remain faithful and true, and new friends are being raised up who are becoming interested in the work and responsive to its claims. . . . The accounts that have reached us of their (Miss Melville and Miss Johnston) devotion to their work, and of the measure of success that has attended their efforts, assure us that we were indeed led of the Lord to adopt them as our missionaries. Their dispensary, girls' school, boys' school, Sunday school and prayer-meetings, are all agencies in spreading the gospel; and perhaps the brightest feature in their work is the fact that their young men are beginning to go out preaching into the villages around, thus introducing as workers native evangelists, confessedly great helpers to the missionaries. It is a great matter for thankfulness that, so far, both young ladies have enjoyed good health. . . . It was a great disappointment to us to hear last January that Miss Lyman would not be able to go again to her beloved field of labor, and it might be here a fitting time and place to bear testimony to her faithfulness and devotion, and to assure her of our continued interest in, and sympathy with her. . . . And yet we hardly dare speak of disappointment or discouragement in the face of such plain commands as we find both in the Old and New Testaments. Do we remember the injunction laid upon God's ancient people? No less than six times in the book of Deuteronomy alone are they commanded to "rejoice," the most striking of these passages being "Rejoice before the Lord thy God in all that thou puttest thy hand unto." And we cannot escape this obligation by pleading that we are Gentiles and not Jews, for what does Paul say when writing to the Philippians? "Rejoice in the Lord alway," and lest that should not be sufficiently emphatic he goes on "and again I say unto you, Rejoice." When is the time and where is the place for discouragement if we live in obedience to this command? Nay, rather, let us follow the example of David, who, when difficulties thickened round him and his prospects were black-for even his friends were leaving him-" encouraged himself in the Lord his God." . . .

Organizers for Ontario and Quebec:

MISS RAWLINGS, Organizer for Ontario reports that at the time fixed for meetings she was not able to attend, so had to be content with sending letters of greeting and short papers to be read. Auxiliaries have been organized in Embro and Hamilton Immanuel Church.

MISS DOUGALL, for Quebec, reports an Auxiliary formed at Point St. Charles Church, Montreal. Every church in Montreal has now an Auxiliary to the Woman's Board.

Department Missionary Letters:

MISS FOGGIN reports that she has received seven missionary letters: one from Mrs. Read, one from Miss Melville, four from Mrs. Lee, and one from Miss Johnston. Of these, 401 copies have been printed and circulated among 60 societies.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions.

(Revised June, 1890.)

I. NAME.

This Society shall be called, "The Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions," and shall co-operate with the Canada Congregational Missionary Society and the Canada Congregational Foreign Missionary Society.

II. OBJECT.

Its object shall be the cultivation of a missionary spirit, and the raising of funds for carrying on missionary work in the Home and Foreign Fields.

III. MEMBERSHIP.

Any lady may become a member of this Board by contributing to its funds one dollar a year; or a life member by payment of twenty-five dollars at one time.

It shall be understood that the object to which these fees are to be devoted shall not be determined by the donors, but shall be left to the Board.

IV. OFFICERS.

The Officers of this Society shall be a President, a Vice-President at Large, Vice-Presidents (who are Presidents of Branches), a Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer.

The President, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer shall form a sub-committee to decide questions of urgency, subject to the approval of the Board. The Officers and Superintendents of Departments shall form an executive committee to arrange for the Annual Meeting.

V. BRANCHES.

The Auxiliary Societies shall, as far as possible, be organized into Branches, each of which shall have its President and Vice-Presidents, a Secretary and a Treasurer, to be elected annually. Each Branch shall report, semi-annually, to the General Board, and its officers shall be *ex-officio* members of the General Board.

VI. AUXILIARIES.

Section A. Any number of ladies organized into a Missionary Society, may become auxiliary to the Board by the payment of ten dollars, undesignated, annually. Each Auxiliary Society shall be entitled to be represented at the Annual Meeting by one delegate for each ten dollars contributed to the Treasury.

Section B. Any Association of Young People banded together to aid the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions may be auxiliary to the General Society, by paying to the General Fund at least \$5 annually.

Each Mission Band shall be entitled to send one delegate to the Annual Meeting of the Board, and is desired to select an appropriate name and report the same to the Society to which its money is sent.

VII. AMENDMENT.

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present at any Annual Meeting, provided one year's notice has been given in writing.

VIII. ANNUAL MEETING.

The Annual Meeting shall be held at such time and place as shall, from year toyear, be determined by the Society.

BY-LAWS.

- I. The expenses of the President, Secretary, and Treasurer incurred in travelling to and from the Annual Meeting, shall be paid by the General Board.
- II. The Treasurer shall pay no moneys except by order of the President and Secretary of the Board.

CONSTITUTION FOR BRANCHES.

- I. This Association of Auxiliary Societies shall be called the ———— Branch of the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions.
- II. Its object shall be to band together neighbouring Societies, and to excite a greater interest in the work by the use of all suitable means, and especially by arranging for union meetings of the Missionary Societies as often as practicable.
- III. The officers of the Branch shall be a President, Vice-Presidents (who shall be Presidents of the Auxiliaries), a Secretary and a Treasurer. These officers are ex-officio members of the General Board.
- IV. The duty of the Secretary shall be to secure semi-annual reports from the Auxiliaries, and to forward such reports in condensed form to the Corresponding Secretary of the Board. The Treasurer shall, in like manner, receive semi-annually the contributions from the Auxiliaries and transmit them to the General Treasurer.
- V. The Annual Meeting shall be held at such time and place as shall be agreed on by the officers.

CONSTITUTION FOR AUXILIARIES.

(OPTIONAL.)

- I. This Society shall be called the ————— Auxiliary of the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions.
- II. The object of this Society shall be the cultivation of a missionary spirit and the collection of money for missionary purposes.
- III. The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, who shall be elected annually.
- IV. Any person may become a member of this Society by the payment of ———cents weekly.
- V. Money raised by this Auxiliary for the Board may be appropriated to the Home and Foreign work in such proportions as may be deemed desirable by the said Auxiliary.
- VI. This Auxiliary shall report quarterly to the Secretary and Treasurer of the Branch with which it is connected.

CONSTITUTION FOR MISSION BANDS.

(OPTIONAL.)

- - II. Anyone may become a member of the Band on payment of ——— cents a week.
- III. The officers of the Band shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, to be elected annually.
- IV. The duty of the President shall be to preside at all stated meetings, and to have a general oversight of the work of the Band.
- V. The duty of the Secretary shall be to keep a record of the proceedings of the Band, and to make an annual report to the Missionary Society to which it is Auxiliary.
- VI. The Treasurer shall receive and hold all funds, paying the same quarterly to the Treasurer of the Society to which the Band is auxiliary, or to the Treasurer of the Branch.
- VII. By the Constitution of the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions the Band is entitled to send one delegate to the Annual Meeting.
