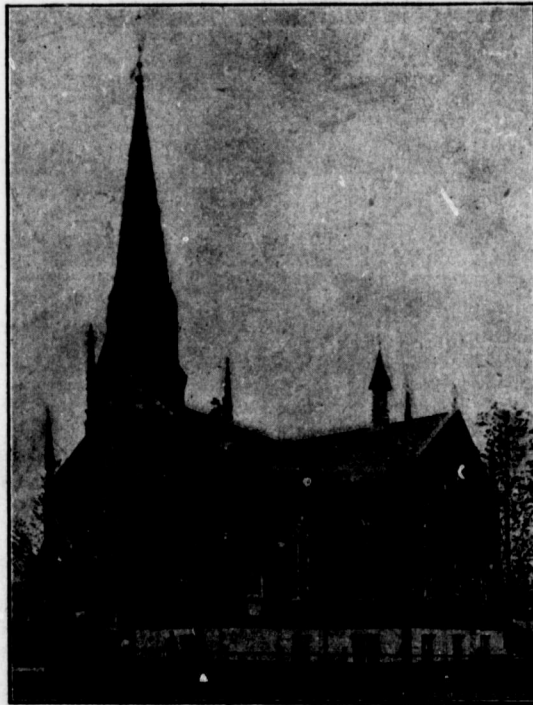

IN THE never-failing goodness and mercy of God, we are spared to enter on another year of "Church Life and Work" in our congregation. We would pause to record our united and sincere gratitude to Him from whom comes "every good and every perfect gift," for the rich provision He made for our comfort and happiness during the past months. Busied with the varied duties of our daily life, we may have failed to note our joys and blessings as they came, or duly to have appreciated them. We may have thought little of the spiritual or supernatural as we advanced with our plans and duties, but the truth is borne in upon us that all the while, at every step in our journey, Infinite Love was planning, directing and guiding our affairs, and aiding our feeble efforts. Whatever measure of success has attended our diligence is owing to the Divine Love which shone upon our pathway, and made the way of duty clear. Whatever failure we may have experienced, we would regard as disciplinary in its nature, and would seek to profit thereby, trusting to Infinite Wisdom for right guidance. The Session note with pleasure the continued large attendance upon the services of the Sanctuary upon the Lord's Day, but are not blind to the fact that many non-churchgoers are in the community who might be reached and induced to come to the house of God, if proper wisdom and tact were used. Let our plea with them be: "Come thou with us, and we will do thee good."

We are pleased to report a larger number of men at the Wednesday evening prayer meeting than in former years, but "yet there is room," and we would heartily commend the weekly social evening for prayer to all, irrespective of age or sex.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was regularly dispensed in the months of March, July and December. The Session regard with much approval the interest awakening in the hearts of the young people which leads them to an early acceptance of Christ, and to a public declaration of their faith in Him. Our prayer is that "the Lord may add to the church daily such as should be saved." During the past year thirty new members were added to the communion roll, twenty on

profession of their faith, and ten by certificate from other churches. Twenty-eight were removed from the roll—fourteen by certificate, six without certificate, and eight by death, leaving at the close of the year 567 upon the roll. Thirty-four baptisms were administered; eighteen marriages were performed; and twenty-six burials recorded. Death visited many homes in the congregation during the year, showing no respect to persons, removing both the babe of a few days, and the aged veteran who had gone beyond the period of life allotted to man. The circle of the eldership was invaded, and our highly esteemed and universally loved Captain Samuel Gibson entered into his rest. The obituary list is appended to this report. To all the members of the homes thus bereaved the Session extend their sincere and prayerful sympathy, and commend them to Him who "healeth the broken in heart and bindeth up their wounds." "Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort, who comforteth us in all our tribulations, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God."

The Sabbath School continues its good work among the children and young people of the congregation. The labors of the teachers and officers would, however, be crowned with more abundant success if the parents would co-operate with them to the extent of seeing that the children are regular in their attendance, and that the lesson is studied at home. The prayer of the Session is that parents may be aroused to the importance of a religious education for their children, and that we may early witness in our congregation a revival of parental and filial piety.

The Session are pleased to note that the General Assembly is again prepared to furnish Diplomas to those reciting the Shorter Catechism, and committing to memory portions of Scripture. We trust there will be many successful competitors in the Sabbath School and Bible classes.

The various departments of church work have been carried on during the year by the different organizations, which will report individually. To each and all the Session express their gratitude for their diligence, and commend their work to the practical sympathy of the congregation.

Respecting the liberality of the congregation, we observe that the average-giving to the schemes of the church is yet very low, indicating that the many allow the few to give. While the Century fund has made extra demands upon us, let us not be unmindful of our privilege in contributing something to the missionary and benevolent schemes.

The session are pleased with the growing efficiency of our choir under the able leadership of Mr. Henri K. Jordan, and recognize how valuable an adjunct our service of praise is to Divine worship.

In closing this report we would place upon record our sense of the goodness of God in permitting our beloved and late pastor, Dr. Ure, to see the close of a half century in the ministry of the church, having reached his jubilee period last October. Through failing health Dr. Ure retired from the active work of the ministry ten years ago, and has spent the interval in quiet retirement in our midst. Though unable to conduct public services, he still ministers to the afflicted and sorrowing, speaking words in season to them that are weary, and lifting the burden from many a heart. May the Lord continue him with us still, and bless him evermore.

Report of Knox Church Sabbath School for 1900.

The officers of the S. S. beg to present the following report: The attendance of scholars during the past year, though large, was not up to the number that the families of the congregation would lead us to expect. The total average of teachers and scholars for the year was 246, being a decrease of 15 compared with 1899, and a further decrease of 46 compared with 1898. Considering our growth as a congregation, it is evident we should have an increase instead of a decrease in the number attending our Sabbath School. We would respectfully call the attention of heads of families to the small number of boys in the Junior Class and Intermediate departments of the school. The average attendance in the Infant Class was 53, about equally divided between boys and girls. The yearly average in the body of the school was 121—51 boys and 70 girls. In the Intermediate Bible Classes' average 41—boys 12, girls 29. It will thus be seen that a large number of the boys of our congregation do not attend the Sabbath School. Surely, in view of their own bounden duty, and in view of the dangers and temptations which beset the pathway of our boys, parents should see that their sons enjoy the moral and religious instruction provided by the Sabbath School. A large staff of willing workers, consisting of 37 teachers and officers, give themselves faithfully to the work, but great difficulty is experienced in securing teachers to fill the places of those temporarily absent during the months of July and August.

At the end of the third quarter our Superintendent, Mr. A. Saunders, requested the school to relieve him of his duties as Superintendent, as he found it impossible, in consequence of the many demands on his time, to give the office that attention which he desired. In granting his request the school gave him a hearty vote of thanks for his past services, and were glad to know that they would still have the benefit of his services in teaching and in the service of song. Mr. J. E. Tom was appointed to fill the office of Superintendent, and the school finds in him a faithful and efficient presiding officer. The various classes have, to a large extent, been re-arranged, the library has been increased and re-opened, and we feel confident that the work done, and the general tone and discipline of the school, were never better than they are now. Nearly all our supplies are now purchased from the Presbyterian Board of Sabbath School Publications in Toronto, resulting in economy in expenditure, and in superior excellence in our Sabbath School Lesson helps.

The Christmas entertainment was well attended by the parents and friends of the children. Visitors and pupils appeared to enjoy the programme and the distribution of the 371 presents which Santa Claus so generously provided.
